A Message from the Pastor

Do I give God what I am living for?

And you thought loving God with your whole heart, your whole soul, your whole strength, your whole mind, and your neighbor as yourself was enough! It is. Yet, our intent is important.

Today we hear two stories about widows who give from their need, simply because God gave to them. But there is always meaning for us.

Elijah, the great prophet, has called upon the people to repent of their idolatry and evil, but they won't. So God sends a drought upon the land. Even Elijah struggles through the drought when God sends him out of the community to a poor widow who has nothing. Widows had no source of support, physical or emotional. Their sole source of support is God. This widow is on her very last. It is to her, however, that Elijah is sent.

Elijah is being tested too. Sent to an outsider widow on her last leg, Elijah instructs her to give him a cake. He professes that the means will last until the end of the drought. She trusts the prophet and believes in his God. Feeding the prophet first and ultimately inviting him into her life, both live through the drought and gain life.

In the Gospel, the faithful are entering the temple and following the law, putting their donations in the treasury. Jesus acknowledges that, but points out the next important step when the widow comes in and leaves a pittance. It's nothing but Jesus points her out, "She has given more than all the rest." The amount wasn't important; her situation was. Like our first story, she gave what she needed for herself.

God isn't worried about the money. God wants us. He demands our lives, our very essence, what we depend on, what we live on. Do we give God what's left over after we've taken care of everything else? Or do we give God what we are living for? Our giving to God is just giving back what is already His! The least we can do is offer it first, offer the best of us.

The gift of our faith, the gift of our hearts is what we need to do. To gift our hearts is when we give our interests and desires, our accomplishments and purposes. In essence, we should make our purpose God's purpose and we should make God's purpose our purpose. Maybe even better, everything we have, all that we are is from God. Put God first. Give back in God's way. Give forward in God's way. Give first, last and always in God's way.

God's way? Through your neighbor. Take care of your family. Give all and so much more will come. We can never "out generous" God. Simply, love God and your neighbor. You will always have more; you will never run out! Give God what you are living for.

Becoming CatholicRCIA

If you have not had the opportunity to receive all the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) and would like to remedy the situation or if you have pertinent questions about your faith, contact the Faith Formation Office (549-1818) to discuss your concerns.

Adults, and children who have reached the age of reason (usually age 7), who are not baptized, prepare to enter the Catholic Church through a process known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), which can easily be accommodated to children.

RCIA gathers regularly and tailors the process to the needs of the individual. Adults who have been baptized in another Christian tradition and who are preparing to become Catholic follow a similar process adapted to their own particular circumstances.




