

He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man. - Lk 2:51-52

There is so much to celebrate this weekend: obviously, Christmas as we gather to recognize the birth of Our Savior; and then on Sunday we gather again to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

With these great feasts, there is something beautiful to recognize: the Lord could have come in so many ways. He could have come with fire, riding the clouds in glory. He could have come with an army of angels to avenge the sins of humanity. But He did not.

Instead, He came in simplicity and humility. He came in a hidden and obscure way. And He came in



a way that each of us can imitate and embrace: Jesus came as a child, He came in a family just like ours. He came to sanctify our lives by entering into our very existence in a deep and profound way.

This is what we celebrate this weekend, and it should give us a great and profound sense of joy that God's love is here, present, and entering into our lives to bring us to salvation.

However, there is a temptation which we face: we have spent the entire month of December (and maybe even longer!) preparing our hearts and our homes for the celebration of Christmas, making them perfect for all the guests we are expecting to visit over these days.

But Jesus does not want to just be in the perfect and serene moments of our lives. He desires to be in the messy and confusing parts of our lives way more than He desires to be in the serene and perfect moments of our lives.

It is good to remember: Jesus was born in a stable and welcomed into this world by animals; not by doctors, not by kings and princes; by animals. And my guess is, it was somewhat messy and smelly and noisy.

And that is where Jesus wants to meet us: in the messy, in the smelly, in the noisy parts of our lives.

As we celebrate Christmas, as we gather with our families, as we look to the coming of Jesus into the Holy Family; let us not forget that Jesus encounters us best in those moments of chaos; because He brings order out of chaos.

Then, He can truly be Lord of our hearts, our homes, our lives and our world.

LIVE the LITURGY

It was the best of times and it was the worst of times. Our families can bring out the best and the worst in us. This is true of our families origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our church, our society, and the like. In all of our family experiences, what stands out as our most challenging memory? Everything human can be found on the pages of family life. But there is also a Divine story to be discovered as well. When life gets difficult and perplexing, today's Feast of the Holy Family stands to remind us that it is not just by human effort that we tread treacherous waters. We have to remember and learn from the Divine effort, too. We need this perspective if our love lessons are going to be learned completely and well. We are all works in progress and we all come from homes that are broken by imperfection. In whatever life brings us and in whatever family we find ourselves, may the promptings we feel toward faith and hope lead us to greater love.

FAMILY FAITH MOMENTS

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The Church presents the Holy Family to us as a model for our own family life. We don't have to be a "perfect family," but we remember that our family life is sacred and blessed by the Holy Family with graces. In today's Gospel, we hear of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus traveling to Jerusalem for the Feast of Passover when Jesus was twelve years old. But when it was over, Jesus remained behind without His parents knowing and they searched for three days before finding Him.

Passing along the traditions of the Church to the next generation: Discuss what you think Jesus' life was like growing up. What was the village of Nazareth, the city of Jerusalem like? How did Mary and Joseph feel when Jesus was missing? What did the Holy Family talk about, what were some of the difficulties they may have faced? Share stories about your own lives. Were you ever lost? What was life like when your parents and grandparents were growing up? What are some special qualities of your family? What traditions have you kept in your family?

ST. PETER MASS SCHEDULE

FINANCIAL NEWS

A GREAT WAY TO SUPPORT ST. PETER PARISH and ST. PETER SCHOOL

The IRS has announced that for the 2021 tax year they WILL continue their program for charitable deductions for individual taxpayers that do not itemize their deductions on their 2021 TAX RETURN. The individual taxpayer can claim a deduction of up to \$300 (\$600 for couples) for gifts of cash made to a public charity such as St. Peter School Scholarship Fund or St. Peter Parish. The deduction is ONLY for gifts of cash made in the calendar year 2021.

ANOTHER WAY TO GIVE: If you are age 70 ½ or older, you can make gifts directly to Saint Peter Parish or Saint Peter School Scholarship Fund from individual retirement accounts (IRAs). These gifts are called qualified charitable distributions (QCDs). Why is a QCD such a good giving option? Giving directly from your IRA - rather than withdrawing these funds - won't increase your adjusted gross income or subject your Social Security income to more taxes. Such gifts can count toward all or part of your annual required minimum distribution (RMD). For those turning 70 ½ this year, the minimum age for taking RMDs has increased to 72. QCD gifts can be especially advantageous for those who do not expect to itemize their deductions and for those whose deductions are limited. You may make QCD gifts in any amount up to \$100,000 per person per year, or \$200,000 for a couple with separate IRAs.

A Synod on Synodality? Sounds strange, doesn't it? Yet this is what the Holy Father has called. In its simplest form, synodality represents a collaborative approach by all the people of God to address a particular issue for which the Holy Father seeks input. For this synod, he wants to hear from everyone on how the whole Church (not only the Bishops and Priests) can journey together in bringing the Gospel message to the world. To address this "synodal" approach, he has called for all Dioceses in the world to hold local consultative meetings to discuss this topic. Currently, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is targeting January and February 2022 for these meetings. Please prayerfully consider participating in your local deanery meeting. 


