**PASTOR’S COLUMN**

From the Desk of Deacon Dave

**Do You Know When You Were Baptized?**


Most of us can probably remember the first time we received communion or our confirmation, but with the exception of those who have entered the Church as adults very few of us probably remember our baptism. Baptism is so important that beginning with the first Christians the Church has always baptized infants. Baptism frees us from original sin and makes us share in the exchange of love in the Holy Trinity and the Church. We can remember what God and our parents and godparents have done for us by celebrating the day of our baptism in much the same way as we remember our birthday each year. If you don’t know the date, find out when you were baptized and mark that day on your calendar. Go to daily Mass that day if you can, spend some extra time in prayer, make a special meal or even throw a party! Whatever best helps you remember and give thanks to God for the graces that flow from baptism.

**On the Eucharist – A Story from the Life of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati**

So great was Pier Giorgio’s love for the Eucharist that he always prized the opportunity to go to daily Mass. As a teenager he struggled to rise early so he worked out an alarm to ensure he would wake up in time. The family gardener would pull on a rope dropped from Pier Giorgio’s window tied to the drawer of his bedside table. When he managed to sleep through that he arranged to have that same kind gardener rap on his window with the stick used to harvest nuts from trees. He knew the Eucharist was worth it. In a speech he gave to a youth group at the age of 22 he declared:

I urge you with all the strength of my soul to approach the Eucharistic Table as often as possible. Feed on this Bread of the Angels from which you will draw the strength to fight inner struggles, the struggles against passions and against all adversities, because Jesus Christ has promised to those who feed themselves with the most Holy Eucharist, eternal life and the necessary graces to obtain it.

And when you become totally consumed by this Eucharistic Fire, then, you will be able to thank with greater awareness the Lord God who has called you to be part of His flock and you will enjoy that peace which those who are happy according to the world have never tasted. Because true happiness, young people, does not consist in the pleasures of the world and in earthly things, but in peace of conscience.

**THE YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH**

(December 8, 2020 – December 8, 2021)

***A creatively courageous father***

If the first stage of all true interior healing is to accept our personal history and embrace even the things in life that we did not choose, we must now add another important element: creative courage. This emerges especially in the way we deal with difficulties. In the face of difficulty, we can either give up and walk away, or somehow engage with it. At times, difficulties bring out resources we did not even think we had.

As we read the infancy narratives, we may often wonder why God did not act in a more direct and clear way. Yet God acts through events and people. Joseph was the man chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true “miracle” by which God saves the child and his mother. God acted by trusting in Joseph’s creative courage. Arriving in Bethlehem and finding no lodging where Mary could give birth, Joseph took a stable and, as best he could, turned it into a welcoming home for the Son of God come into the world (cf. *Lk* 2:6-7). Faced with imminent danger from Herod, who wanted to kill the child, Joseph was warned once again in a dream to protect the child, and rose in the middle of the night to prepare the flight into Egypt (cf. *Mt* 2:13-14).

A superficial reading of these stories can often give the impression that the world is at the mercy of the strong and mighty, but the “good news” of the Gospel consists in showing that, for all the arrogance and violence of worldly powers, God always finds a way to carry out his saving plan. So too, our lives may at times seem to be at the mercy of the powerful, but the Gospel shows us what counts. God always finds a way to save us, provided we show the same creative courage as the carpenter of Nazareth, who was able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence.

If at times God seems not to help us, surely this does not mean that we have been abandoned, but instead are being trusted to plan, to be creative, and to find solutions ourselves.

## SUPPORT ST. BRENDAN SCHOOL

### NAVIGATOR NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL: PREPARING FOR THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR

**IXL Educational Site** – Near the end of the past school year, the St. Brendan faculty gathered for a Professional Development Day. One of the topics covered was a presentation on the use of IXL, an educational site that focuses on targeted skills for continued growth, learning and practice in math, language arts, science, and social studies. The site also allows teachers to easily identify areas where more instruction is needed. Over the summer, various classes are using IXL for math and reading practice to keep skills current and help students prepare for success in the fall.

**Reading Comprehension Strategies** - Mrs. Daisy Johnson has participated in a four week course through the Dyslexia Training Institute. During the class, she was introduced to several different research-based strategies to improve reading comprehension and fluency among all students. She also learned new approaches for vocabulary development in the context of reading comprehension. Mrs. Johnson is looking forward to implementing these strategies in her 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade reading classes next year.

**Mathematics Virtual Conference** - Mr. Ryan Schlitter recently attended the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics Virtual Conference, which featured 200 live and over 300 prerecorded sessions focusing on strategies, technology, assessments, and resources for promoting mathematics success for all students. Mr. Schlitter found the conference to be a great opportunity to see how other teachers approach not only topics in math, but also how to tie-in the application of real world experiences into the curriculum and learning process.

**Kindergarten Webinars** - Kindergarten teacher Miss Kerry McGovern has attended a professional development webinar entitled “The My Day in K Masterclass” hosted by a fellow Kindergarten teacher. The webinar covered classroom management routines; literacy routines designed to engage kindergarten students in letter sounds, word building, and sentence writing; and end of the year activities to help finish the school year strong. Miss McGovern gained many valuable tips and techniques for use in her own classroom and is looking forward to putting them into practice next year and in the years to come. She is also planning to take an additional course this summer entitled “The First 25 Days of K,” which focuses on teaching students to be ready and available to learn the information they are being taught.


