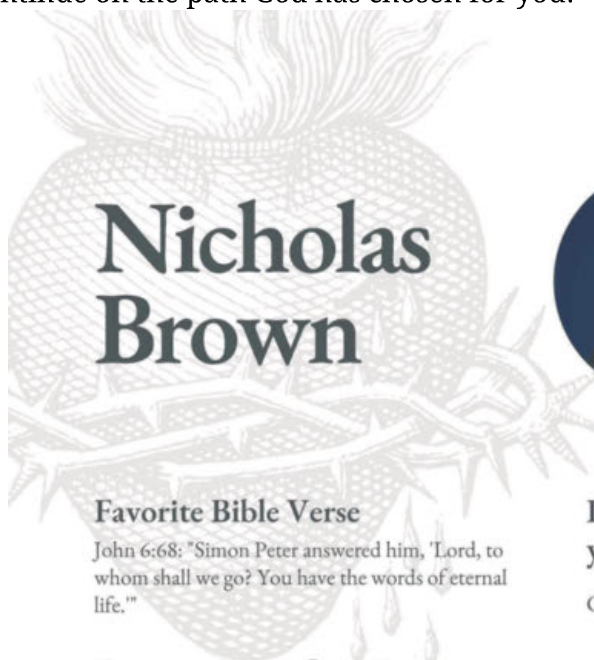

December 14, 2021 7:30 pm St. Angela's Hall

Present: Father David Cybulski, Eileen Rosinski, Pat Dery, Marietta Lavis, Deacon Jim Berch, Mary Kay Sobota, John Champagne, Dan Mahalak, Kathi Williams and Amy Sledz

President Eileen Rosinski called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Father David opened the meeting with a scripture reading.

Approval of minutes from November 23, 2021 meeting were motioned, seconded and approved with corrections.

Father David has spoken with Jacqueline Sommers in regards to her lack of attending meetings of parish council.

Jacqueline voiced some concerns which council will take under advisement. At this time Jacqueline feels her time and talents are better used elsewhere. We thank Jacqueline for her service to parish council.

Other items discussed were weekly participation of families at Mass, the Torch, the goal of community; not school vs. parish, commitment of Evangelization by all the parish members.

Commission Updates:

Worship: Deacon Jim reported that Phil, who was the head usher at 4 pm Mass has passed away. We are in need of ushers at all the Masses. We need at least 6 ushers per Mass. We are also in need of Sacristans for week day and weekend Masses. Lectors and singers are also needed. An article will go in the Torch with a "job description" for these positions. Personally asking parishioners to take one of these positions will also be done.

Christian Service: Kathi Williams reported all the tags on the given tree have been taken. Any extra gift cards received will be given to MCWARM and MCREST. Discussion on having a blood drive at St. Isaac Jogues is being discussed.

Stewardship: Pat Dery reported CSA is at 86% of goal. There was great turn out of athletes at the Community Mass (9:30 am) December 12th. The pancake breakfast was well attended. Our Men's Club helped the Goodfellows raise money on December 4th; they raised almost \$12,000. The PTA raised \$1,300 with their wreath sale. The PTA is looking for someone to assist with the Garden Club. We will be passing out the Dynamic Catholic books at all the Christmas Masses. John Poggiolo reported that there will be 2-3 sports tournaments over the Christmas break. A basketball playoff game is being worked on. Pat Dery will be chairing the Capital Campaign committee. She, Audrey, and Father David have met to discuss plans and the committee will start in January.

We are arranging to have pictures taken of all committees/commissions members in January a tentative date was set but needed to be changed. Pat will email council when the new date is set.

MCREST and McWarm were discussed. We will collaborate with Our Lady Hope January 30 to February 6th to host 29 men. We are also collaborating with St. Margaret on the McWarm program.

Evangelization: No report

Communication Committee: Mary Kay Sobota reported that a survey on how you receive parish information and how you would like to receive it was done at all the Masses. They are in the process of tabulating the results.

Constant contact is also being set up.

Finance Council: Dan Mahalak reported that the amount spent on the concrete and asphalt work is \$128,000 to date. We have about \$375,000 in old bills from the archdiocese all dating back to mid-2019 or earlier. Invoices have been paid timely since that point. This is an addition to the outstanding loan which is on a 10 year repayment plan. The current balance of this loan is \$126,000. For the year we are over budget on Capital expenses. We needed to do concrete work in St. Angela hall to correct water issues, also replace a sump pump and other items to remedy water in the basement area. We need to have a good Christmas collection to keep our budget above the profit line. The capital campaign will be looking at a number of items; cost of the parking, eliminate the debt and new office space. John Champagne will fix the pipe into the sump but there are tree roots that are going into the sump pump area. Major fix will need to be done in the spring.

MCREST HELP NEEDED

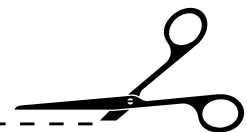
Covid touches everything – even MCREST. AGAIN

Our Lady of Hope (OLOH) is hosting MCREST January 30, 2022 to February 6, 2022. We, at St. Isaac Jogues, have been asked to help with the program. Our Lady of Hope wished to be able to house the men on their church premises, but with the spike of Covid and the close interaction our guests and volunteers would have, OLOH have decided to cancel those plans. So, the game plan now is to implement what they did in 2021; sponsor them in the hotel. The hotel cost for a week is \$3,800.00. OLOH will be supplying the guests with a cold breakfast, a lunch, and dinner to take with them back to the hotel after they check in each night at the MCREST office.

Now the needs have somewhat shifted. OLOH needs volunteers for:

- **Meals donated to the program.** You can cook the meal at home and bring it to the parish office at Our Lady of Hope by 2pm on your given day. At that point they have a team of volunteers that will package a breakfast, lunch and dinner and it will be delivered to our guests via the MCREST staff.
- **Also needed are Drivers:** 4p-5:30p to take the guests from MCREST office to the hotel (it is local, and they will give drivers that information)
- **Additionally,** they need help in defraying the cost of providing food, and services that week. The cost of a breakfast and lunch is \$150.00 The cost of a dinner is \$250.00. Bus tickets run about \$840.00 for the week.

Our Lady of Hope’s cost for the program for a week will be \$7440.00. January 16, 2022 — Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request.

In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine.



Our Lord didn't have to include those servants in order to perform this miracle — He chose to. And today, 2,000 plus years later, He still chooses to include us in the performance of His miracles through our cooperation with Him in using the gifts and talents He has given us. What a privilege!

Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother: let's examine our lives this week to see if we really are "doing whatever He tells us," cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish.

A Request of the Tekakwithan Society

By now, most of you have received your latest batch of offertory envelopes. If not, you can contact the office and if possible, we will mail you a packet. Some of you may be wondering why we are still enclosing an envelope for our Tekakwithan Society. You may recall in our October 17th Torch, Father David's article addressed a request of our Society. This is an excerpt: *This came to mind during a conversation this morning. As pastor I rely on commissions and councils for advice in making decisions (and if you have a desire to be on the Christian Service Commission, Evangelization Committee, Stewardship Commission, or Worship Commission, let me know). I was brought a concern of the Tekakwithan Society. Monthly meetings are held downstairs in the evening because the school utilizes the hall during the day. The average age of members is going up. The desire to come here in cold, snowy, dark weather and climb down stairs has waned. The request was to forgo the monthly meeting and throw support behind the outreach efforts of the Christian Service and Stewardship Commissions. I was assured the first responder meals, the assistance that we gave to Fr. Tom Merkel and Fr. Jeremiah Hahn, the annual Christmas party, and spring dinner will continue. It was promised to me that the presence of the Council of Catholic Women and the Christian Mothers would remain strong.* Thus the reason for the continued envelopes in January each year. While our Tekakwithan Society will be joining forces with Christian Service, this collection under the society will continue to be used for the aforementioned church's needs and outreach. GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.



Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.



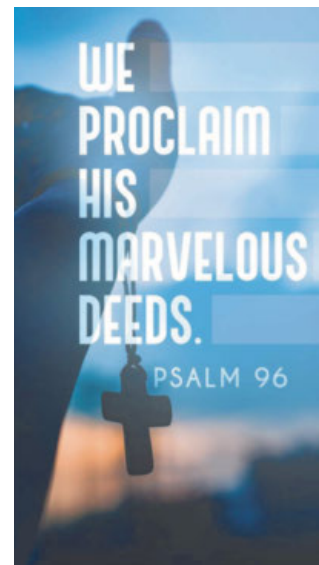
