#### Remember St. Isaac Jogues at Christmas

What do you possess that you have not received (1 Cor. 4:7)? St. Paul challenges the Corinthians, and he challenges us today with this question. I am tempted at times to pat myself on the back. God, look at the things I have done for you. I forget that God is the initiator. He has given me everything that I have. He is the one that has sought me out and not vice versa. Anything I do is a response to what he has already given me.

Christmas is a time of giving because we remember the supreme gift that God has given to us, the gift of his Son, "now in flesh appearing" as the carol teaches. We are also remembering that one day he will come and bring us to the Father. Consequently, we look to God as our example, and we give. We give to our families and friends. We give to those who are less fortunate than us.

St. Isaac Jogues is part of your family. In this time of attending to many things it is worthy of a little reminder to help you remember your parish family at Christmas. That is part of our response to God. We give our time (our prayer and our learning about the faith), our talent (giving our expertise or what we are good at), and our treasure (our monetary contributions).

Here is a little update on what your contributions have done. We have had flooding in St. Angela Hall, and earlier in the year, the rain really tested us. You will notice the work to the concrete. There was also work downstairs. The result was with recent rain, there was no water in our hall or in our storage rooms! Hopefully, that full-color flyer that we distributed has demonstrated many other good things occurring here. In other words, we are moving forward because of your generosity.

If you refer to that report, you will see that our Christmas collection totaled \$48,484 last year. Thank you. That is a generous number for a tough year. We appreciate your sacrifice. That was \$6500 below what we budgeted for the Christmas collection. This year we budgeted \$50,000 for the Christmas collection. We are trying to be realistic. What we budget for the offertory tells us how much we can spend, which means we have had to cut back. It is good to stretch for a goal so that more good work can be done. Please remember the collection is not subject to the 7% assessment by the Archdiocese; it all stays with St. Isaac Jogues. (If you are wondering, canon law gives the diocesan bishop the right to impose a moderate tax for the needs of the diocese.)

Many of you are always generous at Christmas. We ask that you continue that generosity, knowing that you are giving to a great cause. Look around you. We need to ensure a solid future for our parish. Our gifts and our continued help accomplish this.

Again, please do not forget St. Isaac Jogues at Christmas and prayerfully consider your donation to the Christmas Offertory collection for 2021.

May the Peace of Christ be with you this Christmas season.

#### The Next Time Someone Sins Against You

I love Fr. Mark Brauer. We spent three years together at Our Lady of Sorrows. Coincidentally, he is now at the parish to which I was assigned when my three years were completed, St. Hugo.

There was a lot of time to get to know the man, and he was the perfect fit for a thirty-six-year-old that left a successful career at Intel to enter seminary and become a priest. Fr. Mark would come into the rectory and seemingly groan from the depths of his being. I would ask: "Did that help?" "Yes." Noted. To me that companionship is one of the benefits that we have lost in the priesthood with one-priest rectories. That is something we are trying to recover with Families of Parishes.

We ate together almost every Monday and Tuesday. Of course, we would unpack the day. I remember almost none of the conversations except this one. I was complaining about something a parishioner had done. "You should talk to him." I began immediately stating how that was impossible. I could not do it. I very eloquently listed numerous excuses as Fr. Mark listened patiently. "That's not what Jesus said to do." I am surprised I did not drop my fork. He said it but it was one of those funny moments that I was alone in the presence of the Holy Spirit and somehow it was Fr. Mark's voice that I heard.

He of course was referring to Matthew 18:15-17:

"If your brother sins [against you], go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, so that 'every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church. If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector."

I have been guilty too long of getting that process all backwards.

I remember one time that I screwed up. I knew it the moment the words came out of my mouth. Fr. Mark and I were driving back together, so I began prepping. On Monday morning Kevin Hammer showed up in my office. He asked to speak with me, and his words were to the point. "Father, you were out of line on Saturday." I knew it. He knew it. It was an awkward conversation; we didn't hug as best friends at the end. I'm not sure the wound was completely healed as he walked out the door, but God's grace had now stepped into the situation. I am grateful because Kevin did not go to Fr. Mark with the problem. He didn't write the archbishop. He came to me and honored my dignity as a fellow fallen Christian who is also needing the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. I learned something that day.

We are at the beginning of a new year. Someone is going to sin against you. It might happen before you finish reading this. We cannot control that. What we do with the hurt or anger is completely ours to decide. As an aside, it is the virtue of meekness that tempers our anger when there has been an injustice. Fortitude gives us the courage to take the next step, and Jesus tells us clearly what it is that we need to do. I offer this suggestion to you for 2022.

#### **Sign Changer**







It's almost universal knowledge that Christmas is officially celebrated on December 25th, the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord. While some may be thankful that the hustle and bustle of planning dinners and thoughtful gifts are over, the Christmas season is only just beginning on the 25th. While the most popular carol of all suggests just twelve days, it's a topic of hot debate among Catholics. When does Christmas actually end?

It turns out that the answer to when Christmas officially ends is not so simple because there are technically three separate Christmas "seasons": the Christmas octave, the liturgical Christmas season, and the traditional Christmastide season that concludes with Candlemas.

#### **The Christmas Octave**

An octave is an eight-day period within the Church in which Easter or Christmas is celebrated that includes the actual feast day. The eighth day is considered the "octave day," and days in between are "within" the octave. Each day of the octave is considered to be an actual day of the feast and is celebrated as such.

Therefore, the Octave of Christmas begins Christmas Day on December 25th and extends until the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the January 1st.

#### The Liturgical Christmas Season

The liturgical Christmas season is situated after the Advent season and before the beginning of Ordinary time. It begins with the Christmas Eve vigil Masses and concludes with Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, this year on January 9th.

#### Christmastide

In the older tradition kept in the liturgical year of Extraordinary Form of Mass, the whole "Christmastide" season lasts for forty days (corresponding to the forty days of lent) that concludes with Candlemas on February 2nd, also known as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Presentation of the Lord. When someone asks you when Christmas ends, ask them: Do you mean the Christmas octave, the liturgical Christmas season, or Christmastide?
