




3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

GÍO

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me... He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, and to let the oppressed go free.

LUKE 4:18



With this weekend, we dive deeper into 'Ordinary Time' until the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday on March 2. (Easter is April 17 this year, FYI). With Ordinary Time, we start the cycle of readings from the Gospel of Luke, and will follow along via his narrative of the life and ministry of Jesus throughout much of the rest of the year. As such, I wanted to take this space to give a few thoughts about Luke's Gospel and what he highlights as he tells the story of Jesus.

To begin, each of the four Gospels is represented by an image or icon: St. Matthew by an angel; St. Mark by a lion; St. John by an eagle; and St. Luke by an ox. These icons come from the revelations in the Book of Daniel and each represent a key characteristic of the Gospel, a particular aspect of the ministry of Jesus that is highlighted in this particular Gospel.

For St. Luke, the image of the ox represents the Temple and the importance of the Temple in Jerusalem, specifically the importance of sacrifice in the Temple. Throughout the Gospel, Jesus is looking towards Jerusalem and to what awaits Him when He gets there. He knows the altar of the Cross awaits, yet He does not shy away from His impending sacrifice. Rather, He embraces it and chooses to move forward for our freedom.

Additionally, St. Luke's account of the Gospel highlights the role women play in the life of Jesus. It is in Luke's narrative that we see a number of women accompanying Jesus as He travels through Galilee and towards Jerusalem. They provide for Him from their means and just walk with Him as He walks with them.

The Holy Spirit also plays a central role throughout the Gospel, too. He is prompting Jesus to move from one place to another and Jesus is frequently stepping aside to go into prayer to stay connected with the Spirit as well.

But perhaps best of all, we can surmise that Luke was a non-Palestinian writing for a non-Palestinian audience, which includes us. He isn't so much concerned with the geography of the place, rather than the 'why?' of the place and the story. Luke's perspective gives us a very approachable entrance into the story of Jesus, allowing us to be there, in a way, so that we can be there with Him.

As we enter into this story, anew, this weekend, may the Spirit of the Lord be upon us throughout this journey.

LIVE the LITURGY

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that He is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.


FAMILY FAITH MOMENTS

On January 28, the Church celebrates the Feast Day of St. Thomas Aquinas. Thomas was from a wealthy family; but he chose to join the Dominicans, an order whose friars took a vow of poverty. Thomas studied, taught, and wrote. He was considered a brilliant man, and had extraordinary powers of concentration. He reportedly never forgot anything he read. But Thomas was very humble and acknowledged that all his gifts came from God. Thomas was an advisor to Kings, a writer of masterpieces, a counselor to Popes, and a teacher of classics; but most of all, Thomas was a servant of God.

St. Thomas was declared Patron Saint of Catholic Schools. Pray to St. Thomas to help you in your studies. St. Thomas treated everyone with patience and kindness. During his life, he was never known to lose his temper or speak sarcastically about another person. Try to be like St. Thomas in patience and kindness. List all the times that you have shown kindness to other people in the last three days. Consider several acts of kindness that you could put into action in the next three days.






