LECTIO DIVINA FOR NEXT WEEKEND

The Book of Leviticus is the third book in the Old Testament and part of the Jewish Torah. It is concerned primarily with the laws of ritual purity, especially on behalf of the priests offering sacrifice to God on behalf of their people. Jesus encounters a man who is ritually impure. The man has a skin disease. Therefore, by law, he is rendered outside and excluded from the community. Jesus is a source of purity and law fulfilled.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

MORE ON LENT, CONTINUED FROM LAST WEEK...

MEN'S VIRTUAL LENTEN RETREAT – RISE

In December we had a cross section of men who participated in a virtual men's retreat called "RISE." It was a retreat that focused primarily on various aspects of men's lives and their spiritual needs. Through this group of men (the Frassati Men's Group) and our seminarian-intern, Chris Stein, we will be offering this retreat to all men in the parish (or beyond) during the Lenten Season and to give honor to the ultimate man in Jesus' life and Mary's life, St. Joseph. Pope Francis named this 2021 year from December 8, 2020-December 8, 2021 under the patronage of St. Joseph himself. Please see the details in this week's bulletin and register soon. Women of the parish, invite your men (father, husband, son – 17 years old and up) to sign up.

ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES

On Ash Wednesday we will have two Masses celebrated for parishioners at 8:30am and 7:00pm. An additional Mass will be celebrated with the school children, faculty, and staff during the day. The school Mass maxes out our seating capacity. The Diocese has given all parishes the instruction that during COVID we should not physically touch multiple individuals by tracing the sign of the cross with ashes on their foreheads. Instead, we have been instructed to sprinkle the ashes on top of the head. This means that only a small pinch of ashes will be sprinkled on the head of those who choose to participate. This may sound unusual for Catholics in America, however, in most European nations this is the standard procedure for distribution of the ashes. Even in Rome, the Holy Father and all those who celebrate Ash Wednesday Mass with him, only receive a sprinkle of ashes on their head and not ashes marked on their forehead with the sign of the cross.

LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS

We will pick up with Lenten Soup Suppers next year. This year we are trying to keep the school space sanitized and clean. This is especially true for the kitchen area since we use it daily for our student's hot lunch program. My suggestion as a replacement for our in-person soup supper, is to utilize St. Brendan's subscription to FORMED. This is a type of Catholic Netflix. It is a free service available to parishioners by using the log-in code found in this bulletin. There are so many wonderful programs, movies, documentaries that can help enliven, enhance, and inspire our Catholic faith. Please use this great resource during the Lenten Season. Each week in the parish bulletin you will see suggestions for your review.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

We will gather in the church for this devotion every Friday at 7:00pm. Stations of the Cross is a great meditation on how all our lives are intimately and without fail tied closely to the cross of Christ. Pray this prayer with us this Lent and find out how and why for yourself.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Diocesan Evening of Reconciliation has been canceled by the Diocese. We will also not have a Communal Penance Service this Lent in any of the North Olmsted parishes. We have been encouraged to offer additional opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation to be celebrated so everyone has a chance to encounter the merciful help and healing of the Lord. YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH, 2021

WITH A FATHER'S HEART: that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as "*the son of Joseph*".^[1]

Matthew and Luke, the two Evangelists who speak most of Joseph, tell us very little, yet enough for us to appreciate what sort of father he was, and the mission entrusted to him by God's providence.


We know that Joseph was a lowly carpenter (cf. *Mt* 13:55), betrothed to Mary (cf. *Mt* 1:18; *Lk* 1:27). He was a "just man" (*Mt* 1:19), ever ready to carry out God's will as revealed to him in the Law (cf. *Lk* 2:22.27.39) and through four dreams (cf. *Mt* 1:20; 2:13.19.22). After a long and tiring journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, he beheld the birth of the Messiah in a stable, since "there was no place for them" elsewhere (cf. *Lk* 2:7). He witnessed the adoration of the shepherds (cf. *Lk* 2:8-20) and the Magi (cf. *Mt* 2:1-12), who represented respectively the people of Israel and the pagan peoples.

Joseph had the courage to become the legal father of Jesus, to whom he gave the name revealed by the angel: "You shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (*Mt* 1:21). As we know, for ancient peoples, to give a name to a person or to a thing, as Adam did in the account in the Book of Genesis (cf. 2:19-20), was to establish a relationship.

SUPPORT ST. BRENDAN SCHOOL

NAVIGATOR NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL

Preschool Alphabet Days – The Pre-Kindergarten class began their Alphabet Days in January. Each day of school centers around a different letter theme. The letter “D” day featured dancing and dirt! The students explored various dance styles, including ballet, tap, Irish dancing, hip hop, and rock ‘n roll. For a more tactile experience, they played in the dirt by burying objects, and moving and exploring the soil.

Kindergarten Animal Habitats – During Maker Space recently, the Kindergarten students learned about land and water habitats and the different animals that live in each. They sorted and classified animals by their basic habitat and then used modeling clay to create the habitats.

4th Grade Creative Writing – Mrs. Diane Thomas’ 4th grade students have been practicing their creative writing skills. They were challenged to imagine that they had woken up in a snow globe. Each student then created a story about what happened inside their snow globe. They began with a pre-writing graphic organizer, before moving on to a rough draft and a revised edition, and then finally a finished copy. The students also drew a scene from inside the snow globe to accompany their stories.

3rd & 4th Grade Vibration Bots – In Maker Space last month, the 3rd and 4th grades learned about a basic electrical circuit. Over the following weeks, they put that knowledge into practice, while exercising their creativity by building “vibration bots.” The little robots are each powered by a button battery and a small vibration motor. When the electrical circuit is properly connected, the vibration causes the bots to shake and move.


