Sacrament of Baptism: On Sunday, as scheduled. At least one parent must be regularly practicing the Faith. Sponsors must have their pastor's recommendation that they are a practicing Catholic and have been confirmed in the Faith. Parent preparation class required, preferably before the birth of the child. Call the office for information.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Arrangements made at least six months prior to date requested. Contact the rectory before setting the date. Preparation classes required.

Sacrament of the Sick: Call to make arrangements if chronically ill; prior to entering the hospital. Please notify the parish office if you or a family member is in the hospital, or desire to have the community's prayers.



TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In Luke’s Gospel, Jesus goes off by himself to pray. As members of his Body, the Church, we follow his example, and remain in prayer—our contact with God.

A Facebook post about St Catherine of Siena pictured her with a number of cardinals at the time of the Avignon Papacy (fourteenth century). The picture contains these words, “Nevertheless she persisted.” To persist is to continue to exist past the usual time or to continue doing something with determination even when facing difficulties. Our readings call us to persistence in prayer, talking and listening to God, even when we don’t see its effects immediately.

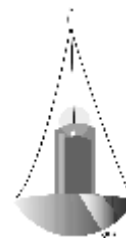
Moses persists in raising his hands for the Israelites to defeat Amalek in battle. But he gets tired. He needs support, so Aaron and Hur hold his arms. He needed community support to persist in the face of difficulty. Isn’t that true for us? We need the community to help us pray and persist in prayer, especially when our prayer seems ineffective and we want to give up. The unjust judge renders a just decision “because this widow keeps bothering me.” She persisted. Jesus says that our righteous God will “see to it that justice is done.” Don’t give up. Persist. Paul tells Timothy, “Be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient.”

When we don’t see a response to our prayers or we don’t receive the answer we want, we are often tempted to give up. Praying seems useless, especially when we are busy. However, spiritual writers tells us that is exactly when we need to make more time for prayer. Persistence is even more important than the amount of time we pray. So pray always, especially when busy or distracted. Retire at times into the space of our own hearts and pray throughout the day. We are always in God’s presence and God is persistent for us. **2019 World Library Publications**

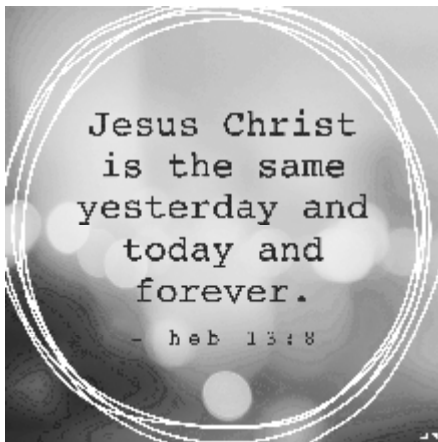
In 1976, the then Cardinal Karol Wojtyla led a group of Polish Bishops on a trip to the U.S. in honor of our Bicentennial. He stayed at St. Casimir Parish in the Kaisertown section of Buffalo. On October 16, 1978, he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, and the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. Pope John Paul II departed peacefully in the Lord on April 2, 2005. Pope Francis canonized him on April 27, 2014.
