Sacrament of Baptism: On Sunday, as scheduled. At least one parent must be regularly practicing the Faith. Sponsors must have their pastor's recommendation that they are a practicing Catholic and have been confirmed in the Faith. Parent preparation class required, preferably before the birth of the child. Call the office for information.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Arrangements made at least six months prior to date requested. Contact the rectory before setting the date. Preparation classes required.

Sacrament of the Sick: Call to make arrangements if chronically ill; prior to entering the hospital. Please notify the parish office if you or a family member is in the hospital, or desire to have the community's prayers.

To find or know healing and mercy from God, we have to respond to the ever-present invitation from God to trust, and to have faith.


Faith can profoundly change how we see God, ourselves, and one another. It gives a clearer lens through which to see life and connects us with the powerful virtues of love and hope. Three friends journeying with us through all that we encounter, faith, hope, and love, help us experience God's embrace and heal us. All we have to do is let God be

who God is and not foolishly try to make Him into what we need or want Him to be. Without God we cease to be. It's that simple. The very blood that flows through my veins and the life that I have come directly from Divine origins. With this knowledge of who God is and who I am, I can open my ears and hear the powerful words Jesus speaks, "Do not be afraid, just have faith." Trust begins.

When we are struggling, we naturally reach out for God because we know that a divine remedy is the only remedy. But, in doing so we wrestle with letting God take charge. We want something more miraculous and visible than the obvious and have difficulty in finding consolation simply resting in God's presence. Our naked being, stripped of any pretense or self-serving agenda, is being called to rest in and love the uncreated Presence of God. Reach out in love to God. Ask God to heal you from all that separates you from Him. Put aside any ideas of God that create barriers between you and God's tender and endearing presence. The Cloud of Unknowing leaves us with wisdom, "think of yourself and of him in the same way, that is, with the simple awareness that he is as he is and that you are as you are." 

Please utilize the dumpster by the shed.



Funeral Chapel Project Update

I am nearly half way to my fundraising goal thanks to the many generous donations I have received! Thank you so much to all those who have already donated! I have now purchased the new flooring and hope to get that installed soon. My hope is to keep the project moving in stages, as donations come in, so that it can be completed before Fall. For those of you who may just be learning about this, I have chosen to refurbish the funeral chapel at the Mt. Carmel Cemetery as my Boy Scout Eagle Scout Project. With the blessings of Father Dan, my plans include adding electricity and lighting to the chapel, improving the entrance walk, making building repairs to the door, roof and vents, replacing the floor, updating the altar, adding a space heater, updating the landscaping, and hopefully improving the decorations and seating. Although all of the labor will be donated, my project is expected to cost \$9,000, or more, depending on the options we can afford.
