

My Dear Brothers and Sisters, HAPPY EASTER.

THE FEAST OF Easter is the celebration of Jesus' victory over death and mankind's hope for eternal life. This feast gives us the hope of our own Resurrection and, at the same time, keeps us united with the living Christ who has **THE GOSPEL OF** today tells us how Mary Magdalene went in promised to remain with us. The theme of today's Mass includes both proclamation and witness. St. Paul tells us that if Jesus does not rise from the dead, our faith is in vain. In the Gospel of the day, Mary Magdalene is asked to go and proclaim the Resurrection to all. To the Disciples, the Resurrection of Jesus was something new and unexpected. It was a total transformation, and it gave them a new vision of life. They had been witnesses of His suffering and death, and during that time, they had remained hidden out of fear. Their hope in Jesus was shattered. The resurrection brought about a complete turnaround, and they boldly began to proclaim

they were arrested, persecuted, and imprisoned, they rejoiced as they were now even more closely related to the life experience of their Lord through His resurrection.

THE RESURRECTION OF Jesus Christ is at the very heart of Christianity. For His disciples, it was indeed a mystery. The Easter Sunday for them was a total reversal of the image of Good Friday. His death which seemed to be a defeat before the world is now shown as a triumph, a victory over death. His dying on the cross in reality was a passage to new life. They were not able to comprehend the fact of Resurrection and grasp the deep inner meaning of it even though Jesus had spoken to them several times during His public life. However, it built up their faith particularly because of their experience of the presence of Jesus and made them persons, courageous and ready to face any eventuality for their Master. Jesus stood among them, talked to them, ate with them, and taught them. They were called upon to build the faith of others, and we see how marvelous the living faith of the early Church was. The disciples, once they knew that Jesus was

the Messiah and that He had been resurrected from the dead by the Father, became totally transformed persons. They were ready to face any suffering, even death, as it was Christ who was important.

search of Jesus even after the disciples went away. She loved her master, was much devoted to Him, and wanted to remain close to the tomb. She was upset with the events that the stone was removed, the body was missing, and she thought that someone had deliberately stolen it. She wept at the loss and had an inner burning desire to be near Him, to follow Him, to hear Him, to feel loved, to be understood, and to be forgiven of sins. In the tomb, she saw two angels who asked her the reason for her weeping. At that very moment, Jesus too was present, and He too asked her the reason for her crying. She thought that He was the gardener and looked for His help, but Jesus presented Himself to her and called her by name. that Jesus, who died on the Cross, was alive. Later, when Only then did she understand who He was and worshiped Him.

Jesus indeed accepted her presence but gave her the mission. She was asked to go and tell all, starting from the disciples, that Jesus has been raised from the dead, and she had seen Him, and He had the good news for everyone.

ON THIS EASTER Sunday, Jesus calls us to be His messengers of peace. We pray that this peace will remain in our hearts always to make us His messengers in the world of today. The celebration of Easter is a call for us to change – and perhaps change radically – as Jesus' own disciples changed. The feast of Easter is the confirmation of our faith. Our faith is deeply rooted and finds its real meaning in the Resurrection of Jesus. St. Paul says that if Christ is not raised, then all our believing is in vain. Hence, our faith tells us that Good Friday and the death of Jesus is not the climax of Holy Week. It is only a path in the achievement of the final **Resurrection.** The cross was the high point of Jesus' gift of Himself to the Father for our sakes, and the Father returns the gift of resurrected Jesus to us. Accordingly, today's Mass invites us with the invitation to proclaim the good news and be witnesses to the Risen Lord.

MAY THE LORD bless you and your family. HAPPY EASTER.

Catechism Corner

WHY DOES THE DATE OF EASTER CHANGE EVERY YEAR, WHILE MOST OTHER CELEBRATIONS ARE CELEBRATED ON THE SAME DAY?

EVERY FEAST IS celebrated at a certain time for a reason. Saints feast days are commonly the day of their death. While we don't know Jesus' exact birthday, we celebrate the "light of the world" around the time of winter solstice, as dark, wintery days begin to lengthen again. We have a historical clue, however, to when the Easter events occurred. We know that Jesus was crucified the day before Passover. The Jews calculated the date for Passover based on both the solar and lunar calendars. It corresponds to the first full moon after the spring equinox. The early Christians maintained this connection in their celebrations of Easter on the first Sunday after the paschal full moon.

WE DON'T RE-CALCULATE the full moon every year. As astronomy developed, so too did the forecasts of when Easter would occur in future years. The Church has created a table of calculated dates, projecting the date of Easter decades in advance. The date of Easter also determines the date of Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent, as well as the feast days following in the Easter season, including Pentecost. So these feasts move, too! This tradition may seem complicated, but it connects our Christian faith now to what has come before — our Jewish roots and the real, historical reality of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. ©LPi

YOUTH MINISTRY-FROM THE MINDS OF OUR MIDDLE SCHOOLERS QUESTION OF THE WEEK


DURING THE MIDDLE School Edge program, our students are encouraged to ask questions relative to the Catholic faith. Each week, we will publish answers to a question that has been asked. The depth of their questions is thought provoking and genuine.

Question: How does prayer help us grow closer to God? **Answer:**

CONSIDER THIS QUESTION: How do you grow in a relationship with your friends? In order to grow in any relationship, you must communicate by not only talking, but also listening. When you first meet someone, or you want to be best friends with someone, you have to listen and talk to them, right? So, why would our way of creating relationship with the Lord look any different?

WHEN WE TALK to the Lord, we should also be willing to listen, because He ultimately has more for us than we even know. The Lord blessed our bodies with two ears and one mouth for a reason - so we may listen more than we speak. So, how does prayer help us grow in relationship with Him? It helps us ask the questions that we have, talk to Him like a friend about all of our worries, fears, successes, and desires, and ultimately helps us to understand Him and His will for us more than we can possibly do on our own. When we don't talk to people, we assume. When we don't talk to God via prayer, we assume His answers without asking. Ask the Lord to help you grow in a desire to know Him more every day this week, and see what happens at the end of the week.


