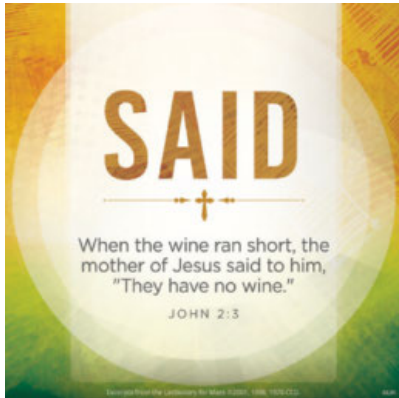

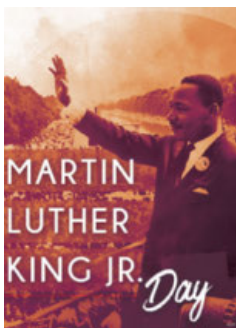

MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY



January 17

Martin Luther King Jr. was an American Baptist minister and activist who became the most visible spokesman and leader in the American civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968.

January 22: Day of Prayer for Protection of the Unborn

On January 22, 1973, in Roe v. Wade, seven justices of the U.S. Supreme Court struck down every State statute that had protected unborn children, created a new "right" to abortion at any time before birth, and led to the deaths of millions of babies.

January 18-25: Pray for Christian Unity.

Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (Jn 17:21)

FROM OUR PASTOR

Our Gospel today is the wedding feast in Cana. This event in the life of Jesus is only found in John's Gospel. After running out of wine, Mary urges Jesus to do something. Jesus protests.

However, Mary turns to the waiters and says simply "do whatever he tells you to do". The remarkable thing is that the waiters do. This is near the beginning of John's Gospel, so Jesus is relatively unknown at this point and he has performed no miracles yet. However, he asks the waiters to fill up stone jars with water and they fill the jars to overflowing (150 gallons of water!).

When the servants did what Jesus told them to do – wonderful things happened. It was at this point that the disciples began to believe (Mary already believed). **We are saved by our faith; however, true faith will show itself by the way we live.** In other words, true faith will show itself by doing whatever Christ tells us to do. But when we do, wonderful things can happen.

The Two Feet of Love in Action

There are two different, but complementary, ways that we can walk the path of love. We call these the "Two Feet of Love in Action." The two feet represent Social Justice and Charitable Works. Social justice concerns the social, political, and economic aspects and, above all, the structural dimension of problems and their respective solutions." (See Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church, no 201.) Charitable works meet the basic needs and aid individuals. Christian charity is the simple response to immediate needs and specific situations: feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, caring for and healing the sick, visit those in prison, etc." (See Pope Benedict XVI, Deus Caritas Est, no 31)

Together on the Journey

Even though we are in Ordinary Time, we have another 'epiphany'. Today's gospel is from John and the changing of the water to wine at the wedding in Cana is the first of Jesus' seven signs found in John. Throughout the readings there is reference to glory, manifestation, and vindication and victory shining **"like the dawn...like a burning torch"**.

Although the miracle is not done in a flashy way, it appears that all the significantly affected people know that something extraordinary has happened. What a typical exchange between an adult son and his mother! The last phrase of the gospel passage; **"...and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him."** Faith is a journey; it is a process. Faith is a relationship that grows or dies.

In the wedding at Cana and the other readings we encounter Christ in the sacrament of marriage and the Jewish experience of the covenant between God and the Chosen people. There is a tension between what is now and what will be. The revelation is real but the transformation is worked out in the journey-together.

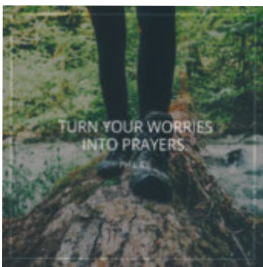


