"We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20), Pope Francis teaches us about our shared baptismal call to mission. We encourage our parishioners to answer that call on that special Sunday through prayer and generous sacrifice to the Missions.

It's Pirohy Time!!!

Sign-up sheets are in the back of the church for anyone able to help with the pirohy. You may also call the office to sign up. Even if you can only spare one or two hours it will be much appreciated! We make them at St. Cyril's Hall.

Wednesday, October 6 6:00 am-10:00 am

We cook the cabbage and sauerkraut in large stock-pots, which must be lifted while full of hot water and food. Later the pots need cleaned.

Thursday, October 7 7:00 am-10:00 am

We cook the potatoes and mash them in a large commercial mixer. We roll the balls in preparation for filling on Fridays. We prepare and package the haluski. We set up tables for the sale on Fridays.

Friday, October 8 7:30 am-noon

We mix the dough in a commercial mixer, roll it out and cut the dough into circles.

We form the pirohy by wrapping/pinching dough around the balls. We then cook the pirohy in stockpots. Once pirohy is cooled it is prepared for packaging and counted into one or two dozen containers. Orders are then picked up



by customers from 12:00 noon - 4 pm

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Homebound

Thinking Like Jesus, the Importance and Meaning of the Marriage Bond

As we prepare to reflect on the Scripture Readings for this 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, I would like to invite you to join me in not just reflecting on the words, but instead to enter into them (as much as our Lord will allow us) so that we might *think like Jesus*. Jesus is the Word of God, and we invite Him into our minds †, our mouths †, and our hearts † prior to hearing the Priest or Deacon proclaim the Gospel. We were baptized priest, prophet, and king in Christ Jesus and we ask to become one with Him each time we say “Amen” when we partake of His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist. For us to contemplate what Jesus was thinking during His earthly ministry is not only possible but should be very natural. Please join me in saying 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory be..., and then repeat 3 times, “Jesus meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto thine”. Now, with *open hearts*, we are ready to begin to think like Jesus.

When the Pharisees were approaching Jesus to try to trip Him up over the question of a man divorcing his wife, what might Jesus have been thinking? He saw their hearts and was terribly sad by how hardened they had become. He heard the deceit in their voices and recalled how different their words sounded from the very first words ever spoken by Adam in the Garden of Eden (Angels are spirits and probably had no need or reason to speak before the creation of man).

Jesus then recalled how Adam named each of the earth’s creatures as they were brought to him. Each of these creatures the Lord formed *out of the ground* and “none proved to be a helper suited to the man.” (Gen.2:20). Jesus remembered putting Adam to sleep and building up Eve from Adam’s own rib (not from the ground like the rest of the creatures, *and even Adam himself*) so that “husband and wife are formed as one flesh...a new entity” (Pastoral Patterns 33). Adam was so happy when he first saw Eve, and Eve Adam! The love in the marriage bond they had for each other was modeled after the Spirit of Love between God the Father and God the Son (Jesus), and a foretaste of the future love in the Sacrament of Christ and His Church (The Roman Missal 1028). In His beautiful mind, Jesus saw all of these connections so clearly because this is what His Father wanted, and that is what He did in the love of the Holy Spirit. It is a love that is unbreakable, a love that transcends time, and a love that *is* God Himself! (1 John 4:16). This is the same bond of love that was given to Adam and Eve and was the only gift that was not diminished (The Roman Missal 1028) after their fall from grace (because it could not be, it is modeled after the love that God has within Himself).

Now men with stone for hearts approach Jesus to ask

Him (their Creator and eternal seat of Wisdom) about a man and woman dissolving this precious union! These Pharisees had closed hearts, full of deceit, and because of that they were incapable of understanding that the marriage bond was so much a foretaste of the love of the Sacrament between Christ and His Church that Jesus was soon to take upon Himself all of humanity’s sins and die so that by conquering sin and death (Hebrews 2:9-11) the marriage bond of love between God and humanity could be restored, and even made better, than it was in the Garden of Eden. (Place yourself in Jesus now and picture the Pharisees approaching to ask the question about divorce. Hear these possible thoughts of His): *O Children of Israel whom I love so dearly, why are your hearts so hard? If you only knew that the bond between husband and wife was modeled after the bond of Love between my Father and I, and you and I, you would never ask how it could be dissolved!* (does this not almost bring tears to your eyes?).

With prayer and *open hearts*, we began this exercise to think more like Jesus. The unbreakable bond of marriage that Jesus defends so strongly, is a foretaste of unity that each Catholic has with Christ in the Holy Eucharist, and it is modeled after the love within the Blessed Trinity itself. In Christ’s peace, may each of us always remain in this eternal union.
