RUMINATIONS



MERRY CHRISTMAS. The Time of Christmas is brief this year. Today is already The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. To allow more of the faithful to observe the Epiphany, it is observed on a Sunday. This makes it a moveable feast. However, the traditional date of the Epiphany is January 6th. Thus, Epiphany becomes the "Twelfth Day of Christmas", also known as "Twelfth Night."

We have begun a new calendar year. So, for the second time in six weeks, HAPPY NEW YEAR. Nice of the calendar year to be caught up with the Church Year. A New Year may bring some unexpected and unforeseen developments. Yet, for the most part, it continues and develops what is already in process. Entering 2022, we can surmise that Covid-19 will likely become a way of life. It is unlikely to be eradicated. The best hope we have to lessen its effects on our health, medical professionals and hospitals is vaccination. It is painfully clear that a certain percentage of the population simply will not roll up their sleeve. So barring the unforeseen medical breakthrough, the pandemic becomes something that becomes part of our life – and death.

Another on-going development in the New Year will be Family of Parishes. Our family (St. Martin de Porres, St. Ephrem, St. Michael, and St. Blase) will launch at the beginning of July. There will be a great deal of planning and preparation in the first six months of this year. This Tuesday, we four pastors, together with staff of the Archdiocese will be meeting so we can hit the ground running (or skating, depending on the weather!)

I extend a heartfelt THANK YOU to all who remembered me at Christmas. Your thoughtfulness, kind words and generous gifts serve as an affirmation of my vocation and ministry. It is humbling to be on the receiving end of such abundant support. Please accept my appreciation and prayers for your thoughtfulness.

I also thank all who gave so generously at Christmas. There is still time to do so. Please indicate either on your check or envelope your explicit intention for your contribution to be included as part of the Christmas collection. In the weeks ahead, we will inform you the total amount of the Christmas collection.

Memorial brick pavers continue to be available for purchase until January 15th. If you have not placed your order, please do so soon. Time will not move any more slowly in 2022 than it did in 2021 - - we can be certain of that. The bricks will be part of our labyrinth and prayer garden. We had the labyrinth created a

couple years ago. The Gospel of Luke is structured around Jesus' journey from Galilee to Jerusalem. This gives us impetus to reflect on our own life's journey.

The labyrinth and prayer garden will give us yet another outdoor prayer space and one that is readily available to parishioners and the public passing by. As we begin to landscape and install the pavers this spring, there will be more information to remind you what a labyrinth is; how to walk and pray a labyrinth; and the details / plan of this space. The pavers will not only be a memorial, but in their own way, will tell our story and become a call to prayer for those who pause to pray or walk the labyrinth. Together with the Magi, may you have a safe and grace filled journey through 2022.

Merry Christmas! You may have noticed that today's Gospel is from Matthew and not from Luke. This is the beauty of our Gospel writers; they Gospel Reflection

all have different perspectives in revealing Jesus to us all and today's reading is a prime example. Luke tells us about the census, but that is not mentioned in Matthew, and Matthew tells us of the visit of the Magi, which is not found in any other Gospel. The visit of the Magi is such an important part of Jesus' birth, but we don't know much about them, however their part of the story is filled with symbols and lessons to be learned.

The Magi were journeying to Bethlehem, following a star, so we believe them to be astrologers. Let's pause for just a moment and think about them following a star; God's own creation was leading them to Him. The Magi were from the East and not of the local faith, culture, or race. God led them by the light of a star showing us that everyone can come to God and there is no exclusion of anyone by anybody. The Magi represent everyone, and shows us that everyone should be seeking Jesus; our light in the darkness!

The bible doesn't tell us the Magi's names, but centuries later the legend of their names were written down by a historian. Where this legend came from, no one really knows, and we can't even be sure of how many Magi were present. We've assumed there were three Magi based on the number of gifts, but there could have been many more traversing to see the newborn King. The gifts are important in the telling of Jesus' birth, not because we currently exchange gifts, but what they represent in foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. Gold represents Jesus' kingship; Frankincense represents His divinity since priests burn that incense in the Temple, and Myrrh represents Jesus' death as that is used to prepare the deceased for burial. (Remember the women going to Jesus' tomb on Easter morning, what were they bringing?)

We have so much to learn from Epiphany. How do you seek Jesus? Do you help others to seek Jesus? What gifts do you offer to Jesus? There is one more lesson to be learned from the Magi; realizing they were being manipulated by Herod, the Magi returned by a different route. Do you turn away from those that would keep you from Jesus? May you have continual epiphanies of God's unconditional love! God is good!



Epiphany Home Blessing

The Feast of Epiphany is celebrated on the 12th Day of Christmas, January 6th,



but in the United States is moved to the Sunday between January 2nd-8th. On Epiphany, it is traditional for families to bless their homes, remembering the hospitality of the Holy Family to the Wise Men and asking for protection and blessing on the home and all who enter. The home blessing is done by writing on the door or door frame with chalk the symbols 20+C+M+B+22. The 20 and 22 represent the current year. The + reminds us of the cross on which our Savior died. The C, M, and B stand for the traditional names of the Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, as well as an abbreviation for the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house." Writing on the door also brings to mind the Passover of the Jews during the final plague in Exodus, when the blood of the lamb protected the inhabitants within.

Pray Together:

Make the Sign of the Cross. • Read an Epiphany Scripture passage from today's readings. • Pray: "Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen." (from usccb.org) • Chalk the door, door frame, or plaque with 20+C+M+B+22 (or current year) • Pray the Our Father. • Make the Sign of the Cross.
