

## Fr. Eric's Exposé:

### Regarding Gender Theory

There are some very strange beliefs out there as we all know. One of the most confusing is a belief that gender is “fluid” and a man can claim to be a woman and a woman can claim to be a man simply because the individual says so. For the next four articles of mine (including this one), I am going to share a very good letter with you written on the subject. One of my classmates, Fr. Daniel Kogut, is a priest in the Lansing Diocese and he wrote the following letter to parents and to the parish as a whole at St. Mary's in Pickney, MI on Nov. 2, 2019. *“In light of recent concerns that have come to me regarding the issue of modern gender theory, I write this letter as a means of helping you form and guide your children as you navigate changing cultural attitudes and norms pertaining to gender identity. This new gender theory denies the nature of God's created order inasmuch as it denies that God has created us male and female. Instead, it proposes that gender is fluid and changeable and is determined by the choice of the individual rather than by biology. In other words, if, for example, your child was born as a biological male, it may be that he is actually a girl who is only physically male. As such, you won't know his true gender until he is old enough to psychologically identify as a male or female. This theory will further tell you that your role as a parent is not to impose a gender on your child, but to allow him the freedom to explore either gender and choose for himself which is his true self. The same goes in the case of a child who is biologically female; should she choose a different gender than her biological sex, you, the parent are told that you ought to support her choice of a new identity as a boy. This new way of looking at gender can present itself to your family in many forms, from TV shows, to children's clothing lines, to public school curricula, and so forth. This has caused confusion for some and questions for many regarding the legitimate role of parents and what they should teach their kids about their sexual and gender identity. I wish to reaffirm to you the eternal truth that God has intentionally created each child; each of us are a gift from God. This is true also of sexuality: “Male and female He created them” (Gn 1:27). God has entrusted you with a sacred task of affirming, nurturing, protecting, and educating your child in his or her sexual identity as God has created them.*

*The Vatican has recently released a document entitled *Male and Female He Created Them: Towards a Path of Dialogue on the Question of Gender Theory in Education*[i], addressing the issues stemming from the new gender theory. It was released to assist those involved in the education and formation of young people, especially parents and teachers. This document states that the new gender theory attempts to “cancel out the differences between men and women, presenting them instead as merely the product of historical and cultural conditioning.”[ii] The text then quotes Pope Francis, who states that modern gender theory directly opposes God's design for our sexuality:*

*“[Modern gender theory] denies the difference and reciprocity in nature of a man and a woman and envisages a society without sexual differences, thereby eliminating the anthropological basis of the family. This ideology leads to educational programs and legislative enactments that promote a personal identity and emotional intimacy radically separated from the biological difference between male and female. Consequently, human identity becomes the choice of the individual, one which can also change over time.”[iii]*

*The Vatican has called this an “educational crisis,” in that curricula are being developed that supposedly present a “neutral conception of the person and of life,”[iv] devoid of sexual difference. Gender theory, rather than portraying a neutral conception of the person, has put forth an “anthropology which is opposed to faith and right reason.”[v]*

*One way that the proponents of gender theory propose this “neutral conception of the person” is by telling parents that they should not affirm the sexual identity of their children. To do so, the thinking goes, would be to impose upon them a sexual identity that they ought to be free to determine for themselves. One instance of this thinking comes to us from the French-Canadian singer, Celine Dion, who has launched a new gender-neutral clothing line for infants and children by the name of *Celinununu*. The commercial launching this line of clothing depicts Miss Dion breaking into a hospital nursery where babies are dressed by gender in pink or blue; Miss Dion then sprinkles black glitter onto the children and the babies suddenly appear in gender-neutral black and white clothing. ## Musings From Mary Kay

Dear Ones,

Today's Gospel (Mark 9:2-10) tells of the Transfiguration. Jesus took Peter, James and John up a mountain. Note: these same three disciples also witnessed the raising up of the little girl (5:37) and were with Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane before his passion (14:33). Mark tells us that Jesus' clothes became "dazzling white" and Elijah (representing the prophets) and Moses (representing the whole of Jewish Law) appeared with him. Then a voice came out of a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." This signaled that Jesus' messianic suffering is the fulfillment of God's plan for salvation. The vision of future glory fades abruptly and they descend from the mountain. They return from a brief moment of insight to their usual state of dulled understanding. **What evidence in my life shows that I am God's beloved child? What do I hear Jesus saying to me today in the Eucharist? How can I help others find God?**

Today is the Second Sunday of Lent. I spent Ash Wednesday on a one-day retreat at St. Paul of the Cross – a wonderful way to begin Lent. Fr. Enno spoke, using the story of Jesus and the woman taken in adultery, how the Gospel is the story of the encounter between misery and mercy. Do not look back – look at God (mercy) in my life. We are clothed in God's mercy - God never quits on us. Even when I fail in goodness, Truth shall set me free. **Jesus is our Truth.** Mercy generates joy. God's mercy has no "strings attached". **How do I plan to celebrate mercy this Lent?** Lent is an invitation to authentic transformation; to rekindle love and compassion.

This brings us to Chapter 4: A Heart Open to the Whole World (Pope Francis' Encyclical, ***Fratelli Tutti***). "*The true worth of the different countries of our world is measured by their ability to think not simply as a country but also as part of the larger human family. (141)*". The Pope first considers immigration, explaining that until the conditions which force people to migrate (e.g., poverty, war, climate crises, etc.) are collectively addressed, nations should have a fundamental openness to welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating their "neighbor", the migrant, refugee or asylum-seeker – those fleeing grave humanitarian crises. The Pope calls for an international collaboration for migration which implements long-term planning, going beyond single emergencies, on behalf of the supportive development of all peoples (129-132). Immigrants bring new cultures into society and should be regarded as a gift. Cultural differences should not be erased but celebrated.

Pope Francis describes how, especially in the era of globalization, "mutual assistance between countries proves enriching for each" (137). Pope Francis acknowledges the "innate tension between localization and globalization", but says that each has its place. "We need to pay attention to the global so as to avoid narrowness and banality. Yet we need to look to the local, which keeps our feet on the ground (142).

**Prayer For Our Community (written by Father Richard Rohr in one of his daily on-line meditations)**

Loving God, you fill all things with a fullness and hope that we can never comprehend. Thank you for leading us into a time where more of reality is being unveiled for us all to see. We pray that you will take away our natural temptation for cynicism, denial, fear and despair. Help us have the courage to awaken to greater truth, greater humility, and greater care for one another. May we place our hope in what matters and what lasts, trusting in your eternal presence and love. Listen to our hearts' longings for the healing of our suffering world. Knowing, good God, you are hearing us better than we are speaking, we offer these prayers in all the holy names of God. Amen.

## HOW TO GROW AS A DISCIPLE DURING LENT

Every day is an opportunity to grow in our relationship with God, but Lent in particular gives us a designated time to reflect more deeply and with less distractions on our relationship with him. As many of us know, Lent is a time that invites us to mature in that relationship with the God who created us through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is a designated period in the liturgical calendar that invites us to metanoia to return to God again, repenting of all our evils and transforming our hearts and minds to resemble God more and more each day.

We may be tempted to see this as just another predictable part of the routine within the Catholic liturgical calendar, but we cannot allow ourselves to be fooled by that lie that prevents us from truly paying attention to our call to be holy. Repentance and ongoing conversion are necessary to grow in holiness. We know that we are not perfect and therefore we have to try to be united every day with the one who is perfection itself, with the supreme God. Even though we live in difficult times full of uncertainty about the pandemic, we can be certain about one thing—that God awaits us with open arms to live a Lent like no other. It is an opportunity we cannot let go unnoticed.

God calls us again this year to give the best of ourselves this Lent. He calls us to live in holiness remembering the events of more than 2000 years ago, when the history of humanity changed by seeing the invisible God take human form and do the most extraordinary act of love of all time—laying down his life on the tree for the salvation of his beloved children. Today more than ever we must be aware of this great love that God has for each of us by living, once again, a holy Lent. Things may look a little different in our parishes and our families this year because of everything we have gone through in the last year, but God walks by our side.

Let us open our hearts as we have never done before and allow God to accompany us in these 40 days just as he did with the Israelites in past times. Let us allow God to touch the deepest wounds of our being, let us open the doors of our hearts so that the rays of light may intimately enter and transform us into what God has dreamed for each one of us—the best version of ourselves, the people that we ourselves did not know we could become. Let us allow God to break us like clay in the hands of the potter so that he can make us like new vessels. He, and only he, will make it possible for us to live this Lent like no other, or as the Scriptures tell us, “Behold, I make all things new.” (Rev. 21:5)

How is your Lent going so far? In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen. Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make. Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him," This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?
