Dear Parish Family,

Last week we finished the reflection on the Introductory Rite of the Mass. Now we move to the Liturgy of the Word.

The Church teaches that while the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of the Christian life, the Scriptures lead us to a deeper communion with Jesus in the Eucharist. Pope Bene-

dict XVI wrote, "Thus, "from the two tables of the word of God and the Body of Christ, the Church receives and gives to the faithful the bread of life." Consequently, it must constantly be kept in mind that the word of God, read and proclaimed by the Church in the liturgy, leads to the Eucharist as to its own connatural end." To sustain us in the world we need both the inspired word of God in Scripture and the Incarnate Word of God present in the Blessed Sacrament.

The Bible is not just stories from long ago or God speaking to people long ago, it is God speaking to you and me today. In the Liturgy of the Word we encounter the words of God Himself spoken personally to each of us. Of course, the Scriptures were written by human beings, to a particular community, in a certain moment in history. When someone says God wrote the Bible what they mean is that God inspired the sacred writers. God breathed forth His divine words through human writers. Like Jesus Christ, the Sacred Scriptures are both fully human and fully divine.

The Liturgy of the Word (for weekend Mass) has several parts, the first reading, a Psalm (usually sung), the second reading, the Gospel, a homily, reciting of the Creed, and concludes with the prayers of the faithful. Next week, we will discuss these parts of the Liturgy of the Word.





Where did you grow up and go to school?

I grew up in Springfield, PA, a suburb of Philadelphia. My entire K-12 education was in Catholic schools. After graduating from high school, I attended the Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park, NY and received my Associate Degree in Culinary Arts. I then went to St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia. I entered the Jesuits in 1995 upon graduation from St. Joseph's. I then attended Fordham University for my MA in Philosophy. I also received an MA & MDiv from Santa Clara University.

What inspired you most to become a priest?

I was deeply moved by the Jesuits at St. Joseph's University who inspired my mind to think more critically as a young man of faith and to act more lovingly for Jesus. I was challenged and inspired to dig deeper and hear the call. I was also fortunate to have great sisters and priests in high school who modeled a life of prayer, community, sacrifice and invested care for others.

What is your favorite scripture passage?

My favorite passage is Mark 10: 46-52, the Blind Bartimaeus. I love the passage because He asks for assistance from Jesus. He names his need, in so doing he not only welcomes the healing, but then follows the Lord on The Way. For me, this captures ALL of our Christian vocation as loved sinners.

When you are not helping at St. Mary's, what is your position?

I am the Director of Campus Ministry at Canisius High School; responsible for all school liturgies, retreats and the service program (international, national, regional and local). I also teach religion to our Freshmen at Canisius.

What would someone find most surprising about you I still get a twinge of nervousness in preparing for Liturgy. Not until I look around the Church after a minute of my homily do I really settle down. I suppose that keeps me sharp. But I always recognize the Holy Spirit at work both in me and in the congregation, which brings me peace. It also reminds me that none of this is about me but about what God's grace can do for us.

What has made the biggest impression on you as minister to the people of St. Mary's?

The St. Mary's parish community is so welcoming and invested in their faith. People really listen to my homilies and because of that it keeps me focused and invested. I have grown in my vocation by celebrating with such a vibrant, prayerful and invested community. It truly is a gift to come each week. Thank you for nurturing my priesthood and for affirming my preaching abilities. You are a beautiful community!!!





Flag Day - Friday, June 14, 2024

What is Flag Day all about? Who really designed the first flag, and what do the red, white, and blue colors symbolize? See how much you know about the U.S. flag's history and meaning.

Flag Day is a celebration of the American flag that occurs each year on the anniversary of the flag's official adoption, June 14.

What we know fondly as the "Stars and Stripes" was adopted by the Continental Congress as the official American flag on June 14, 1777, in the midst of the Revolutionary War. The original 1777 flag was designed to represent the 13 original colonies. One of the first flag designs had the stars arranged in a circle, based on the idea that all colonies were equal. In 1818, after a few design changes, the United States Congress decided to retain the flag's original 13 stripes and add new stars to reflect each new state that the union. Each time a state was added to the union, a star was added. Today, there are 50 stars, one for each state in the union, but the 13 stripes remain.

Interestingly, the current American flag was designed by a high school student from Lancaster, Ohio, named Bob G. Heft! Even though Bob's history teacher gave him a "B-" for not knowing how many states the Union had, Bob submitted his design to the White House (unprompted) in anticipation of Hawaii and Alaska joining the Union. To his surprise, President Eisenhower called him! Today, it's Bob Heft's 1958 design—which shows 50 stars in a field that included five rows of six stars and four rows of five stars—which is now our 50star American flag (and history teacher changed his grade to an "A"!).


