

Whew, a new year has dawned! After the chaos that was 2020, and with 2021 still feeling the major impact of that chaos, we gather to start the New Year with a prayer and a hope that 2022 will be smooth and serene.

But we also know that there are many changes ahead for how we administer our parishes. The good news is that we have all adapted to a radically different situation in our world due to the impact of the Coronavirus, so we know that we can face all kinds of turmoil with confidence.

As was announced in early December, our current pastoral region of Holy

Cross, Our Lady of the Rosary and St. Peter, will be joined into a new parish family with St. Christopher, Vandalia, and St. John the Baptist, Tipp City. This new family of parishes takes effect as of July 1, 2022.

With this new arrangement, the start of the new year brings the start of many stages of planning to prepare for this new reality. As I am writing this in early December, I am still praying and discerning over what all those steps will be.

However, I am convinced of one thing: it will be crazy! It will be crazy for you, our parishioners, as we potentially adapt to new Mass schedules and new priest presiders. It will be crazy for our staff as we grow into a larger and more complex arrangement. It will certainly be crazy for our Priests and Deacons as we adapt to celebrating Mass in five different locations on a regular basis, plus the addition of multiple office locations, nursing homes, hospitals, funeral parlors, etc. Our world is expanding greatly!

Talking with a brother Priest, our new parish family will encompass at least three Wal-Mart stores, four Kroger stores, five public school districts; all spread over the parts of three counties and multiple other local public jurisdictions.

Like I said: it is going to be crazy! Knowing this, we can embrace the crazy and engage with it. Or we can let it control us and drive us crazy!

As we embrace it, as we recognize that there will be things we are doing now that we will no longer be able to do; but that there will also be things we are introducing now that we will do more of in the future; we can control the crazy and lead through the crazy into a new reality on the other side.

How long it will take to get there is a great question; but the more we embrace it with humility, the more we lay down our own personal agendas (which includes me, too!), the greater and quicker the transformation will be!

And the more we pace this crazy and change with prayer, the more powerful and profound this new reality will be!

Human beings easily get bored. Life's routines can become so predictable that there is often little time for excitement or freshness. Today is all about the new and the wonderful. In celebrating the beauty and simplicity of the Epiphany, we see in tangible ways God's creative, redemptive, and restorative power. This refreshment and revitalization is offered not only to a select few but to everyone throughout the world. There is nothing routine or static about God. Surprises, wonders, miracles, opportunities, healings, and joy without measure are available to those who believe. There are never any endings, just beginnings. And, when darkness, boredom, and gloom seem to be the order of the day, a bright new light now shines pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.

FAMILY FAITH MOMENTS

This Sunday, we celebrate The Epiphany of the Lord. Three Wise Men from faraway countries saw the new star in the sky and followed it to find the new king and Savior of the world. They were very rich and had clothes of the finest fabrics. People could see that they were powerful and important. The star led them to Bethlehem and to the baby Jesus. Jesus was poor, born in a stable. His clothes were plain and He wore no crown. Nobody could tell by looking at Him that He was an important baby and a powerful king.
