Fourth Sunday of Advent

The gospel of this fourth Sunday of advent invites us to focus on Mary, how she began her preparations for the first Christmas. When she heard from the angel those powerful words: "The Lord is with you," she was deeply disturbed by these words and" asked her-

self what this greeting could mean" (Lk 1:29)? In this text and elsewhere, evangelist Luke presents Mary as a woman of contemplation. When the shepherds came to see the baby lying in the manger, they reported what they had been told by the



angels about the baby. Everyone was astonished. "As for Mary, she treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." (Lk 2:19). When Joseph and Mary took the baby to be presented in the temple, Simeon and Anna had their own news about the baby, " the child's father and mother were wondering at the things that were being said about him" (Lk 2:33). When the 12 year old boy Jesus was found among the teachers in the temple listening to them and asking them questions, his reaction to his worried parents was very surprising. But "his mother stored up all these things in her heart" (Lk 2:51).

The Gospel of Luke invites us to imitate Mary in her attitude of listening to God by pondering in our hearts the real situations of life. The gospel text of today seems to suggest that the best way of preparing ourselves for Christmas is to be like Mary and think about the meaning of "the Lord is with you"—the God — with — us.

Mary asked herself what the greeting of the angel could mean. The pondering leads her to dialogue with the angel, rather than ask for proofs (as Zachariah did in Lk1:18) .And eventually she acknowledges herself as the humble handmaid .(Lk 1:38). Her pondering brought forth humility. This humility enables us to open up ourselves to the loving plan of God.

Mary's humility showed her compassion towards others. The two stories of Mary reaching out to others: to Elizabeth (Lk 1:39-56) and to the wedding party in Cana (Jn 2:1-11) are acts of love. Yet they're not mere humanistic acts of kindness. In both stories she shares the Good News- she introduces Jesus as the Son of God. This is typical when our own reaching out is an overflow of what we think about God. Then we bring God to others.

The Fruits of Door-to-Door Visitation

Our ministry of going out door to door, in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd, is one that is rather unique and has been a point of interest for many. So, as our time at Warren is coming to a close, we'd like to share a little of our experience with you.

When we go out door to door, we're seeking to bring God's love to others. Our mission is not to convert people to our Catholic faith but rather to encourage Catholics to live their faith to the fully. Many Catholics are not registered, maybe not even practicing, so we knock on every door, seeking them out. Our reception here has been rather positive. One door was opened by a Baptist woman who congratulated us on "going out and finding those lost sheep for our Lord" and promised to pray for our ministry. Another door was opened by a parishioner who was thrilled to have the opportunity to share with us the marvels that God has been doing in his life. A Catholic woman who had been away from the Church for a long time was in tears when she was told that the door was always open for her to come back. An elderly couple who had newly moved into the area were happy to receive a bulletin and learn the Mass schedule. A protestant, who was searching for a solid relationship with God, couldn't find it in his own congregation. We were able to share with him about the fullness of Truth in the Catholic faith. One of the most memorable experiences was with a Catholic woman who felt hurt by the Church. Our conversation began through a closed door and ended with her calling her children to come out and meet us and expressing an interest in some of the activities being put on by the Church.

Since we arrived, we knocked on a little more than 300 doors. To share all of the stories with you we'd have to write a book but we wanted to give you a little taste of the ministry we've been engaged in. We are so grateful to Father Cicero to allow us this opportunity to go out and spread God's Word and God's love to our brethren.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as the church at Blessed Sacrament remains closed for ongoing fire restoration. Thanks be to God, no one was hurt in the fire and damage was kept to a minimum. At this point, we expect the church to be closed for about eight weeks. Restoration will include: replacing the ambo (pulpit) and supporting platform, cleaning the organ pipes, washing all building contents and surfaces such as walls, windows, and the ventilation system, cleaning or replacing the mounted sound proofing panels, and painting the interior of the church. Fortunately, insurance will cover these expenses.

The following schedule outlines the time and location of Mass, Adoration, and Confession for the coming weeks including Christmas. As you can see, Mass will be celebrated at St. James, Sts. Cyril & Methodius, and Blessed Sacrament in the Covelli Center Gymnasium on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Throughout the coming weeks, all other Masses will be celebrated at Saints Cyril & Methodius and St. James churches. Let us seize this opportunity to be welcoming and compassionate to our brothers and sisters in Christ who will be joining us from Blessed Sacrament! Please make an extra effort to introduce yourselves and make space for our guests.

In a time like this, sticking together in prayer and a spirit of solidarity is essential. Thank you for the prayers and support you have offered for me and the parishioners of Blessed Sacrament. God is blessing us abundantly in this time. Christmas at Church like Christmas in our pandemic-stricken world may not be the one we had hoped for, but it is the one that God has planned for us, I trust. Perhaps we can relate to Mary and Joseph whose Christmas in Bethlehem was not what they had expected, but was full of grace. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.
