

FROM OUR PASTOR

Today, the Christmas season continues with the feast of the Epiphany and the enigmatic Magi. They follow a mysterious star. Their journey for a king takes them to an out of the way place where there are no visible signs of royalty.

They worship the Christ child and offer their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. We are told that "they departed for their country by another way". In other words, this experience transformed them and they would never be the same again. They had to go home by another way. The Magi story is a symbol of the faith journey of all people. Sometimes we have only a glimmer of faith to point the way forward. But as we seek the truth, we have to leave the comfort and security of previously held positions and face the unknown. Deep down, each of us has an uneasiness and a yearning for true freedom and happiness. This yearning can only be satisfied by an encounter with the Divine. St. Augustine prayed: "My heart is restless until it rests in Thee". Just like the Magi, once we have truly encountered Christ, we will be transformed. This transformation demands that we change the way we live our lives. Just Like the Magi, we must go home by another way.

Light for the Journey

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord is a celebration of the manifestation of divinity. It literally means "revelation." There will be a number of epiphanies in the next few weeks of our liturgical cycle. The first reading is an exhortation for Jerusalem to "rise up" in a very dark and challenging time. The Judean exiles, returning from Babylon are struggling to reestablish themselves in a land devastated by their oppressors while living among peoples who did not welcome their return. In this message of encouragement Isaiah calls the people to recognize their new reality. Their "light has come, ... upon you the Lord shines and over you appears his glory." All the while darkness covers the earth. We can see some parallels with our own situation. Many things in this life are dark and difficult but God shines in it, and we can be that beacon. The choice is ours, and theirs.

Our faith is a journey. Hopefully we learn new things along the way through a perspective shaped by a fuller experience of God working in our lives and in our world. On this Solemnity let us not forget that God guides us. And there are those who walk the path with us.


