Sacrament of Baptism: On Sunday, as scheduled. At least one parent must be regularly practicing the Faith. Sponsors must have their pastor's recommendation that they are a practicing Catholic and have been confirmed in the Faith. Parent preparation class required, preferably before the birth of the child. Call the office for information.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Arrangements made at least six months prior to date requested. Contact the rectory before setting the date. Preparation classes required.

Sacrament of the Sick: Call to make arrangements if chronically ill; prior to entering the hospital. Please notify the parish office if you or a family member is in the hospital, or desire to have the community's prayers.



TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Though Pentecost was months ago, Jesus reminds us today that he came to set the world afire. As members of the church born at Pentecost, that is our work today.

A few weeks back, our readings addressed the cost of following Jesus Christ. Jeremiah's cost was rejection by resistant princes, who threw him into a cistern. He would have died there had not Ebed-melech convinced the king that Jeremiah was a true prophet. Jesus' cost was his pending persecution and death, the "baptism with which I must be baptized." For the author of Hebrews the cost includes opposition and shedding one's blood.

When we allow faith in Jesus to guide our decisions, we can experience division from those who interpret Jesus' ways differently, even those we love. Church teaching calls us to treat all people with dignity and respect.

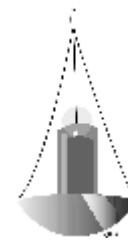
We are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, called to persevere in the race of living Jesus Christ. We might not land in a cistern or suffer physical persecution. However, we will face opposition if we are on fire for Jesus Christ. Pope Francis' Angelus address on August 14, 2016, said: "The Apostolic courage which the Holy Spirit ignites in us as a fire helps us overcome walls and barriers... [and explore]...unexplored or uncomfortable paths, offering hope to those we meet." Keep the flame of faith alive by living the gospel, no matter the cost. **2019 World Library Publications**
