PASTOR’S COLUMN

INSTITUTE FOR PRIESTLY FORMATION

I am going back to school! Several priests in the Diocese, myself included, have been asked to take part in being formally trained, through the Institute for Priestly Formation, as spiritual directors, primarily as a resource for priests. The classes will take place at Mundelein Seminary in Chicago. This is a three year program. Classes will take place for three weeks, at various times each year, during the next three years. My first set of classes is this week (April 19-23) from Monday through Friday. These classes should have started a year ago, but were cancelled because of COVID. Please pray for me that I can successfully complete the requirements so that I can be of greater service to the Church. While I am gone, visiting priests have been scheduled for the weekday Masses.

CHURCH RENOVATION & REJUVENATION

Updating in our church has been a process these past couple of years with new lighting, upgraded sound system, listening devices for the hearing impaired, new crucifix for the chapel, new church doors, and windows of saints. Our 60th Anniversary is in four years. In preparation for that anniversary, I would, with your support, like to continue investing in cleaning up the inside of our church. This would include restoring the finish on our severely COVID-sanitized pews, retiling under the pews (some areas, the tiles have broken), new carpeting for the aisles, tiling the sanctuary area, painting the whole interior, cleaning up the sacristy and chapel areas, and installing new sanctuary furniture. A new crucifix has been donated to our church through an anonymous donor. It has been handcrafted by an area artist, Norbert Koehn. The crucifix will replace the present crucifix and back panel. It will be custom designed according to the specifications of our sanctuary area.

EASTER SEASON

We are now in the Easter Season. For forty days of Lent we do works of fasting, praying, and giving. For fifty days of Easter we feast! Lent sets us up with so much to do for our spiritual well-being. What about Easter? What are you doing for Easter? This is a question that is not asked often enough. We should take Easter just as intensely as Lent, if not more so. Some suggestions to make Easter fruitful this year: Do what the Emmaus disciples did as they walked with the Risen Lord. (1) They heard the Scripture explained to them so that it burned within their hearts. (2) They recognized Him in the breaking of the bread. (3) They ran back to the others, to proclaim their faith.

1. Scripture. Take some time and read the Scriptures. “Take and read” are the words that St. Augustine heard that led him to the Bible and to a life-changing transformation, conversion. We are in the Year of St. Mark. Perhaps start there and read it through. Pray over the scenes. Practice *Lectio Divina*.
2. The Mass. Learn more about the Eucharist and the Mass. There are so many good resources online that teach us about this source and summit of our Catholic lives. Take some time to learn more about the Mass. Look to the parish subscription of FORMED from our parish website. Bishop Robert Barron has several good resources on this as well – google him and this topic.
3. Read the Catechism. Know your Catholic faith so you can proclaim it. Invest in a current edition of “The Catechism of the Catholic Church.” Take some time to read through the beauty of our faith Tradition, and reclaim it as your own. Everything that we teach as a Church is synthesized into this one comprehensive resource.

Easter calls us to share in the resurrection. So let’s make this holy, sacred season the best by going deeper and further into the greatness and beauty of our Catholic faith.



THE YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH

(December 8, 2020-December 8, 2021)

A tender and loving father

The evil one makes us see and condemn our frailty, whereas the Spirit brings it to light with tender love. Tenderness is the best way to touch the frailty within us. Pointing fingers and judging others are frequently signs of an inability to accept our own weaknesses, our own frailty. Only tender love will save us from the snares of the accuser (cf. *Rev 12:10*). That is why it is so important to encounter God’s mercy, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where we experience his truth and tenderness. Paradoxically, the evil one can also speak the truth to us, yet he does so only to condemn us. We know that God’s truth does not condemn, but instead welcomes, embraces, sustains and forgives us. That truth always presents itself to us like the merciful father in Jesus’ parable (cf. *Lk 15:11-32*). It comes out to meet us, restores our dignity, sets us back on our feet and rejoices for us, for, as the father says: “This my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found”. Even through Joseph’s fears, God’s will, his history and his plan were at work. Joseph, then, teaches us that faith in God includes believing that he can work even through our fears, our frailties and our weaknesses. He also teaches us that amid the tempests of life, we must never be afraid to let the Lord steer our course. At times, we want to be in complete control, yet God always sees the bigger picture.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL NEWS

St. Brendan Parish will offer a revised in-person Vacation Bible School (VBS) this summer. Children who will be in Kindergarten - 6th grade during the 2021-2022 academic year (next school year) are eligible to participate. **VBS will take place June 21st-25th from 10-11:30am.** The fee is \$30 per child.

In order to follow the guidelines set forth by the Diocese of Cleveland, there is room for only **30 child participants** this year. All participants will be assisted throughout each VBS day by a small number of adult staff (5-10) and teen volunteers (10-15).

A reservation system using Sign-Up Genius will be used this year. The Sign-Up Genius link will be emailed to all School and PSR families on Sunday, April 18, at 2pm; contact the Religious Education Office if you would like to be added to this email list. After completing a reservation for each eligible child in your home, the Religious Education Office will contact you with the proper paper work and instructions for fee payment to complete and submit within two weeks. If your paperwork and fee are not submitted in this time frame, your child’s reservation spot will open to someone on the Wait List.

SUPPORT ST. BRENDAN SCHOOL

NAVIGATOR NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL

8th Grade ELA Study of the Holocaust – The 8th grade recently concluded an English Language Arts unit with Mrs. Emily Sinclair centered on the Holocaust. The students explored the essential question of "How do we remember and honor the past?" They approached the topic by reading, analyzing, and discussing several different text formats, including the play "The Diary of Anne Frank," Elie Wiesel's Nobel Peace Prize speech, and the graphic novel "Maus," by Art Spiegelman. The students then concluded the unit with explanatory essays and group presentations.

Computer Coding Skills – In Technology class with Mr. Noah Patera, many of the grades have begun working with or revisiting code.org; a site designed to help practice and develop coding skills, and run block coding. Code.org challenges the students to problem solve and create a chain of code to manipulate a given task.

2nd Grade Coin Experiments – Ms. Leanna Guelker's 2nd grade class was working on their skills of identifying, counting and making change with money in a recent Math unit. As a fun way to wrap up the unit, the students engaged in a science experiment involving coins. They each predicted and then tested how many drops of water could stay on the heads and tails side of a penny, a nickel, a dime, and a quarter. Many of the students were surprised by how many water drops could fit onto a small surface. A discussion followed as to why each coin could "hold" water.

Kindergarten Nature Walk – Miss Kerry McGovern and the Kindergarten students enjoyed a Spring Nature Walk at the end of March during one of their Science classes. Equipped with clipboards and data recording sheets, the students marked whether they were able to find and observe clouds, birds, insects, and flowers, and then illustrated what they found. Everyone had a wonderful time walking around the school/parish grounds in the beautiful weather and observing all of the nature around them.


March Madness in P.E. Class – The St. Brendan P.E. classes recently completed a "March Madness" themed basketball skills challenge. The classes competed in 20 second skill challenges, with the skills adjusted by grade level. Ultimately, the 8th grade prevailed, scoring the most points and winning the tournament. Students in each class were also divided into two teams (red and grey), with grey claiming the school-wide victory.




ST. BRENDAN TEE-BALL LEAGUE


