BLESS YOUR HOME!

Celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, Sept 14. Today's feast is joyful and triumphant, a victory celebration. In that spirit, form a "victory procession" through

your house. Carry a crucifix from the front door into each room. In each room, pray the following designated prayers. (The response is: *Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the world.*)

Living Room: Lord Jesus, bless this room where we receive our family and friends as welcome guests. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. (*All respond.*)

Dining Room: Lord Jesus, bless this room where we share our meals, especially with guests. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. (*All respond.*)

Kitchen: Lord Jesus, bless this room where we prepare our meals and gather as a family. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. (*All respond.*)

Family Room: Lord Jesus, bless this room where we gather for fun, recreation, and family sharing. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. (*All respond.*)

Each Bedroom: Lord Jesus, bless this room where (name) sleeps. In rest, may he (she) find healing and peace in body and soul. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. (*All respond.*)

BACK-TO-SCHOOL PRAYER TIPS

During this time of year, when we're getting back into the swing of packing lunches and unpacking book bags, we are also forming our daily routines and habits. Here are some ideas on how to spend quality time with God in prayer during hectic days and nights.

Mark it Down: While we fill the calendars on refrigerators with volleyball practices, Scout meetings and PTA events, pencil in a Rosary once or twice a week and explain why we as Catholics need to keep Mary front and center in our lives. (Hint: Because Jesus did.)

Mix it Up: We all can get in a rut with our prayer life, but there are thousands of books and websites to help inspire you. From daily devotionals to family prayer books, find them and read (or pray) them as a family.

Give Thanks: Too often our prayers consist of a simple list of intentions – the sick and dying, vocations, our families, etc. While these are tremendously important, we need to teach our kids that prayer is more than a litany of wants. So thank Jesus, every day, and **be specific** in your gratitude.

On the Go: Praying in the car can be the easiest and most convenient way to fit prayer into a busy schedule. Find a CD or download an MP3 of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and pray along with it. Not only is it a beautiful prayer, it takes less than 10 minutes.

Bedtime Q & A: Let the kids pray for their individual intentions on their own once they climb into bed. Instead, pray the Our Father as a family and, afterward, have a short, nightly discussion on Church teaching. Your kids will have questions on why we believe what we believe. If you don't know the answer, be honest, and then find it. Go through the Catechism of the Catholic Church together.



The purpose of this ministry is to express our church's care and concern for our parishioners.




HAPPY BELATED BIRTHDAY BLESSED MOTHER


HAIL MARY, FULL OF GRACE, THE LORD IS WITH THEE. BLESSED ART THOU AMONG WOMEN AND BLESSED IS THE FRUIT OF THY WOMB, JESUS.

GOD CREATED MARY, making Her worthy to become the Holy Mother of His Son. She was born to St. Anne and St. Joachim. Her feast was celebrated on September 8th. In Medjugorje, it is said that the real date of Her birth is August 5th. “The Church encourages us to pay devotion to Mary, but does not wish us to place Her on the same level as the Most High. While Mary reigns over all the angels and saints in Heaven, She is still but a simple creature and, accordingly, an infinite distance stands between Her and her Adorable Son.” Jesus, Mary and Joseph are referred to as the “Holy Family of Nazareth.” Our societies are built on families. She is our Heavenly and Spiritual Mother. We pray to Her that our families may become more holy. We pray, asking Jesus, that through her intercession, we may bring hope, His Love and Mercy to our families. Mary hears our prayers and takes them to Her Beloved Son, Jesus, Who is known to never refuse His Mother. He always hears Her prayers-----and she always hears ours. However, our prayers are answered in His time and in His way. She will help us meet our trials and difficulties with patience and faith just as she did, if we ask her. Our Lady is the reconciler and refuge of sinners. Her messages at Fatima, Lourdes, Garabandal, and many other locations ask that we reconcile ourselves to God: confess our sins and pray for sinners. Prayer, fasting and conversion are in all of Her messages. Richard of St Laurence wrote: “God lamented before the birth of Mary, that there was no one to restrain Him from punishing the sinner; but Mary being born-----She appeases Him.” Just as we celebrate the Birth of Jesus at Christmas and the birthdays of our families and loved ones, we too, can celebrate the birthday of our Blessed Mother-----a great reason to pray a rosary, read the story of Fatima, Lourdes, the Battle of Lepanto, or of other places where she has appeared. If you missed the celebration last Wednesday, you can still wish her a belated birthday and show your praise, love and thanksgiving for her many blessings and the warmth of her mantle, which she keeps over us. I apologize for not getting this message to you on time-----although, I don’t think Heaven’s time is the same as ours.

Can You Walk the Walk?

I'VE MET AND talked with enough people to feel confident that if you polled 100 fallen-away Catholics about why they didn't want anything to do with the Church, the term "accountability" would pop up in almost all of their answers.

AND TO BE fair, a lack of accountability isn't just a Catholic problem. Talking the talk but not walking the walk has been a shortcoming handed down throughout the ages, across all creeds and nationalities.

LOVING OUR NEIGHBOR, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, feeding the poor – it all sounds fantastic, especially when we're the ones saying it. But the doing – well, that's a different story, isn't it? We would do well to remember that Christ calls one of His best friends "Satan" when Peter tries to convince Jesus to stray from His destiny.

HAVE YOU EVER been called Satan by one of your good buddies? I'll bet it's not a great feeling. But think about what Peter was doing. He had just said, "You are the Christ." And now, mere moments later, he's saying: "Don't say these things. Don't say you're going to suffer. Don't say you'll be killed."

HE WAS TELLING Christ to squander what the Lord had given Him. He was telling Him that having faith was fine, but being faithful? It's just a little too hard. God has a destiny for you, too, and He's asking you to be open to it. Maybe it's not in your comfort zone. Maybe you don't think you can do it.

LORD, GIVE US faith – but help us, also, to do the work.


We are looking for Core Team Members for the 2021-22 school year for Edge, Life Teen and Confirmation

The Bethlehem Christian Familiess

The carving of the Olive Wood Tree has been inherited since the time of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It was passed down from father to son for many generations including our family. More than 80% of the Christian community income comes from tourism and the olive wood trade. However, due to the ongoing difficult circumstances and the tremendous decrease in tourism the Christian community has suffered many hardships that led many Christian Families to leave their homes in search of work and safety.

Our mission is to support and strengthen the presence of Christianity in the Holy Land by selling their beautiful olive wood artifacts here in the United States.
