A Message from the Pastor



Merry Epiphany? Blessed Epiphany? Happy Epiphany?

Nothing flows too smoothly, does it? Many people call this "Little

Christmas." And the traditional date of the 6th of January was the 12th Day of Christmas. The end of the giving? So why do we elevate this feast?

Today's feast is actually considered as one with the Nativity. It is a multi-day celebration, a united recognition of the Incarnation -- God becomes man. God takes on our human form as foretold by the people of Israel. Today's aspect is that Jesus came for all people.

Recall the last Sunday before Advent. It was the Feast of Jesus Christ the King of the Universe. The Feast of the Epiphany is the precursor to Christ the King. Wise men, Magi, kings or lords from foreign lands, non-believers, (the Jews would have called them pagans) came looking for the new, promised King of the Jews. They knew more than the reigning king of the Jews.

These wise men knew as much as (if not more than) the leaders and scholars of the Church and the Law of the Israelites. The Magi had not only heard of the precepts of Israel, they were able to discern a time frame and read the omens. They followed the star.

The Magi brought gifts appropriate for a king, a priest, and with aids to an appropriate transition through death. The kings are then gifted by the God of Israel to understand dreams (Don't go back to Herod).

In essence the Magi are called to Jesus the King (still as an infant); given wisdom to interpret history and then given a messenger to guide them home and to protect the Child. The Church tells us that the Epiphany is the Nativity being given to the whole world, even to non-Jews.

The reality is that Jesus came to be King of the Universe, which includes non-believers. We, the believers, are called to respond in faith.

Can we see the Star, Jesus Christ, guiding us through our world? Do we honor Jesus as the Son of God, the King of the Universe as King, Priest, Conqueror of Death? Do we listen to the prophetic "Word" of God and care for the Christ? Do we protect Jesus, beginning in our prayer? Do we offer God to all by our life?

Maybe the best accolade is **Merry Christmas!**

Becoming CatholicRCIA

If you have not had the opportunity to receive all the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) and would like to remedy the situation or if you have pertinent questions about your faith, contact the Faith Formation Office (549-1818) to discuss your concerns.

Adults, and children who have reached the age of reason (usually age 7), who are not baptized, prepare to enter the Catholic Church through a process known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), which can easily be accommodated to children.

RCIA gathers regularly and tailors the process to the needs of the individual. Adults who have been baptized in another Christian tradition and who are preparing to become Catholic follow a similar process adapted to their own particular circumstances.






