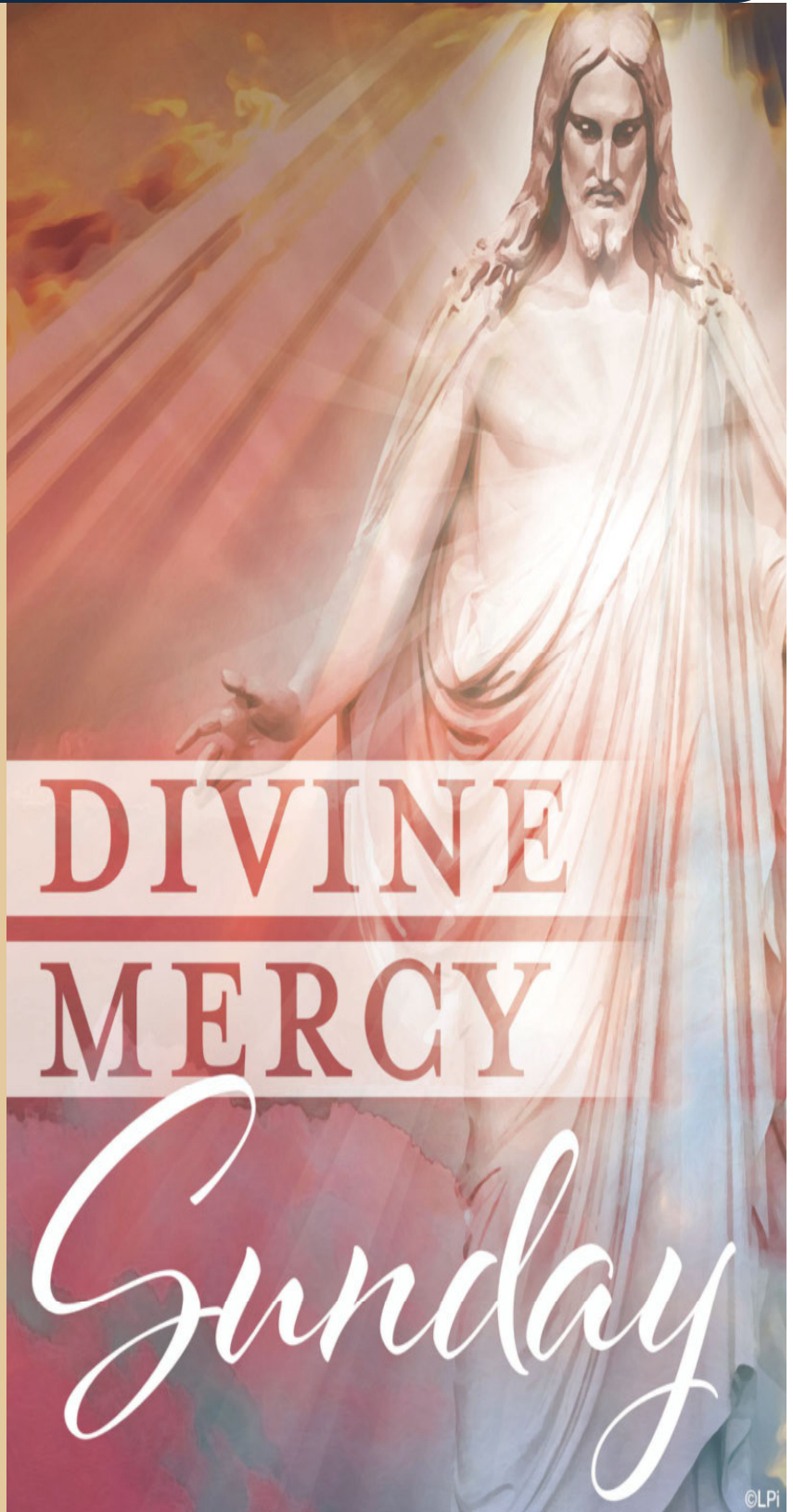

Recently, I heard a story, a parable really, that explained the Feast of Divine Mercy so well. It follows: Two men were sitting on a bridge, looking at the icy river a few feet below them. One man looks to the other and says, 'I'm going to jump in that icy river to save you.' And so he does, he jumps in the river below.

From all accounts, that man would be considered a little crazy, and perhaps more than a little crazy. The second man, sitting next to him on the bridge, did not need saving and was in the same situation as the initial person. So why did he have to jump?

As this story was being explained, I quickly got the point: This is what the modern world sees when it looks at the person of Jesus Christ and what we celebrated over Holy Week. Instead of seeing our need for a savior, humanity sees itself as just fine; at most, sitting next to Jesus on the bridge of life. But there is not an obvious need for a savior. We have long since stopped feeling the effects and the impact of original sin in our lives and we have moved on.



Let's revisit that story, but with a twist: The first man says to the second, I'm going to jump in the river to save you; at which point the pillar upon which the second is sitting collapses and falls; dropping the second into the icy river far below. So the first, heroically, jumps in after to pull him to shore. But in the process, he himself drowns. Giving his life for his friend next to him on the bridge.

By all accounts, this man would be considered a hero, giving his life for his friend.

This is what Jesus does in our life, and this is what we celebrate today with the Feast of Divine Mercy; recapping not just Holy Week, but the whole of the mystery of what Jesus came to do for us and in us.

At the heart of this feast is the reminder that we need a savior. Humanity is broken, broken by Original Sin; broken by our own desires to sin; broken by pride and ego and a desire to conquer the other. And as much as we want to push these afflictions off into the past, we only have to look at the brokenness of our own lives (mine included!) to recognize that I am not actually sitting on that bridge next to Jesus; I really am sinking into the icy depths of the river below.

This reflection is not meant as a guilt trip; but rather as a reflection on the great gift that Jesus has won for us in bringing us to salvation; restoring us to the place God desired for us from the beginning: to be His beloved sons and daughters.

As we continue to bask in the glory of the newly lit Easter Candle and reflect on the empty tomb, let us never forget the mystery and power of the Lord's saving work; remembering that He dives deep into our human experience to lift us back to life again.

LIVE *the* LITURGY

Life is about to get very interesting for the disciples. Finding themselves questioning what happened to Jesus and whether He actually was raised from the dead, they are afraid and uncertain. In the midst of this fear, questioning, and uncertainty, Jesus decides to surprise them with a visit! This visit, complete with the gift of peace, fills the disciples with great excitement and joy. But their detailed testimony is not enough to convince their absent friend Thomas. He wants to see for himself. We struggle with belief as well. It is hard for some to give themselves over to the testimony of another. We want to see the resurrected Christ in person. God, through the gift of eyes of faith, gives us the ability to do precisely that: when we witness the healing that comes from forgiveness, the beauty that flows from love, the wonder of creation, the new life that comes after we fall, and the unique soul that lives behind each person's life. Christ is risen. Life will get very interesting for us, too, when we stop unbelieving and believe!

FAMILY FAITH MOMENTS

Today, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. The message of The Divine Mercy is that God loves us – all of us and He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins. When we call upon Him with trust, we receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who wrote a diary recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. St. Pope John Paul II lived and taught the message of Divine Mercy, describing it as the answer to the world's problems.


Discuss the ABC's of the Divine Mercy message as a family. A – ask for God's Mercy; approach Him in prayer repenting our sins and asking for His mercy upon us and the whole world. B – be merciful; God wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us. C – completely trust in Jesus; the more we trust in Jesus, the more graces we will receive.



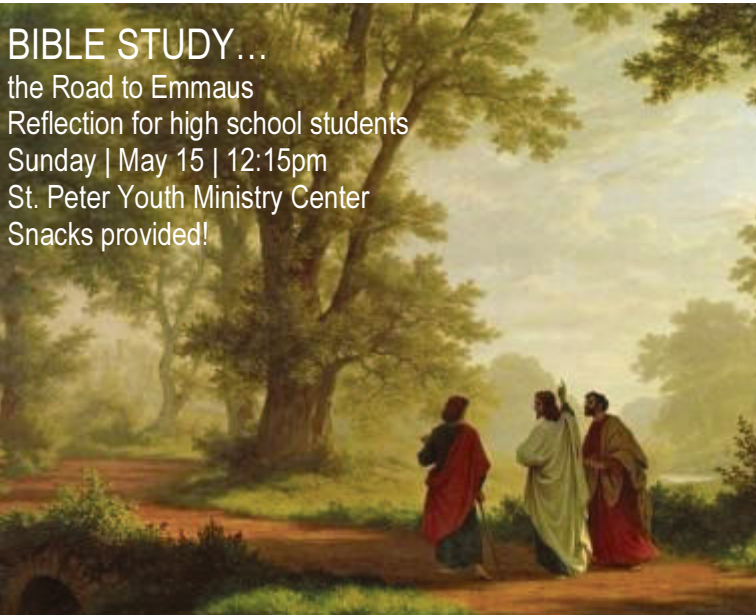

Tribute to a St. Vincent de Paul Vincentian

We would like to share with you, our generous St. Vincent de Paul supporters, a beautiful testimony to the work our Vincentians do. A neighbor who lives alone in Huber Heights became paralyzed in over half of her body just before Christmas 2021. Then she contracted COVID, which resulted in a brain bleed. Our neighbor, a home health care worker before her stroke, was out of work and unable to pay her rent. Her mom moved in with her to take care of her. In March 2022, mom called the St. Peter St. Vincent Help Desk pleading for assistance—a rent eviction hearing was scheduled for the next day. Vincentian Jennifer went into action, talked with the neighbor's mom, submitted an emergency application to Miami Valley Community Action Partnership and followed through with telephone calls. The next morning, the head of the Legal Clinic called to inform mom that he had convinced the judge that the rent arrears was being paid plus three months future rent. The Court Order for eviction was not issued that day.

The note, from the daughter's mom, to the Conference reads: *Thank you so very much. One day of your volunteer's life not only played a huge part of a miracle but you helped restore my faith in people. Most importantly, not your goal, but you helped my daughter find real hope in God, life and people. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.*



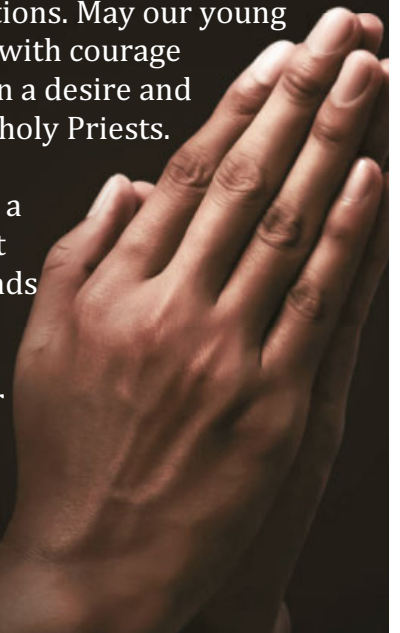


PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL
