MARCH 24, 2024 | PALM SUNDAY

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

TODAY, THE CHURCH is celebrating Palm Sunday which is also known as Passion Sunday to commemorate the beginning of Holy Week and Jesus' final agonizing journey to the cross. Here we have the rejoicing with the coming of Jesus and, at the same time, a reminder of His suffering that is to come in a short time. Palm Sunday reminds the faithful of the glorious and triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. As Jesus entered Jerusalem, the crowds greeted Him with shouts of joy and proclaimed Him as the messianic king. They spread their cloaks on the ground and placed the palm branches on the street and shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David" and "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." The Gospels tell us that Jesus rode into the city on a donkey, as foretold by Prophet Zechariah, and, in so doing, emphasized the humility that was to characterize the Kingdom He proclaimed. The donkey was a symbol of peace, and those who rode upon them proclaimed peaceful intentions. The laying of palm branches indicated that the king or dignitary was arriving in victory or triumph.

TODAY'S READINGS PRESENT us the glorious triumph of a King, and this is combined with His sufferings. The Gospel during the procession tells of His victory, and the latter reading reveals in painful detail of the physical sufferings of Jesus. There is rejection, pain, misunderstanding, and humiliation. And yet through it all, Jesus stands firm, faithful to God until the end. In the process, there is a transformation. The leader becomes a servant; shame turns to honor; mockery becomes praise; fear turns to trust; abandonment becomes love; despair turns into hope, and above all, death blossoms into new life. This is again confirmed in the first reading where the servant is faithful to God. He suffers in silence and accepts all accusations of mockery and pain. Yet He remains faithful to God.

THE LITURGY OF the day contains first the blessing of the palms. This is included as a part of the Eucharistic celebration. As we go for the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, we recollect and honor Jesus' entering the great city of Jerusalem. The Church maintains the dignity of the celebrations and turns to the blessing of the palms. The prayers used for this blessing are eloquent and full of instruction and, together with the sprinkling with holy water, impart virtue to these branches which makes them holy. The faithful should hold these palms in their hands during the procession, and keep them in their homes as an outward expression of their faith. It is probable that, as far as Jerusalem itself was concerned, the celebration of Palm Sunday began immediately after the ages of persecution. It was a form of public worship by the Christians as against the quiet celebration of the Eucharist. St. Cyril, who was bishop of that city in the fourth century, tells us that the palm tree, from which the people cut the branches when they went out to meet our Savior, was still to be seen in the valley of Cedron.

IN TODAY'S PASSION narrative, we see the unfathomable love of God for us human persons shown in His beloved son, Jesus. When we see the crucifix, we see the nailed hands and feet of the Son of God to that cross, slowly shedding His blood for us. The Pharisees and the people mocked Him at Calvary as He hung crucified. Pilot condemned an innocent person to death. He had to die a humiliating death hung between two thieves. The leaders deliberately put Him with the criminals to humiliate Him further before the people and to have them associate Him with robbers. The helplessness of the God-man was visible on the cross. In the face of those insults, and the people watching, and the leaders sneering, and the soldiers offering sour wine, Jesus had things to say. He went on repeating them. His words, "Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing" hold for all time, for we too are included in it. God's merciful answer to His dying Son Jesus is for us too since we are His chosen ones.

THE LITURGY OF Palm Sunday in the past two decades has been closely related to the celebration of Youth Day. Pope Benedict XVI in his homily of 2006 Palm Sunday said that for 20 years, thanks to Pope John Paul II, Palm Sunday has become in a particular way the Day of Youth, the day that young people around the world go out to meet Christ, wishing to accompany Him in their cities and countries so that He will be among us and be able to establish His peace in the world. The Pope stressed the three characteristics proclaimed by the church: poverty, peace, universality — are summarized in the sign of the cross. Palm Sunday, however, tells us that the authentic great "yes" is, in fact, the cross, that the cross is the authentic tree of life.



WALK TO CALVARY HOLY WEEK "THIS IS MY BODY WHICH WILL BE GIVEN FOR YOU. THIS IS MY BLOOD WHICH SHALL BE SHED FOR YOU."

WHEN WE GAZE upon Jesus crucified on the Cross, we remember those words He spoke at the last supper----and now fulfilled. Since it was written in Scripture that He must die, the prophecy had to be fulfilled. Crucifixion was the cruelest form of death, yet Jesus chose and willingly endured the brutal scourging, mocking, humiliation, and finally death on the Cross because of His Great Love for us. By this, He offers to us forgiveness and redemption from our sins and the gift of eternal life. HE IS THE WAY, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE. His Cross is the logo of Christianity, the mark of a Christian. The Sign of the Cross begins every Mass, blesses us at Baptism and during life, and is the last prayer spoken at the grave.

AS JESUS WAS being nailed to the Cross, He said: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." As He forgave those who condemned, tortured, and crucified Him, we too, must forgive those who wrong, hurt, or humiliate us. We must also ask for forgiveness for our transgressions against others, therefore against God. This is not always easy to do. Forgiveness is essential to a happy and healthy mind, body, and spirit. The Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation offers conversion and healing, giving us peace and joy. It deepens our relationship with God and helps us to grow in humility and virtue-----and the grace to avoid future sin. There is nothing that God cannot forgive or heal.

IN THIS LAST week of Lent, pray for forgiveness and the ability to forgive. Also pray for America, that God will forgive the many grievous sins committed in our country.

OUR LENTEN WALK will finish this week. Once we reach the foot of the cross, it is important for us to continue this walk (exercise) throughout our lives, praying to our Lord along the way.

AT PRESENT, OUR miles are 6,060. We are almost there with only 680 miles left to go! We will have the total miles in next week's article.

THE LITURGIES DURING Holy Week are unique and rich in symbolism. The Mass for Palm Sunday follows the pattern from 2,000 years ago when Jesus entered Jerusalem. It includes a Gospel reading outside the church building and the entrance of the priest into the sanctuary while the congregation waves palms.

THE HOLY THURSDAY Mass also follows the rhythm of the ancient Last Supper. The presider washes the feet of members of the congregation, like Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. After Mass, all remaining hosts are taken to an altar of repose, where adoration of the Blessed Sacrament occurs late into the night. Parishioners can remain like the disciples in Gethsemane, asked to "watch and pray."

ON GOOD FRIDAY, we celebrate another special liturgical service. Following the Liturgy of the Word, there is a communal reverencing of the cross. The intercessions are solemn and include prayers for many different groups of people, reminding us that Jesus' passion is for the whole world. There is no Liturgy of the Eucharist. Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday are distributed, after which the tabernacle is empty. The tabernacle remains empty through Holy Saturday just as Jesus departed from this earthly world in death — and we wait in hope for Easter Sunday! ©LPi

ST. MARY CHURCH STAINED GLASS WINDOWS STATIONS OF THE CROSS

DURING LENT, TAKE time to pray the Stations of the Cross through our Church's stained glass windows. Each week during Lent, three of the windows will be discussed here. Prayer books are available in the church for you to use to follow each stained glass station.



WINDOW 16: THE EUCHARIST AT EMMAUS

The artist stresses, through repetition, the importance of the Eucharist for Christians. In this window, the two hands breaking the bread represents the meal at Emmaus where the disciples recognized Christ in this act.



WINDOW 17: THE ASCENSION

The artist's intention was to take the figure of Christ in his white garment and to blend it in with the clouds. In this way Christ is to appear luminous and light, to create the effect of being carried upward with the wind.



WINDOW 18: PENTECOST

The strong swooping movement of the wind is suggested by the circular motion of the clear glass. The tongues of fire, represented by the red sections, are portrayed as being swept along by the wind. The artist depicts in this way the power and might of the Holy Spirit.

PALM SUNDAY

THE PALM SUNDAY celebration has ancient origins. Beginning the liturgy "outside" the church, we symbolically reenact Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The crowds in ancient Israel waved palm branches – a symbol of royalty – to welcome Jesus. These days, obtaining palms takes a lot of planning and coordination, as hundreds of thousands of churches worldwide need them on the same day! Many in the United States order palms from Florida, California, Texas, or Central America.

THE PALMS USED on Palm Sunday are blessed at Mass. This means they shouldn't end up in the trash! Many people weave palms into crosses or families display them in their homes. If you do not plan on displaying your palms throughout the year, they should be burned, buried, or left at the church. In the final case, the palms are burned to provide the ashes for next year's Ash Wednesday service.

YOUTH MINISTRY–FROM THE MINDS OF OUR MIDDLE SCHOOLERS

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

DURING THE MIDDLE School Edge program, our students are encouraged to ask questions relative to the Catholic faith. Each week, we will publish answers to a question that has been asked. The depth of their questions is thought provoking and genuine.

Question: How Does God Appear to us?

THIS QUESTION CAN be interpreted in two different ways. First, it can be read as: How can we receive apparitions (as in seeing a vision of God/Mary/the saints)? This answer is simple. It is only by the grace of God that people receive apparitions.

THE SECOND WAY in which the question can also be interpreted is how God can be seen and heard throughout our life. There are multiple ways God reveals Himself to us, and there are 3 main ways God has already revealed Himself to us. First, Jesus reveals the Father to us; the more we know Jesus, the more we know the Father. And the more we know the Father, the more we know Jesus. This also applies to the Holy Spirit. The more we know the Holy Spirit, the more we know God the Father and The Son (CCC 238-248). The second way God has revealed Himself to us is through sacred scripture. The more we know sacred scripture, the more we know God and are able to apply the biblical teachings of God to our life (CCC 101-137). The last is sacred tradition. We have been given some knowledge of God that is not written in the bible that still has authority to be from God. The Catechism of The Catholic Church is a great example (CCC 75 - 100).




