ON BEHALF OF OUR PARISH STAFF, AND MYSELF, I WISH YOU AND YOUR LOVED ONES A MERRY CHRISTMAS. Thank you for joining us as we celebrate the Word made flesh, God becoming human, the Mystery of the Incarnation. If this is your first time at St. Blase: WELCOME, IT IS GOOD YOU ARE HERE. If you are returning: WELCOME BACK. As Scrooge's nephew Fred says, "I have always thought of Christmas time ... as a good time; a kind, forgiving, charitable, pleasant time; the only time I know of, in the long calendar of the year, when men and women seem by one consent to open their shut-up hearts freely, and to think of people below them as if they really were fellow-passengers to the grave, and not another race of creatures bound on other journeys," (A Christmas Carol). May this be your experience of Christmas as well. Please join us again for worship or any event.

This year, in lieu of our Christmas Concert, we are holding a CHRISTMAS EXTRAVAGANZA. This will be an evening of crafts, games and fun leading up to a sing-a-long of favorite Christmas Carols. Please join us on Wednesday, December 29th beginning at 6:00 P.M. for something out of the ordinary – because this has not been an ordinary year.

Christmas is often a "welcome home" event. Perhaps you are a former parishioner returning to visit, a college student home for the holidays, serving in the Military or Peace Corps, maybe you came unwillingly or somehow just felt drawn here today. I ask that we hold in our thoughts and prayers those who cannot be with family or loved ones at Christmas and those grieving a deceased loved one, especially the families of Oxford High School. For many people struggling with loss or loneliness, this time of year is difficult. May we be mindful of this as we pray and honor the season.

What are your favorite Christmas shows? My number one would be *A Christmas Carol*, in particular the Alastair Sim version, "*Scrooge*." Behind that would be "*The Night of the Meek*," written by Rod Serling for his *Twilight Zone* Series. Art Carney stars as a department store Santa who drowns his pain at the local bar. He tells his boss, "I can either drink or I can weep." He explains, "I live in a dirty rooming house on a street

filled with hungry kids and shabby people, where the only thing that comes down the chimney on Christmas Eve is more poverty." His dream is that "Just on one Christmas, I'd like to see the meek inherit the earth." Santa gets his wish, and Serling shows he grasps the essence of the Gospel better than most. By the way, Rod Serling was born on December 25th.

Another favorite is *The Night the Animals Talked*. This animated show aired only four times in the 1970's. Sadly, it has never been released on DVD, but survives through bootleg copies. Containing some similarities with George Orwell's *Animal Farm*, the problems of humankind are seen from the perspective of the animals at the manger. Lastly, the hospital comic-drama *St. Elsewhere* episode entitled, "*Santa Claus is Dead.*" When visiting children in the hospital, Santa himself goes into full cardiac arrest. Dr. Auschlanders' grandson, Max, learns the bittersweet lesson that, "People die every day of the year, even on Christmas Eve. But life goes on."

Wishing all of our families a very blest Christmas. Take time to enjoy this very beautiful season of grace and love.

This Christmas could we just say "What a wonderful gift! I love it! Thank you!" when

receiving a gift from someone else.

On this holy day of Christmas, we celebrate a special gift – given to us by our loving Creator, who thought long and hard about just what we needed, and who gave considerable thought as to what kind of wrapping to put this gift in. Two thousand years ago, God decided that in order for us to understand how much God really loves us, God gave us the gift of God's own self, wrapped up in bands of cloth as a tiny little baby and placed in a food bin surrounded by lots of smelly animals. And all God has ever asked is for us to receive this gift with a joyful and thankful heart.

And frankly, we're lousy at it. It has never been easy to accept the gift of Jesus as our brother, master, Lord, and savior. But let's face it – we have a terrible time accepting any gift from God! God offers us forgiveness and we say, "Oh no God, I don't deserve it." God offers us freedom from our addictions and we say, "Oh no, God, it's too hard for me and I'm afraid to lean on you." God offers us joy and we say, "Oh no God, I just can't believe that it's going to be good tomorrow."

God offers us courage and we say, "Oh no, God I can do it myself." God offers us grace – and this is the one we have the worst time with of all, because grace is nothing more or less than God's unconditional, never-ending, undeserved, over-whelming, and transforming love – and we say, "Oh no God, I don't feel loveable. You couldn't possibly love me. I'll just let you down – go love someone else."

On this holy day, we celebrate and remember how God became vulnerable to us in a most powerful way by giving us not something we can hold, or wear, or play a game with. Two thousand years ago, God gave to us the most risky thing God could think of: God's own self, born as a tiny child in a manger.

God did this so that we might never doubt God's forgiveness and freedom and joy and courage and grace and love. And all God asks is that when we receive this precious gift, we say without hesitation, "What a wonderful gift! I love it! Thank you!"
