From Fr. Mike...

With the new year, we are starting the process of grouping parishes together in an Archdiocesan initiative called Families of Parishes. This process should take about 2 years to complete and, as I mentioned in a previous bulletin article, our parish family consists of St. Blase on 15 Mile Road, St. Martin de Porres on Hoover, St. Ephrem on 17 Mile Road and St. Michael. In smaller parishes or parishes that are teetering financially, the family of parishes concept is that staff support and resources will occur within the family unit. In our situation, all four parishes are financially solvent, but the benefit to this structure is to combine contracted services to get better pricing (landscaping, purchasing supplies), taking advantages of offerings in other parishes within the family (in other words, trying not to recreate the wheel in all four parishes but utilizing other parishes for Lenten programs, retreats, mission groups), and offer priest help as we get older. As I implied above, this structure is critical for maintaining Catholic presence in some area of our diocese, e.g., churches in the center city or small parish communities in the rural areas to the south and north of us. How those decisions are made in those areas will be

determined by the parishes involved and the health and abilities of the pastoral workers in each respective family of parishes.

This first part of the process is getting to know the parishes in our family and familiarizing ourselves with the communities and the resources they have. It seems natural that we begin by sharing websites and names of pastors and mass times for each of us. From this point forward, there will be a regular list of our parish groupings and I encourage everyone to check out websites and read the on-line bulletins to familiarize yourself with the parishes and the programs they offer. Since some of the parishes in the Archdiocese have already started this process (They were in wave 1; we are in wave 2.), what we have been told is that larger parishes like St. Michael have seen very few changes in day-to-day operations. The staff and programs remain the same. The archbishop has set it up so that future changes, for instance the sickness or death of a pastor, will be accommodated by other priests in the family who have familiarity with the parish and the staff and the priorities of the parish community in question. I will share that

information at the bottom of this article.

We have met as priests a few times already and plan on continuing meeting throughout the process and beyond to share a meal and talk over our respective ministries. There was something kind of interesting that occurred in our last meeting. As we were getting to know each other and sharing our respective biographies, Fr. Aro (the pastor of St. Ephrem) started to talk about growing up in India where his family didn't have a lot of money, struggling to go to school and eventually the seminary, joining a religious congregation that brought him to a couple of different countries including the United States and finally to St. Ephrem. Fr. Tim then spoke about being raised in the Philippines, his parents dying and leaving him orphaned at the age of 11, being taken in and raised by his elder brother, struggling to get an education until his uncle sponsored and paid for his seminary education. He was ordained in the Diocese of Massin and eventually moved to Detroit where he first ministered at St. Sylvester in Warren and then, St. Michael. Then it was my turn to speak. I felt pretty ordinary, like plain white bread on a shelf of fancy French pastries. I started: I was born in Detroit; I was raised in Detroit: I went to school in Detroit: I was ordained for Detroit: I am here now. Lol. I never knew how boring I was! Even the two other native clergy, Frs. Randy and Nick were educated in Europe. Oh well, I own it. I look forward to meeting and working with my confreres in the future months.

Let there be wine!

The servants carefully filled each of the six stone jars.

Jesus watched silently as they first poured from buckets and finished by ladling water until it reached the top.

Jesus studied the brimming jars and realized that clouds from the afternoon sky were reflected on the water's surface. He imagined entering the reflection and walking beneath those clouds in another time and place. He took a deep breath and sighed. As he inhaled again he felt a satisfying fullness of peace. Jesus seemed charged with the full power of God. Closing his eyes, he breathed a prayer. "Father, let this water become wine."

Instantly there was the taste of wine on his tongue and his nostrils were filled with the sharp scent of wine on the air. Jesus opened his eyes to see that the white clouds in the reflection were now brighter against the darker liquid in the jars. For a moment Jesus thought to dip his finger into the jar to taste the new wine, but he resisted. Filled with God's confidence, he had no need to test the results.

Stepping back from the jars, Jesus instructed the servants to go tell the chief wine steward that there was no longer a shortage of wine.

Jesus turned and faced his mother and the others standing by her in silence. Mary's eyes narrowed slightly, sending a warm thanks to her son. The corners of Jesus' mouth twitched in a brief smile back at her. Then he lowered his gaze and left the patio, walking past them.

Soon the chief steward was marveling at the taste of the new wine. Cups were filled and everyone celebrated.

Away from the crowd, Jesus took no joy in the moment. His heart was filled with a cold dread as he realized what he had truly begun. His journey was started now. There would be no turning back from the path that would soon enough lead him to agony, passion and death.





This Gospel story of Jesus' first miracle presents us with an opportunity to reflect on the beginning of Jesus' ministry. This can lead us to remember the beginning of our own faith journey. Somewhere in each of our lives there is a "wedding at Cana" experience" that marks our coming to faith. Hidden in among the years is this little jewel of experience that we can rediscover and hold up to the light of our lives




