APRIL 7, 2024 | SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

HIS HOLINESS POPE John Paul II passed away on April 2, 2005. He shepherded the Catholic Church for nearly twentyseven years. He was the most travelled Pope. He cheated death many times. At the beginning of his pontificate, an attempt of assassination was made on him (1981). He had colon cancer in 1992; he suffered shoulder and hip injuries in 1992 and 1993; he had his appendix removed in 1996, and in 2001, it was confirmed that he suffered from Parkinson's disease. Towards the end of his life, he was visibly in pain, but he united it with the suffering of Christ and bore with it with extraordinary serenity. One day, while he was giving a press conference, one reporter asked him, "Holy Father, kindly excuse me for being bold. You are aged, your hands are shaking, your voice is feeble and inaudible, and you find it difficult to walk. You are suffering a lot and you are incapacitated in your work. Why don't you resign and take rest, and make way for others to take over. The Holy Father said, "If Jesus had come down from the cross, I too would have resigned. Since, He remained on the cross and suffered, I, too, am holding on to my responsibility, and am suffering." The suffering, which the Pope was undergoing, was because he loved Christ and the people whom Christ had entrusted to him. The Holy Father's sufferings were the tokens of his love.

THE RESURRECTION OF Jesus was a new experience to the disciples. Even though Jesus had constantly explained to them about His rising from the dead, they were unable to grasp the implication of it. It was not something the disciples of Jesus seem to have anticipated, but now they were confronted with a novel experience of their Master. The gospel narrative of today helps them to move from fear to joy, seclusion to mission, absence to presence, disbelief to faith, mere existence to new life. It tells how Jesus breathed on the disciples giving them the Holy Spirit. Through the Spirit, they are into the second creation leading them into something even bigger, to be born again in Christ through Baptism. Jesus gives them peace and power to forgive sins. The forgiveness that Jesus speaks of is not just the juridical wiping away of sins but a deep reconciliation of people with God and with each other.

JOHN, IN TODAY'S Gospel reading, provides us with an account of what Jesus did after His Resurrection. The passage begins by telling us that in the evening, on the day Jesus rose from the dead, He came and stood among His disciples as they had gathered behind the locked doors. They were still scared of the enemies in spite of receiving the good news of the Master being alive, and they sat huddled together in that house. They were collaborators with Jesus, who was executed as a rabble rouser, and it was not impossible that they would meet a similar fate. Then, all of a sudden and totally unexpected, Jesus was there before them. In case there was any doubt, He showed them His hands and side which had been pierced with nails. He gave them the message of peace which on the one hand, a normal Jewish greeting of 'Shalom' and on the other the fulfillment of a promise made at the Last Supper. During His apparition to the disciples, Jesus gave the mission telling them that just as the Father has sent Him, so is He sending them. Two things are being said here. Firstly, the mission that was given to Jesus by His Father is now being passed on to them. He was commissioning the Church through His disciples and their apostolic succession to perpetuate the work of Divine salvation that had been realized through His death and Resurrection. They are to do exactly the same work as Jesus did, proclaim the same message, announce the same vision. And they will do that by the way they live their lives as a group. It is essentially a corporate mission. Secondly, that mission is an essential part of their discipleship. They are called upon to live like Jesus and draw others to share their personal experience of knowing and loving Jesus and being loved by Him. Now, they have a mission to spread the love of Jesus, to form a community, and to celebrate the Eucharist. Jesus confirms them in their mission. He breathes on them and gives them the Holy Spirit and also the power to forgive sins. They have the greater power to reconcile and the special task to bring them to Jesus. This power is more than the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

AS WE HEARD in the Gospel, Jesus appeared one week later and was with them wishing them peace. Then He called Thomas and challenged him to put his finger in His wounds and hand into His side. The Scriptures do not tell us if Thomas ever needed to touch Jesus. What it tells us is that the eyes of Thomas were opened with the expression of faith: "My Lord and my God!" The Resurrection of Jesus was the ultimate evidence that Thomas needed to prove to him that the friendship he had enjoyed with Jesus for the past three years was indeed a friendship with God incarnated in human form. Thomas must have been overcome with awe and wonder. At the end, Jesus appreciated Thomas for his faith in Him. But He said something more about His wouldbe followers who would believe in Him without visually encountering Him.

TODAY IS DIVINE Mercy Sunday, the Second Sunday of the Easter season. It was named by Pope John Paul II at the canonization of St. Maria Faustina on April 30, 2000 and then officially decreed by the Vatican. Divine Mercy Sunday can be seen as the convergence of all the mysteries and graces of Holy Week and Easter Week. The feast focuses the light of the Risen Christ into a radiant beam of merciful love and grace for the whole world. In His revelations to St. Faustina, Jesus expressed His desire to celebrate this special feast. He says that the Feast of Mercy emerged from His very depths of tenderness, and mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of His Mercy. Jesus says that the divine floodgates, through which grace flows, are opened and let no soul fear to draw near to Him, even though his sins be as scarlet because the Feast of Mercy emerged from the very depths of His tenderness.

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THE DIVINE MERCY OF GOD

"ETERNAL GOD, IN WHOM MERCY IS ENDLESS AND THE TREASURY OF COMPASSION INEXHAUSTIBLE, LOOK KINDLY UPON US AND INCREASE YOUR MERCY IN US, THAT IN DIFFICULT MOMENTS WE MIGHT NOT DESPAIR NOR BECOME DESPONDENT, BUT WITH GREAT CONFIDENCE SUBMIT OURSELVES TO YOUR HOLY WILL, WHICH IS LOVE AND MERCY ITSELF." (950)

TODAY, WE CELEBRATE the Feast of Divine Mercy. The message of Divine Mercy is that God loves ALL of us, no matter how great the sinner. "The greater the sinner, the greater right he has to My Mercy." (723) Trust in Jesus is the essence of the message of Mercy. "The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive." (1578) "Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet." (699) "My Mercy is greater than your sins and those of the entire world." (1485) Along with trust, we must turn back to God, with conversion of our lives back to God and repenting of our sins and forgiving others. We must also radiate our mercy to others by our actions, our words, and our prayers. "BE MERCIFUL AS YOUR FATHER IS MERCIFUL."

OUR LORD APPEARED to a young Polish nun the 1930s, giving her messages and asking that she have His Image painted, with the signature: JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU. The two rays radiating from His Heart denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. "By means of this image, I shall grant many graces to souls. It is a reminder of the demands of My Mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works." (742) Three o'clock in the afternoon is the Hour of Mercy, for it is the hour that Jesus died. We are asked to pray the Chaplet of Mercy, especially at that hour (it can be prayed at any hour) for the conversion of sinners and for the dying. "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death." Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My Infinite Mercy." (687) (The numbers in parenthesis refer to the messages given to St. Faustina in her diary.)

ON OUR WALK to Calvary, we had an awesome total of 7,012 miles. Thanks again to All who participated. Please keep praying---- and "walking" with God.

SHOULD A CATHOLIC PURSUE AN ANNULMENT?

QUESTION: AFTER A CIVIL DIVORCE, IS A CATHOLIC OBLIGATED TO PURSUE AN ANNULMENT?

ANSWER: MANY CATHOLICS are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

ANNULMENTS HAVE NO legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing, and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you. ©LPi



THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.

How to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy:

1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole word and empty Yourself out upon us. (Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

3. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed by Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.



Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

4. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

5. The Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

6. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades

Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father bead and then 10 "For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion-inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to You holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.


YOUTH MINISTRY-FROM THE MINDS OF OUR MIDDLE SCHOOLERS QUESTION OF THE WEEK

DURING THE MIDDLE School Edge program, our students are encouraged to ask questions relative to the Catholic faith. Each week, we will publish answers to a question that has been asked. The depth of their questions is thought provoking and genuine.

Question: Was the story of Adam and Eve true?

Yes, the story of Adam and Eve is not written as a historical or scientific book. It is a story to reveal spiritual truth. Whether or not it happened exactly that way does not contradict our belief that it is the written Word of God and that it is True. The Catechism of the Catholic Church outlines our belief of the story of Adam and Eve, CCC (386-410). The truths that we should focus on are that we are created in the image and likeness of God, the truth that the devil tempts us and pridefully reveals his offerings of sin as superior than God's commands, the truth that sin and death was brought into the world by Adam's and Eve's disobedience, and, in the big picture, God has come to save us from the sin.


