January 10, 2021 The Baptism of the Lord



A Family Prayer Service

Here is a prayer service for celebrating the Baptism of the Lord, remembering your own baptism.

Materials needed: bowl with water (holy water, provided in bottles at Mass), Bible, family baptismal candles (have each member of the family hold their baptismal candle if possible, if not any candle will work)

Before beginning the prayer service, select one of these readings from the New Testament: Romans 6:3-5, Galatians 3:26-28, or Ephesians 4:1-6. Have a Bible open to the selected passage.

Set the Holy water on a table. Have each person light their baptismal candle and stand around the Holy Water. Select a reader and a leader for the following prayer.

Leader: (begin with the sign of the cross)

Today is the day that we remember Jesus' baptism and the revelation of the Holy Trinity in which each of us were baptized. Through baptism we celebrate the gift of becoming a Disciple of Jesus, where we are welcomed as a Christian by our family, and by the Church. Today we will again sign you with the cross, to remember that you were baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Let us listen to the words of the Scriptures.

Reader: A reading from [name of book].

(Reader reads the selected passage.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Leader: In Baptism we have been filled with the light of Christ. May we walk always as children of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in our hearts. May we live each day knowing our true identity as beloved children of God. And when the Lord comes, may we go out to meet him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom to live with him forever and ever.

All: Amen.

Invite the group to make the Sign of the Cross on the celebrant's forehead; then invite everyone to sign their own foreheads with holy water. Offer hugs all around and celebrate with a special meal or treat. (adapted from Loyola Press/Catholicresources/familyholidays)

Consider this...What are we preparing for?



John the Baptist had a very clear purpose, to prepare people for the coming of Jesus. He accomplished this by his austere lifestyle, the call to repentance and by baptizing for the forgiveness of sins. All that John did, his entire life was about preparing for someone else to succeed him. What is our life preparing for?

As we are now beyond the busy part of Christmas and New Year celebrations, we linger in a prolonged celebration of what the incarnation is all about. This is a great time to think, is my life's purpose only about me? My happiness? My satisfaction? My well-being? If John the Baptist's life was all about preparing for Jesus, what is the core purpose of my life really about?

This can be a challenging question. To answer this, I would like to suggest we look at our own baptism, and what the baptismal rite invites us into. When we were brought to the church for baptism, parents share the name of their child being baptized, and their request for baptism. To that the church's response is;

In asking for Baptism for your child, you are undertaking the responsibility of raising them in the faith, so that, keeping God's commandments, they may love the Lord and their neighbor as Christ has taught us.

Then a very important question is asked of parents and Godparents;

Do you clearly understand this responsibility?

Our purpose then is defined by our baptism. As parents we raise our children in the faith, teaching them to love as Jesus loved, both God and neighbor. When we get older our purpose is then to assume that responsibility on ourselves, and the Sacrament of Confirmation reminds us of this and confirms this purpose in our own lives. Our purpose as a Disciple then is to live for God and others. How often are we doing that? When we work out, is it solely for our own benefit, good looks, in shape body? Or is it so that we are healthy to praise God and help others? When we work, is it to accrue money for ourselves to live in luxury? Or are we invited to care for ourselves responsibly and share our resources appropriately with others?

Our perspective in how we approach life has a big impact on our purpose. A simple change in perspective can give a much deeper meaning and sense of purpose. This weekend is a great time to look at our perspective on life and ask ourselves if it aligns with what our faith is all about. John the Baptist had great purpose and meaning in his life. Jesus had great purpose and meaning in his life, and invited us to choose that in our lives too. Do we?

St. Mary's Bells

Many have asked me what is happening with St. Mary's Bells. On giving Tuesday, the projects laid out had the bell project as the final one of the four seeking funding. We are so thankful for those who donated on Giving Tuesday as it was a great success, but we did not receive enough to get to the bell project.

What did happen though is that a large number of people became very interested in helping restore the bells at St. Mary's so they can ring properly once more. Therefore, with finance council's approval, we are having a special campaign to restore the bells. Any donation over \$50 will be acknowledged on a special plaque in the chapel. We will also include all donations on that plaque that helped make our first giving Tuesday a success.

The rough estimate we have received from the bell company is \$20,000 to get them working properly. (I'm writing this on Dec. 30, an official estimate is coming after the New Year, I will share that with you when I receive it) If you can help us, please send your donation to St. Mary's and put Bells in your memo, or feel free to donate online at www.stmaryswormville.org, there is a special Bell fund setup for this project.

If we are blessed to go over needed funding for this project, we will use the excess funds to help offset our very large budget deficit. (More on that at our State of the Parish, see my column for date and time)

If all goes well, our goal is to have the bells ringing for Easter!

Please help – we have a lot to be proud of at St. Mary's and having the bells call our community to prayer and celebration would be an amazing accomplishment and a great way to celebrate St. Mary's love in our community.



Scripture: "Serve him with all your heart and with all your soul." Joshua 22:5


Serving with a Heart Like Jesus: Visit the sick is a Corporal Work of Mercy.

- Your family can live out this Corporal Work of Mercy by sending a get-well card through the mail or drop off to someone nearby. Giving a phone call to check in with those who are not able to go out. This simple act of kindness will share God's love with others by showing that you care.

Highlight of what's happening in our Faith: At your Baptism, the Priest or Deacon poured water over your head as you were being Baptized. At Baptism we become Children of God and members of the Church. Listen to the Gospel reading about Jesus being Baptized the weekend of January 10th.

Faith in Action! As a family talk about the Gospel reading from Mass. Look in your Bible for the reading, **Mark 1:7-11**. Discussion questions to consider. Who Baptized Jesus? What body of water were they standing in? John Baptized with water, what will Jesus Baptize with? What descended out of the heaven over Jesus at his Baptism? 


