



# FROM OUR PASTOR

Jesus is baptized by John in today's Gospel. This may make us feel a little ill-at-ease. We would be far more comfortable if Jesus waded in the Jordan, tapped John on the shoulder and said *"hey you go rest and I'll take over for a while"*.

Even if Jesus is without sin, this could ruin his reputation. After all, Jesus did not need to repent. We are sometimes concerned with guilt by association, but Jesus does not seem overly concerned about all that. Jesus was baptized not because of any personal sin or problem; Jesus was baptized because humanity had sins and problems. Jesus was baptized so that He could be intimately tied to all of humanity.

In baptism we are intimately tied to Christ. However, in Baptism we are also tied to one another. We are tied to the healthy and the sick. We are tied to the brave and to the cowards. We are tied to the successful and to the ones who can't seem to get anything right. Jesus' baptism teach us a simple and profound truth of our faith. We are one Body in Christ. Jesus came to save all of us, not just those that see things the way we do.

#### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATIONS OF ADULTS Baptized for the Journey

Today concludes the Christmas season! The manifestations (revelations) of Christ that we have celebrated throughout Christmas culminate in the Baptism of the Lord. Baptism is the first of the initiation sacraments but is also the sacrament of formation into the Christian life. Whether in the context of a family or a parish; this special encounter with God is a call to action. To go on that journey we are "clothed in Christ." All the readings but especially the Gospel has a certain "buzz" in this cycle C version we proclaim today. People were filled with expectation, and they were asking in their hearts. Toward the end of the Gospel, we are told "After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying..." that heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended and the voice gives its affirmation. Truly God reveals He is here for all of us even though he acknowledges the special relationship He has with his beloved Son. This passage should give us encouragement to move out into an uncertain world with the blessing of Trinity that can be felt through our physical senses.

Tomorrow we enter ordinary time before we move into Lent in March. During this formation period we will see how Jesus, and the apostles he chooses, come to a better understanding of who they are and what their call is about. We will see in our readings ambiguity and confusion along with nudging and training. Sound familiar? We need to stay awake, keep moving, and recalculate on the journey.


