In a mammoth effort to renew the Catholic Church worldwide, a Synod of Bishops was opened by Pope Francis in Rome, Italy on October 10, 2021. The opening will be followed by local Synods in **ALL DIOCESES** across the world. After two years of prayer, preparation and discernment, Bishops will be assembling in Rome, Italy in October 2023 to complete the Synod.

The theme chosen by Pope Francis is: "For a synodal church: communion, participation and mission."

Through this process, the Church invites Catholics to participate in missionary evangelization. Pope Francis explains that the process is intended for all people of God to take on the responsibility of the Church's mission.

Bishop Mike in his letter to the faithful, which you received a few weeks ago states, "It is more necessary that we travel this journey together, as the Holy Father has invited us, knowing that the path, at times will be steep and at other times uneven. In our own Road to Renewal, as well as the Universal Synod, listening to one another is the essential act and our surest guide."

Let us continue to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we continue on our diocesan Road to Renewal. Let us support, in prayer, the parishioners within our local cluster: The Church of the Annunciation, Immaculate Conception, St. Joseph in Holland, St. George in West Falls and St. Vincent in Springbrook.

Listening to every Catholic is "the true pastoral conversation of the church. A decision-making process in the church always begins with listening, because only in this way can we understand how and where the Spirit wants to lead the church."
