
Anointing of the Sick: Anyone who is seriously ill is invited to contact the rectory to request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion.

A Message from the Pastor



Merry Christmas!

Fresh off the Feast of the Incarnation and Nativity of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, we are celebrating the Holy Family of Jesus,

Mary and Joseph. The timing this year posits the importance of the Holy Family in the theology of God's coming into our world as one like us: born like us with time in the womb, formation and development. This gives meaning to all of these in our own lives.

Be sure to note the inference to ("The Holy Family") the Trinity. Don't be shy about glimpsing the three days Jesus spent in the tomb as already integral to this story.

Our first reading today calls on us to embrace the story of Hannah who prayed diligently for a child. Even the prophet knew of her ardent desire and request of God. The most important thing in Hannah's life was to have and nurture a child. So great was Hannah's devotion to God that when she weaned the child, she gave him back to God for service with the prophet.

Hold that thought as we look at the Gospel. Joseph and Mary honored the rituals and went to Jerusalem for Passover. When the child was twelve, he finds his place in the temple engaged with the church leaders. Note he is "lost" for three days ("Father, Son, Spirit;" "Jesus, Mary, Joseph"). For Mary, this may be a foreshadowing of the sorrow and anxiety of three days in the tomb.

Jesus very naturally says -- Where did you expect me to be? -- Serving the Father. However, he obediently goes back with his parents and lives and grows with them.

Our family life is central to God's Way. It takes work on each individual's part. Family is integral to our development and ultimately our faith. Samuel, from the strength of his family, went to serve the Lord by serving the poor, the needy, us. Isn't our path the same?

Becoming CatholicRCIA

If you have not had the opportunity to receive all the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) and would like to remedy the situation or if you have pertinent questions about your faith, contact the Faith Formation Office (549-1818) to discuss your concerns.

Adults, and children who have reached the age of reason (usually age 7), who are not baptized, prepare to enter the Catholic Church through a process known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), which can easily be accommodated to children. RCIA gathers regularly and tailors the process to the needs of the individual. Adults who have been baptized in another Christian tradition and who are preparing to become Catholic follow a similar process adapted to their own particular circumstances.




