PASTOR'S COLUMN**ONE YEAR MARK FOR THE PANDEMIC**

We near the one year mark in which it was decided that the churches should close because of the pandemic. Our first major cancelation was St. Patrick's Day Mass and our breakfast afterwards. The St. Patrick's Day Parade downtown had been canceled only a week or two before. As we continue to move through Lent, I am forever grateful that the church doors have been open to all. We have been trying to navigate this time as best as possible. We have made adjustments with the celebration of all our Sacraments like Sunday Eucharist, Baptisms, Masses of Christian Burial, Marriages, Confirmation, First Communion, and more. Many of our rituals have been modified to some degree to keep the health and safety of everyone foremost in our minds. What has been adversely affected is our social life. St. Brendan is a very social parish, however, many of our parish events have been canceled because of the pandemic and also to ensure the school facilities remains safe for our day school and PSR children. Thank God, we have had no major issues – a few setbacks here and there – but no major issues. Many parishioners have been most generous in staying after Mass to ensure the pews, bathrooms, entrance areas in church are cleaned and sanitized.

GREAT PARISH STAFF

The parish staff has been amazing as well during this time. **Ed and Colleen DeVenney** have coordinated ushers and greeters for the weekend Masses. **Julie Onacila**, the school principal, was helping with that as well, until parishioners took up the role. **Tammy Dobrzeniecki**, the school secretary, has been assisting with the pew cleaning duty on a regular basis. **Richard Gullion** has been single-handedly coordinating the liturgical music this year. **Deacon Bob** has been at every Mass to assist and distribute Eucharist. **Mary Oldja and Patty Quinn** have been going from week to week with flexibility and understanding, when it comes to PSR and Sacramental programs. **Chris Stein**, our seminarian, came into all this and has been a huge help in so many ways. **Gina Coyle** has been the one to field all phone calls, questions, and walk-ins to the parish office, as well as, sometimes stuff bulletins without any assistance. We have all had to make many adjustments, but we have all overcome what seemed like a dauntless obstacle. This is because of the faith we have that brings much courage, much peace, much patience, and much God into everything we have been going through. Thank you as well to all the great **parishioners of St. Brendan** who have been considerate in wearing your masks and keeping social distance and for being patient with our liturgical adaptations, like no "Sign of Peace" (though I notice many are sneaking it among family members). Not every pastor in the Diocese has had the cooperation of their people with the restrictions in place. Go forward, we continue to follow all our protocols for the good of each other. You are much, much appreciated.

FUTURE HAPPENINGS

St. Patrick's Day Mass will be happening this year (as daily Mass has been happening since July/August). Mass will be on Wednesday, March 17, at 9am. All are invited. We will not have the breakfast afterward, as we need to keep the gym and kitchen area clean and sanitized for our school/PSR programs.

St. Joseph, the Husband of Mary, Feast on Friday, March 19, Mass will be at 8:30am. We also have a Mass with the school children that day. In this Year of St. Joseph, honor the foster father of Jesus and husband of Mary in some way. Come to Mass for the father figures in your life. Make sure to tell the father figures in your life how important their role in the faith is to you.

Holy Week will happen this year. Members of the parish staff are meeting to discuss the recently received directives put in place by the Diocese and how we can adapt them to our particular parish needs. I already know that those in RCIA have decided to wait till next year for initiation when the experience of the community can be more fully engaged. The Holy Week schedule will be in next week's bulletin.

Parish Picnic or some celebration to bring us back together again when we are able. There is already talk of an outdoor picnic when the weather turns warm. I can almost feel it now! However, we need to see where we are with the pandemic and the restrictions. Hopefully, this summer we can move forward with this plan.

Catholics of age 14 and older **ABSTAIN** from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics ages 18-59 **ABSTAIN** from meat and **FAST**, or limit themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals on these two days.



Power of the Pen Regional Qualifiers – We are proud to announce that four of our Junior High creative writers have advanced to the Regional Power of the Pen competition. Seventh graders Johnny Angelis, Hannah Betters and Elijah Molseed, and eighth grader Anna Welch will be competing on March 13 in another three rounds creative writing endeavors in hopes of qualifying for the state tournament.

Stations of the Cross – Although the school community is not able to all gather together each week for Stations of the Cross in the Church this year, the students are still able to participate in this prayerful devotion virtually. Fr. Tom, Miss Onacila, and seminarian Chris Stein, with help from Mrs. Sue Caroscio, prerecorded the Stations for our students to watch and pray with every Friday during Lent. Each grade prays the Stations together during their Religion class.

Kindergarten 100th Day of School – In February, Miss Kerry McGovern's Kindergarten students celebrated the 100th day of school. Prior to the big day, the students and their families designed t-shirts featuring 100 objects/designs. At school on the 100th day, they decorated "100 days brighter hats" and counted 100 Fruit Loops to make necklaces. The class also learned about life 100 years ago. They learned about notable people from the 1920s, such as Babe Ruth and Louis Armstrong; watched videos of 1920s era dancing; and looked at pictures of and discussed 1920s technology, such as radios and gramophones. Finally, after seeing photos of 1920s fashion, the students drew self-portraits of what they might have looked like 100 years ago.

1st Grade Celebrates 100 Days – Mrs. Olivia Kostecke's 1st grade class also celebrated the 100th day of school with a variety of activities. The students each created a "100 Days Smarter" poster, featuring 100 objects; enjoyed activities that reviewed counting to 100; and drew pictures of themselves at 100 years old.

3rd Grade Biographies – Mrs. Daisy Johnson's 3rd grade has been working hard learning about and writing short biographies of famous individuals. At the end of February, the students dressed up as their chosen subject and presented their reports to the class.

- Register at St. Brendan School for the 2021-2022 school year.
- Complete the EdChoice Request Form along with the Income Verification form. The application is submitted to the St. Brendan School office and then mailed to the EdChoice Office from St. Brendan.
- Submit the Income Verification form to the school office or mail it to the EdChoice Office on your own with the requested supporting documentation.
- If you would like for the documents to be sent together, from the school office, please submit both the request form & income verification and the information will be mailed together from the school office.


