My dear Brothers and Sisters,

ST. GREGORY OF TOURS relates that when he was a boy his father fell gravely ill and lay dying. Gregory prayed fervently for his recovery. When Gregory was asleep at night, his Angel Guardian appeared to him and told him to write the Name of Jesus on a card and place it under the sick man's pillow. In the morning, Gregory acquainted his mother with the Angel's message, which she advised him to obey. He did so, and placed the card under his father's head, when, to the delight of the family the patient grew rapidly better.

WHEN CHRIST CAME into the world, angels sang about peace; and when He went out of the world, peace was bequeathed. "Whatever house you go into," He instructed His disciples when sending them on missions, "let your first words be peace to this house." What a precious gift of God to humankind is this peace. It is the will of God for us that in the world's most crowded streets, in the din of life, even when the rush and hurry are at their most intense, we should enjoy the peace of Christ in the depth of our hearts.

WHAT IS THIS peace of Christ? How do we define it? Peace is a climate in which every person and every group of persons can live the fullness of life that God intended for us when He created us. How does one appropriate to himself of herself this peace? It is by "becoming a new creature," by living the new mode of existence brought about by the cross of Christ by His death and resurrection. This means that Christian peace comes through union with Christ and by dying to oneself, especially to some of the worst enemies of peace that inhabit and exploit our human nature. These enemies are: avarice, ambition, envy, anger, and pride. If these enemies are denied entrance into our lives, we should enjoy the perpetual peace of Christ, because through this denial we will rise with Him to live in the power and grace of His risen person. That is peace.

THE PEACE OF Christ begins in one's heart, but it is meant to flow into the hearts of others, so that the personal peace becomes world peace. Blessed are the peacemakers, they shall never be unemployed, for there is so much need for the peace of Christ in today's world. As Jesus sent out His disciples to pass on this peace to others, He said that, "the

harvest is rich, but the laborers are few," thus indirectly urging all of His would be followers to become messengers of peace.

THERE IS AN unusual story of a man who returned to his car which was parked outside a large shopping center. Lying on the front seat was a note: "Dear sir or madam; I fully intended to steal your car until I noticed the 'Peace -Be-To-You' sticker. It made me pause and reflect. I reasoned that if I did steal your car, you certainly would not be at peace, and on the other hand, I felt I would not be at peace either, as this was my 'first job'. So, peace be to you and to me. Drive carefully, and next time lock your car."

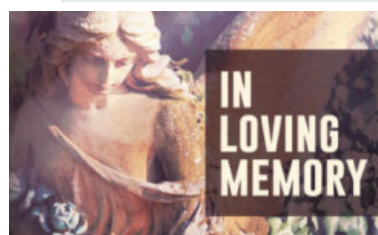

BECOMING CATHOLIC

CATHOLICS OFTEN BEGIN prayers with the sign of the cross and the word s: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." By doing so, we express our faith in three divine persons collectively called the Holy or Blessed Trinity. This simple yet meaningful prayer connects us to a mystery at the heart of Christian life and belief. In fact, "the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life" (CCC 234).



THE CHURCH CALLS it a mystery because three persons in one God is difficult to comprehend. It's not a mystery in the sense some genius or advancement in science will someday solve it. It's a mystery in the religious sense, a deep truth or reality beyond anything we can experience or understand in this world. The heart of the mystery of the Holy Trinity is that "God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange" (CCC 221).

OUR LADY OF AMERICA / INDEPENDENCE DAY

THIS WEEK, WE will celebrate our declaration of freedom from the government of England, back in 1776. Our forefathers and their families endured many hardships as they fought against the British army. Many were killed in the battle. Thanks be to God for their bravery and desire for freedom. May they rest in peace in the Arms of God. Our country, although not perfect, continues to enjoy these freedoms, However, we are recently experiencing some trying times; seemingly a battle between good and evil. Now it is our turn to defend what they fought for long ago, and again, turn to God for inspiration and guidance.

BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 25, 1956 until December 20, 1959, in Rome City, Indiana, Sister Mary Ephrem Neuzel experienced alleged apparitions from our Blessed Mother. She belonged to the Order of The Sisters of The Most Precious Blood of Jesus. She died in 2000. Although the alleged apparitions have not been approved by the Church, they are in consistency with the teachings of the Church. The messages earned support of Archbishop Liebold and other bishops of Cincinnati, who gave the prophetic messages and warnings in their imprimatur.

WE CAN HAVE a PRIVATE devotion to Our Lady of America, even though it has not been recognized. Our Lady's messages contained warnings of our country's future, warnings which clearly fit our confused and troubled times. "Troubling times were headed, especially for the United States." Yet, our Lady held out encouragement and hope. "America can be reformed and many lives will be saved if people will turn to God and turn away from sin, especially sexual impurity." Our Lady's primary goal is to help people change morally, so they will be saved. "I come to you, children of America, as a last resort... Be My Army of chaste soldiers, ready to fight to death to preserve the purity of your souls. Make the Rosary a family prayer... Those found in the circle of My Rosary will never be lost." Our Lady also stated: "My holy Spouse (St. Joseph) has an important part to play in our bringing peace to the world. Fatherhood is from God and it must take, once again, its rightful place among men." SERIES: PREPARING EVEN THE LITTLEST ONES FOR THEIR VOCATION, PART 4

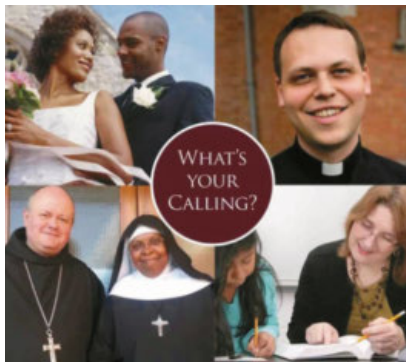

***The Catechism (#2226) lays out a mission for parents to help children discover their vocation. For the next few weeks we will consider 4 simple action steps.*

- #1 Recognize your children are a gift
- #2 Strive for holiness in your life and family
- #3 Expose them to all vocations

IN ORDER FOR children to be open to whichever vocation God calls them to, they must be familiar with the different vocations and be exposed to the beauty hidden in each one. While our children will naturally see many examples of the vocation of marriage in their life, it is also good to expose them to members of religious communities, priests and consecrated men and women when possible.

MY DAD'S BEST friend from high school became a diocesan priest, and we spent many family baptisms and get-togethers in his company. It was beautiful to see the human side of the priesthood, and it helped to cultivate in me a fascination with Jesus and the Church from a young age. I was also blessed to have the Nashville Dominican sisters as teachers at the high school I attended. Their presence in the classroom and at community events was always striking (those habits stand out in a crowd), and they were always an icon to me of the great love of God and His desire to be with me for eternity. Through them, I saw firsthand that religious life wasn't boring or a sad secondary option should marriage not work out for me; instead, I saw a beautiful life of peace and joy and love lived in service of God and His Church.

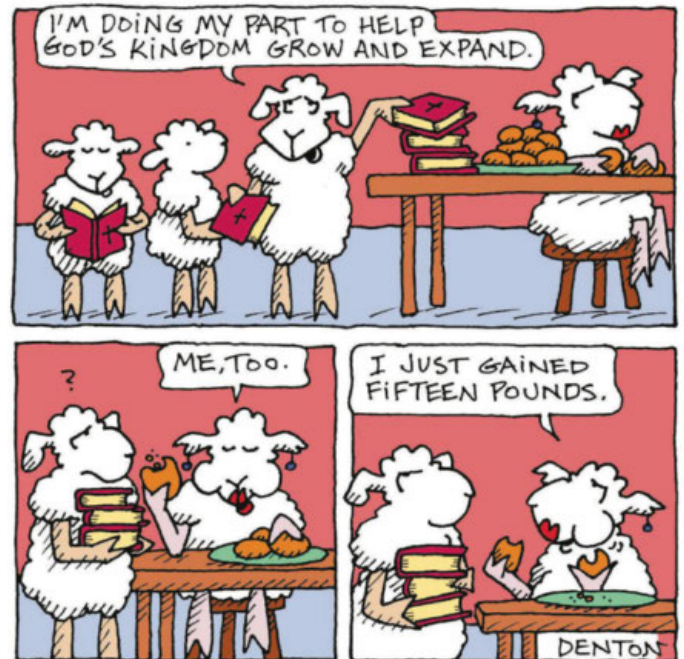

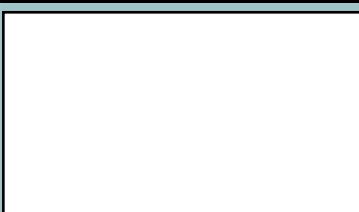
