

A LETTER FROM BISHOP MICHAEL FISHER

Dear Parishioners or Our Lady Help of Christians, Resurrection and St. Josephat Parishes:

Father Dudzik has been appointed the administrator of Resurrection and St. Josephat Parishes, in addition to his responsibilities at Our Lady Help of Christians Parish effective on December 6, 2021. Fr. Dudzik, with the assistance of other priests, will ensure that the sacramental needs of each parish are met in the best possible way. He will also facilitate the preliminary work in preparation of the formation of a Family of Parishes in Phase one of the Road to Renewal to be launched in October of 2022.

The Diocese of Buffalo has a vibrant history and will mark its 175th Anniversary in 2022. At this time, the clergy shortage is more evident than ever so it is important for each parish community to work collaboratively with the others. Various decisions such as Mass schedules, office hours, and coordinating the ministry and maintenance of each of the parishes will require study, input, and implementation. Some of these will bring about change and require prayer and patience.

Your role in the life of the parish is vital. Consider learning and participating in sessions regarding the Road to Renewal and the Family of Parishes model.
