
Our Level I and Level II Atriums for the Catechesis



Fr. Eric's Exposé:

A Texan Bishop



St. Basil the Great welcomes a new parishioner who joined the parish in a very different way from all the many new parishioners: Damien Alexander Starski was recently born to Mandy and Ryan Starski and was baptized this weekend the morning of August 7th! I wanted to share a very powerful letter Bishop Joseph Strickland of the Diocese of Tyler, Texas wrote to his flock on June 11, 2021. He is addressing the scandal of politicians who claim to be practicing Catholics, but blatantly contradict Church teachings with the policies they advance. Following is his letter which can be found on the website of the Diocese of Tyler:

"Dear Flock of Tyler,

As we move through these post-Pentecost days of Ordinary Time, let us continue to seek the peace and guidance of the Holy Spirit.

As your bishop, I want to address the controversy that the Church is facing at this time regarding our national leaders who profess the Catholic faith. My main purpose, as always, is to teach the Catholic faith clearly and give us all the knowledge we need to address the many controversies that arise. Therefore, rather than address the situation of President Biden or any other leaders specifically, my approach is to remind all of us of basic Catholic teachings.

Our faith clearly teaches that life is sacred from conception to natural death and that direct abortion is an immoral violation of the sanctity of life. Our faith also teaches that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, God's Divine Son. In order to rightly receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Communion, we all have the serious obligation of ensuring that we are in the state of grace and that we are doing our best to live the truth that God has revealed to us.

As your shepherd, I pray that this controversy will primarily serve to prompt all of us to a serious examination of conscience. I am not the president's bishop, but I am yours. I grow daily in awareness of my own unworthiness as we all should, and this allows us to be more deeply in awe of God's love and mercy. Every man and woman of faith has an obligation to repent of our sins and live the Gospel as fully as possible. When we are aware of serious sin in our lives, we must go to Confession and seek a true conversion of heart. Then we can approach Communion assured that the Lord will strengthen us to go forth on our mission.

Let us pray lovingly for all of our leaders and for deeper unity in our own lives with the Lord and his bride, the Catholic Church.

Musings From Mary Kay

Dear Ones,

Today's Gospel (John 6:41-51) continues the story from the past several Sundays. Jesus is talking about Eucharist by saying, "I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. **I am the bread of life.**" **"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give you is my flesh for the life of the world."** These are hard sayings for the people to grasp and deal with. The Gospel tells us that the "Jews murmured about Jesus" because of what he said. Can't you just imagine the people in little groups gossiping among themselves, "Did you hear the latest?" "We know his mother and father – who does he think he is?" **How do I handle difficult pronouncements? Am I open to the working of the Spirit? What have I learned recently that I need to take to prayer?**

Besides being the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 8 is the feast of St. Dominic, the founder of the Dominican Order. The year is 1217 and life was good for Dominic. Pope Honorius had recently confirmed his burgeoning Order. He and his followers had been named by Bishop Fole as the official preachers of the diocese of Toulouse, France. They were living in newly refurbished quarters of St. Romain, given to them by the bishop.

Yet Dominic knew how quickly circumstances could change. He remembered all too well the day in April 1211 when the entire clergy of Toulouse, barefoot and carrying the Blessed Sacrament, had processed out of the city gates, not to return for nearly four years. Dominic knew that such a situation could recur. Should there be a long-term revolt in Toulouse, the brothers would be stuck in the city, unable to go about to preach.

On Pentecost Sunday – May 14, 1217 – the brothers were gathered in Chapter at St. Romain. (an important meeting of the members; our Congregation's next General Chapter will be in February 2022) There, Dominic made a stupefying announcement: small as they were in number, he was sending them out into the world!

Though this decision met with general agreement among the brothers, it was not so with Dominic's advisors. Bishop Fole fumed. Count Simon de Montfort of Toulouse, Dominic's friend and patron, was aghast. Both were convinced this decision was premature and could prove fatal to the infant order. (Note: Simon de Montfort later entered the Order and is now St. Simon de Montfort.)

Dominic was adamant. "Leave me alone. I know what I am doing." On Sunday, August 13, Dominic left Toulouse with the sixteen for Prouille, France where there was a monastery of nuns that Dominic had founded. There, on the feast of the Assumption, a vast crowd was gathered in the church. In a deeply moving ceremony, the nuns and the friars renewed their vows in the hands of Dominic.

Drawing on one of his favorite themes, Dominic preached on the occasion, "If you hoard the grain, it rots. Cast it to the winds, and it brings fruit." Then, turning to his brothers, he began his farewell to them with these tender words: "You are still a little flock," he said, "but already I have formed in my heart the prospect of dispersing you abroad. . . . The world henceforth is your home, and the work God has ordained for you is preaching and teaching. Go ye, therefore, into the world and teach all nations. Preach to them the glad tidings of their redemption. Have confidence in God, for the field of your labors will one day widen to the uttermost ends of the earth."

And so they were sent: Seven went to Paris, in two groups; Four went to the Iberian Peninsula; Two remained in Prouille to look after the needs of the nuns; The two natives of Toulouse stayed in that city; and one remained with Dominic as a companion on his travels.

After the ceremony, Dominic must have wondered: was this the death knell for the little band? Or was it, in the words of one of the historians, "the most revolutionary moment in the history of the Order?" As it turned out, Dominic's intuition was spot-on. Shortly after the dispersal, what he had feared came to pass: the city of Toulouse revolted. Had he not sent the brothers when he did, they would have been cut off from the mission field, unable to leave Toulouse. The grain would have rotted. By casting it to the winds, Dominic enabled it to bring forth a harvest of rich fruit, fruit that has remained. Within a generation after Dominic's death, the Order spread throughout Europe and into Asia and eventually all around the globe. (based on an article by Anna Marie Flusche, OP)

STRENGTHENING THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

In the Unleash the Gospel document written by Archbishop Allen Vigneron in 2017, Guidepost 7 addresses concerns of the Family: “...*The Family is the ‘domestic church’ – the primary social unit in which life in Christ, the life of the Church, is experienced and lived. Through the sacrament of matrimony and through their love for one another, a husband and wife make visible the love between Christ and his Church. (Eph.5:25, Pope Francis, Amoris Laetitia, 72)*”

The Church seeks to support families in various ways, and particularly it seeks to support married couples. Our culture is quickly moving away from marriage as evidenced by the decreasing numbers of Church weddings, an increase in the number of couples cohabitating with no plans to marry, the high number of divorces, etc. Marriage is under attack by the culture, and needs the support of the Church.

One way to support and encourage married couples is through prayer – prayer for married couples and prayer of couples for their marriage. Prayers for a stronger marriage are a powerful force that can help create a solid, life-long marriage bond. Here are a few prayers. Consider adding one or more to your prayer time in support of your marriage or the marriage of others.

Prayer for Married Couples: Almighty and eternal God, You blessed the union of husband and wife so that they might reflect the union of Christ with his Church: look with kindness on all married couples. Renew their marriage covenant. Increase your love in them, and strengthen their bond of peace so that, [with their children], they may always rejoice in the gift of your blessing. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen. seton-parish.org

Prayer of a married couple: Heavenly Father, thank you that you are our creator, you know us better than anyone else. You brought us together and you have promised that you have plans and a purpose for us, plans to prosper us and not to harm us. Remind us that you are the center of our relationship and that you are the one who watches over our future. May we look to you for wisdom and guidance. May your peace, which surpasses all understanding, guard our hearts and our minds in Christ Jesus. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, Amen. Connectusfund.org

Prayer for forgiveness in Marriage: Heavenly Father, as we strive to continuously build a stronger marriage, help us to forgive one another for things that may hurt or offend us.
