MAY 5, 2024 | SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

SOME TIME AGO, there was an article in the Los Angeles Times about Howard Maxwell and his four-year-old daughter, Melinda. As children often do, Melinda developed a fixation on the story of “The Three Little Pigs.” Every time her father came around, Melinda wanted him to read it to her. Well, for adults, a little “Three Little Pigs” goes a long way. The father, being both modern and inventive, got a tape recorder, recorded the story, and taught Melinda how to turn it on. He thought that had solved his problem. But it lasted less than a day. Soon Melinda came to her father, holding out “The Three Little Pigs” and asking him to read. Somewhat impatiently, the father said, “Melinda, you have the tape recorder, and you know how to turn it on!” The little girl looked up at her father with her big eyes and said, plaintively, “Yes, daddy, but I can’t sit on its lap!” Of course, what she really wanted was love. That is what we all want, and we never outgrow our need for it. To be valued, to be cared about, to be loved with a love without strings, a love that will always be there for us; I tell you, that is a foundation for our families that is strong enough to build upon!

IN TODAY’S GOSPEL, Jesus urges His followers to abide in His love and to love one another. This love for one’s neighbor must have as its model and exemplar Christ’s love for His disciples, which made Him lay down His life for them. The disciples are not Christ’s servants but His intimate friends and associates in His work. The passage also emphasizes the divine mutuality as Jesus explains that as the Father loves the Son, so does the Son love the disciples, and the disciples are to love one another. Everything is interconnected, and the word used is “remain”. However, the purpose of this divine mutuality is to bear fruit, meaning that the disciples must do something. Jesus says that they will bear lasting fruit in their life work if they trust in God and are motivated by true love for God and neighbor.

THE DISCIPLES ARE commanded by Jesus to love one another as He had loved them. This brings us to the important question as to how Jesus showed His love to His disciples. To grasp the full meaning of the command of Jesus, we must go back to where this commandment first emerged, namely at the washing of the feet. Jesus,

after washing the feet of the disciples, reflected for them the significance of this gesture. Most obviously, it signified service, and in the case of Jesus, it indicated the ultimate service He would offer His disciples by laying down His life for them. He also demonstrated to them that He was serving them not as a superior serves an inferior but as an equal. He put on the clothing of a servant and washed the feet of His disciples. The sense of equality is expressed by the term friendship. He and the disciples are friends in the deepest sense of that term. Once again, Jesus repeats the commandment to love one another as He has loved them. They ought to show their love to each other as friends.

WHILE CALLING US to this new relationship of friendship, Jesus tells us that we all are fit to come to His level of relationship as friends. In this friendship, the first choice is His as it is ours, and He has found us worthy of this choice. He reminds us that we did not choose Him, but Jesus chose us first, and He has decided to choose us in our unworthiness and to love and accept us as we are. These words of Christ, you did not choose me, but I chose you, apply to each one of us, we who believe in Him, the Savior of the world. Whether it is by our priesthood or by our baptism and our confirmation in Christ, each one of us was chosen by the Son of God to be an adoptive son and daughter of the Father in the Spirit.

IN HIS FRIENDSHIP towards us, Jesus has made known to us everything that He has heard from the Father. Through the revelation that was made complete in Jesus, God gave endlessly to us. Jesus goes further to tell us that it has been His initiative to choose His disciples. We did not choose Jesus. He chose us. We do not have the capability of drawing towards God. It is by the grace of the Father that we are drawn to Jesus. It is God the Father calling us, telling us through His Spirit, “Jesus is the answer. Go to Him.” God created us to love; He created us so that we might all love each other with only one heart, one soul. God created us so that, one day, we might receive within us His Son Jesus, and, through Him,

all the Love He is in person as God, the Son and Image of the Father.

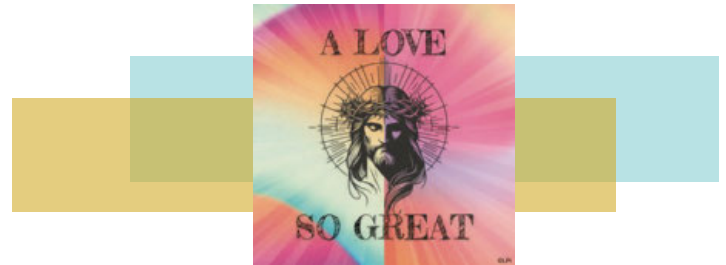

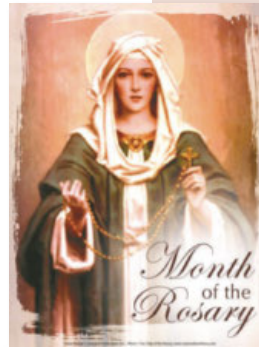

BECOMING CATHOLIC

CATHOLICS OFTEN BEGIN prayers with the sign of the cross and the words: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." By doing so, we express our faith in three divine persons collectively called the Holy or Blessed Trinity. This simple yet meaningful prayer connects us to a mystery at the heart of Christian life and belief. In fact, "the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life" (CCC 234).



THE CHURCH CALLS it a mystery because three persons in one God is difficult to comprehend. It's not a mystery in the sense that some genius or advancement in science will someday solve. It's a mystery in the religious sense, a deep truth or reality beyond anything we can experience or understand in this world. The heart of the mystery of the Holy Trinity is that "God Himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He has destined us to share in that exchange" (CCC 221).

CATHOLIC FAITH

HOW DOES ONE BEGIN AS AN ADULT TO DEVELOP A RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD?

START ON A personal level! How did you and your neighbor become friends? How did you begin to discuss such a personal topic as faith? Communication, spending time together, and getting to know each other are essential to forming the bonds of a relationship. Personal prayer is essential to our relationship with God. We can't be close to someone we don't know! Invite your friend to explore the stories of Jesus in the Bible. Introduce them to the lives of the saints, especially ones you think they might be interested in.

YOUR NEIGHBOR MIGHT also have questions about the Catholic faith that you don't know how to answer. If your friend hasn't yet enrolled in RCIA classes, invite them to Mass at your parish. Introduce your friend to the faith formation director to make a connection. Personal support can be helpful as well, especially if few of your neighbor's current friends are practicing their faith. Connect your neighbor to other people in your parish living their faith well. The good examples of other faithful people could help your neighbor to feel welcomed and supported. NOVENA TO OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

AN APPEARANCE OF

our Blessed Mother in the new world occurred in 1531, in Guadalupe, Mexico. She appeared to a native Mexican peasant, Juan Diego, as a beautiful maiden, dressed like an Aztec princess. She introduced herself as the Mother of God and Mother



of all humanity. She asked that he go to the local bishop and request that a chapel be built on the spot where she appeared. Questioning his story, the bishop asked for a sign. Our Lady instructed Juan to go to Tepeyac Hill where he would find roses blooming, although out of season. Using his cloak (tilma), he carried the beautiful roses back to the bishop. As he opened the tilma, a miraculous image of Our Lady appeared on it. Millions of the native people were converted as a result of her message; that She is their mother and has not forgotten them----- and this miracle. The bishop then ordered the building of the church. Today, the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City houses the image. She is known as the "Brown Virgin," and is the patroness of Mexico and the EMPRESS OF ALL THE AMERICAS. Her feast day is December 12.

THIS PAST MARCH, Cardinal Raymond Leo Burke gave to us a Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe, which is to be prayed DAILY from March 12 to December 12 (Her feast day), culminating with a consecration to Our Lady. We pray for the conversion of all souls in America and throughout the world, to her Divine Son, "uniting our hearts to her Immaculate Heart, so that we may find our true and lasting home in the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus." The prayer can be found at: novena.cardinalburke.com. Currently, 150,000 people are praying this novena. It is not too late to begin, as we have a long way/time to go until December 12. America and the world are in great need for God's intervention for the ending of abortions, conversions, and peace.

DURING THE MONTH of May, which is dedicated to our Blessed Mother, please take time to pray the rosary, which is her favorite and most powerful prayer. The rosary has won battles, fought heresies, and has brought about countless conversions and miracles to those praying it with faith. Please join with us after the 10:00 Mass on Sundays during May to pray a rosary. Our Blessed Mother stated: "Finally. My Immaculate Heart will triumph."

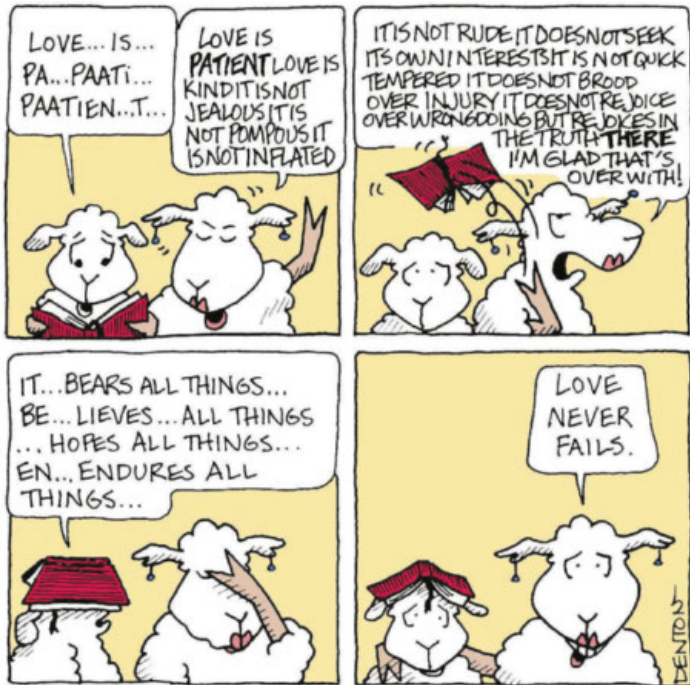

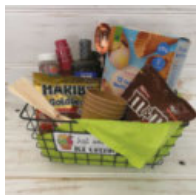

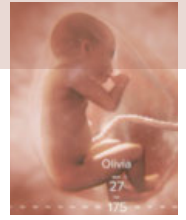
