BECOMING CATHOLIC

THE MASS IS so important to Catholics that we participate in it every Sunday or Saturday evening. Many Catholics also attend Mass on weekdays. Mass has been important enough over the centuries that people have died defending and exercising their religious freedom to participate in the Mass. In some places still today, Catholic priests offer the Mass in secret.

AT MASS, CATHOLICS remember what Jesus did at the Last Supper. Jesus' words, "Do this in memory of me" have been obeyed without interruption for more than 2,000 years. And we believe that Jesus is made present to us. The Mass is our most precious prayer. It is a part of the public worship or "work" of the Church and is "the summit and source of our Christian life....in the Eucharist is found the entire treasure of the Church - Jesus Christ" (United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, p. 228).

THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

THE MONTH OF August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic Faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in Her womb. She was conceived without corruption of sin through the foreseen and infinite merits of Her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of Christ in Her Holy Heart as attested in Scriptures, Her Pure Heart was recognized as something to be imitated. Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower in the 17th century. St John Eudes promoted it alongside the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion rose to a new level after the apparition of Our Lady of Fatima, when Mary revealed an image of Her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco. Our Lady told them that wars and other disasters are a punishment for the sins of mankind.

THE CHURCH ENCOURAGES us to pay special homage to the Immaculate Mother but does not wish to place Her on the same level of the Most High. While Mary reigns over all the angels and saints in Heaven, she is still but a simple creature and, accordingly, an infinite distance stands between Her and Her Adorable Son. Nevertheless, God has united Jesus and Mary so intimately that we cannot separate them. Mary herself revealed that her Heart is critical in these times to bring abut the conversion of our society. She has a Mother's Heart: always accessible, capable of all forgiveness, continuously attentive to our needs, present wherever there is sorrow to console, or a smile to give. It is by the most holy Virgin Mary that Jesus has come into the world and is also by Her Heart that He has to reign in the world. She brought Jesus into the world the first time and will make His second advent full of splendor. Mary assured St. Bridget that She was Mother, not only of the just and innocent, but also of sinners, provided they wish to amend. Devotion to the Blessed Mother leads the soul to avoid sin and to imitate her virtues; particularly her profound faith, humility, obedience, love, patience, charity, wisdom, and prayer." Devotions to the Blessed Mother include the Rosary, Five First Saturdays, Litany of the Blessed Mother, Consecration, and many others---also confiding in Her with words from our hearts." 


WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGE



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS




MY BROTHER KNIGHTS,


ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

#3 P - PRAY. Pray that those 77 children at St. Jude will walk out of that Hospital healthy and happy.


