APRIL 14, 2024 | THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A WIDOWED MOTHER leaves her house and goes to fetch water, leaving her only child asleep. On her return, she found a large crowd around her burning house. On the inside, her son is about to die in the fire. Throwing her bowl of water on the floor and crying, she wants to get into the burning house to look for her son. Everyone keeps saying, "You're going to die, too. The fire is very great." Escaping from their hands, she enters the fire and wrapped her son in a blanket. The child, tight against her breast, is not touched by the fire. The mother comes out severely burnt and is only narrowly saved, thanks to the care of the hospital, but she lives with scars and is unrecognizable. Many years passed. The child, under the guidance of his mother, completed his studies and was appointed minister. He organized a party at his villa on his appointment and invited all the dignitaries of the city and his friends. While they were in full party, noises were heard at the door of the entrance to the villa. The son was forced to go and resolve the situation. He found that the security officers were preventing his mother from joining the party. He had not invited her, but she also wanted to join the party. Faced with this situation in front of his guests, he said tenderly to his mother: "Please, Mom, I would be ashamed to have you appear before my friends. We can discuss this later." And in secret, he ordered security to throw out his mother because of her scars. This woman represents Jesus Christ who sacrificed Himself for you and me. Today, what place do you give Him in your life? It is He who has received the scars because of you

IN OUR JOURNEY through life, we are confronted with several problems and difficulties which can make us lose our perspective. We can lose all direction to life and remain helpless. Then, left to ourselves, we become nothing and tend to remain with uncertainty. In such situations, we need positive support, a sincere understanding which can place us on the right path. In the Easter context, we see Jesus as a consoler and help to the disciples who are filled with fear. He comes constantly to them and remains with them, guides them, and eats with them. By breaking the bread with the disciples and sharing the meal, He makes them experience His real presence. Today, we have another account of Jesus appearing to His disciples on Easter Sunday. The gospel begins with the story of the two disciples who had the experience of walking with Jesus and their recognition of the Lord in the breaking of bread. Remaining close to them, Jesus drives away all their doubts and unbelief by giving them the gift of peace. He asks the disciples to touch and feel Him and experience His real presence among them. He remains as the real friend in their lives, and helps them back into confidence.

THE RESURRECTION OF Jesus is the greatest miracle that took place during his earthly stay. It is the foundation and

the cornerstone of our Christian religion. The death of Jesus on Calvary proved that He was truly human. His resurrection showed that He was divine. During His public life, Jesus announced that He was Son of God and spoke of His mission to proclaim the Kingdom of God. Through His resurrection, Jesus won the victory over death to win for us the eternal life. The Gospels tell us that after His resurrection, Jesus appeared several times to the disciples, and each of His appearances was to substantiate the belief that He had indeed been raised from the dead. His task was to lead the disciples from a position of fear and doubt into a situation of worship and acceptance. Clearly, this is the case in the gospel passage of today given by Luke to us. Today's gospel reports to us two events that are distinct in time but closely linked to each other. The first is the apparition of Jesus to His disciples and second was to prepare them for the mission. This apparition took place on Easter evening after Jesus had appeared to the two disciples of Emmaus. Those two disciples had walked the seven miles back to Jerusalem to report the event to others and to tell them that on their journey to Emmaus the Lord had walked with them. They had talked to Him during the journey and listened to His teachings, but they did not recognize Him until the breaking of the bread. Indeed, they truly met Him by way of the Sacred Scriptures, which He explained to them and pre-eminently they met Him in the breaking of bread. The disciples, gathered in the room, were hearing the account of these two disciples who have just returned from Emmaus after their meeting with Jesus. While this event was being discussed, Jesus mysteriously appears once again in their midst. Surprised by His sudden appearance, the disciples are confused and terrified. He greets them with the familiar words, Peace be with you. The aim of Jesus was to bring peace into an environment of fear and consternation. Here indeed, as we see as in other instances in the Gospel, the presence of Jesus does bring peace and joy.

THE READINGS OF today tell us that our Christian faith is first and foremost a response of belief to the person of the risen Christ who will be with us at all times. This belief embraces the realization that Jesus has won salvation for us by His sacrifice on the cross as Peter explained in His sermon. John, in his letter, reminds us that Jesus remains our advocate when we encounter the harsh reality of our sins in our lives. It is the sacrifice of Jesus that has made possible our proximity to God and the experience of His love. By embracing the same obedience to the Commandments in the love of Jesus Christ, we know that we are in Jesus and that Jesus is in us. Then in our pilgrimage of faith, the action of the Holy Spirit calls for a never-ending conversion of our inner most selves. We can help the process by keeping always the freshness of the joy and wonder of the first Easter.

ALL THINGS BRIGHT & BEAUTIFUL

ONCE AGAIN, WE have just participated in a MOST BEAUTIFUL EASTER CELEBRATION. In the Resurrection, grief was transformed into Joy, darkness into Light, and despair into Hope. We learned that without death, there could be no Resurrection----and that Jesus gave HIS ALL for us.

DURING LENT, WE prepared our hearts, each in our own way, to be with Jesus at the foot of His Cross on Good Friday. Many of our Parish Family took part in the Palm Sunday procession, remembering Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. We were blessed to have opportunities, with the Stations of the Cross, the Most Beautiful Holy Hour of Adoration during Holy Week, and by participating in the Walk to Calvary. The Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, with Jesus serving His people by the washing of their feet----and then, most important of all, our participation in and renewal in us the Institution of the Holy Eucharist. The events of Good Friday allowed us to participate in the suffering and death of Our Lord, remembering that He gave HIS ALL for the forgiveness of our sins. ANGELS

Every Sunday in the Creed we profess "I believe in the resurrection of the body." 




YOUTH MINISTRY—FROM THE MINDS OF OUR MIDDLE SCHOOLERS OUESTION OF THE WEEK

DURING THE Middle School Edge program, our students are encouraged to ask questions relative to the Catholic faith. Each week, we will publish answers to a question that has been asked. The depth of their questions is thought provoking and genuine.

Question: After your parents take the oath for your baptism, what happens if you miss your First Communion or Confirmation?

Answer: The consequences of parents not bringing their baptismal promises to fulfillment are that a child would miss out on two of the greatest gifts of God, and the child would not be fully initiated into the faith. (CCC 1275) The sacraments of initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist. These sacraments, united together, bring one into the faith.

WHAT ARE THE effects of these sacraments? Baptism, is for the forgiveness of all sins. A person is made an adopted son/daughter of God, brought into the church, and made a member of the body of Christ. It connects you to all baptized Christians, and it leaves you with an indelible mark that consecrates you to Christ. (CCC 1262-1274)

THE SACRAMENT OF Confirmation gives us access to the Holy Spirit, "perfects baptismal grace," and leaves one with a spiritual mark on one's soul once again consecrating us to God like baptism does.

THE EUCHARIST IS a gift of union with Jesus. In this sacrament, we consume Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity (CCC 1374) into our body. If one were trying to gain muscle, one would eat a lot of food in order to build muscle, energy, and strength. This is the effect of this sacrament. One's soul and faith is nourished and strengthened by consuming the Eucharist. (CCC 1391-1397) If one is baptized and has not made the sacrament of holy communion or confirmation but it is desired, talk with a parent or guardian about completing The Sacraments of Initiation. If you are an adult who has not completed The Sacraments of Initiation and are interested in the faith, please contact the church about OCIA (formerly RCIA) and they will be happy to guide you home to The Catholic Church.
