A Message from the Pastor



We begin the new Church year with this First Sunday of Advent. The end of the last year readings complement our new year start. "Advent" comes from the Latin

word "advenio," which means "the coming." The last week will focus on the anticipation of the physical coming of the Messiah -- Christmas. There is a second "coming" understood to be Jesus' coming into our personal existence, our acceptance and sharing. The third, which we focus on this weekend, is the second coming or the ever being ready for the coming of Jesus.

Many are scared when thinking about the end times; others just don't even think about it. As Christians, we profess Christ's life, suffering, death and resurrection. Our desire for his coming into our lives takes us through the suffering and death but leads us to the Resurrection and the preparedness for the second coming.

The prophet Jeremiah, who lived in exile with his people in a challenging time, is none-the-less full of hope and joy. His faith led him to expect God to renew His promise of love and care for His people. We Christians know that He did in Jesus Christ. We, therefore, can look at the "mess" that always seems to surround us and see the love of God at work. We can see the glory of God, the compassion of God, shining through the darkness (Out of the darkness comes a New Light).

The Letter to the Thessalonians challenges us to always be prepared for the end and to focus on increasing and to abound in love for one another. Our goal is to do God's Will, and the more we live in this love, the more joy and contentment we show.

The Gospel calls on us to keep vigilant! Don't get caught up in the signs and when the end is coming. Rather, live as if "Now is the time. Pay attention. Live well always."

As we begin Advent, let us ask our loving God to assist us in our desire and attraction to Him. Purify our love that we might radiate that Divine Love in the love we share with others. He is coming. May we rejoice and return that love through all we encounter.

Purchasing Gift Cards


An order form for holiday gift cards was included as an insert in the November 21 bulletin. The deadline for submitting orders is December 17.






