When completed, this will give us another outdoor setting for prayer and reflection. I do not know about you, but when I come across names in this kind of setting, I find it a summons to pray. These are not just names, but lives and loved ones who touched the lives of others. Even if I don't know them, I know they were or are part of our one human family held forever in God's eternal love.

The Incarnation is challenging. In the history of our Church, there are two great heresies (errors). Arianism denied the divinity of Christ, while Docetism denied Christ's humanity. Spiritually, most of us slide up or down this scale, leaning towards a Christ who is either more human or more divine. Merely affirming the Incarnation as a static dogma does not do it justice. Yes, we believe that Jesus Christ is both fully human and fully divine. Yet what this means and its ramifications for our faith and our life continues to unfold. It is not enough to get the concept in our heads (which is quite

challenging) but to be attentive to the ways this reality continues to speak to us in our day-to-day lives. Though the Season of Christmas concludes today, together with the repentant Ebenezer Scrooge, we continue to keep Christmas in our heart and try to keep it all the year. The Incarnation continues to touch and affect our lives.





Today's Gospel marks the end of our Christmas season and we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. With the end of the Christmas season, we see

time of change is happening!

a turning point in our church year. Ordinary time starts Monday, but remember, ordinary time is represented by the color green which signifies growth. One may think that nothing really happens because its "ordinary," but quite the opposite is true! We grow in our faith by reflecting on all that we learn at church, and that growth strengthens our relationship with God! Growth is a very good thing! Today's Gospel signals the start of a new season; a new moment in salvation history. Today's

Gospel tells us of when Jesus began His "public"

ministry. God reveals to us that Jesus is His Son and the

We start the Gospel with the people asking themselves if John the Baptist may be the Christ. John answered them, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." Don't confuse what John is doing with the sacrament of Baptism as what he is doing is more ritualistic. Ritual washing was part of the religious practices of that time, which we hear in our readings of the unclean to become clean. Jesus didn't "need" to be baptized; He is after all, God. However, Jesus is fully human and fully divine. What better way to show us the way to the Father? John was baptizing people to repent, while this baptism was obviously different, it was a reminder to the people of God's promise. John always pointed the people to Jesus and Jesus being baptized fulfilled his words to the people. Prepare the way of the Lord!

This event is mentioned in all four Gospels, which signifies its importance, and all four offer different perspectives. Luke's Gospel tells us that after Jesus was baptized, He was in prayer. It was then that "heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Jesus was in prayer, showing us again the importance of prayer. Also significant is that all the Trinity is present in this event: God the Father in the voice, God the Holy Spirit in the dove, and God the Son who is Jesus. What a way to declare the start of Jesus' public ministry! God is good!


