# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



The spectacular Feast of Pentecost brings to a magnificent conclusion the great celebration of Easter. The name actually comes from the Jewish feast that commemorates the fifty days of Passover and reminds us of the basis we have in Judaism which has now been transformed by Jesus Christ. That transformation has been completed and gives us the substance of our identity as followers of Jesus and as sons and daughters of God called by name and adopted by God as His very own children. With the coming of the Holy Spirit, even the form and the point of Baptism has been refined and made more obvious. It is no longer the baptism of repentance as proclaimed by John the Baptist. The coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost makes the Sacrament of Baptism what it is today: the beginning of our sharing in the life of God in a very literal and true sense. When Jesus took on His human nature when He was conceived at the Annunciation, He joined His divinity to our humanity in a way that could never be undone. When Jesus took our human nature to be joined to the Father in the Ascension, He made the connection for us that never existed before but which now will remain for all eternity. As we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church in Pentecost, we are celebrating the fact that God, in Jesus, has made it possible for us to be raised up to the level of divinity! As impossible as that may sound, it is true.

Of course, there are some of those who have tried to make themselves equal to God by their own means, and that is NOT what we are talking about here! By sharing in the life of God, we necessarily need to be humble...VERY humble... to think that God would think so highly of us and bestow such a wonderful reality upon us. As soon as we begin to misuse or abuse such gifts, we can be sure that we are following the temptations of the Evil One and are acting contrary to what God would have us do. In both Baptism and Confirmation, we both receive and fortify the gifts of the Holy Spirit within us: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. These are gifts we need to ask God to fan into flame in our hearts, just like glowing coals on a grill that sometimes need to be shaken and fanned into flame to prevent them from dying out. God has given us the gifts that we need, but you and I are the ones who need to choose to use them in the service of God because it is only then that we can somehow contribute to the Word of God being preached and proclaimed to the ends of the earth.

May the blessings of this now passed Easter Season be with us now and for the rest of our lives on earth and in Heaven!

**50+** 50+ COMMUNITY For many of us and for many years, we have heard and reflected upon the Holy Spirit who descends upon Mary and the Apostles hiding in a closed, locked room, afraid to leave the security of the locked doors. As I was reflecting on this feast, I came across a reflection by Sr. Melannie Svaboda, a Sister of Notre Dame in Chardon. She is a gifted author and writer of many books. This is what she has to say about Pentecost. *GOD COMES. . .but how does he come to us? God comes as a "still small voice". Many of us like that sort of coming, [she says]. We like a God who whispers and woos rather than one who shouts and creates a big scene. But on Pentecost, God's coming is all spectacle: howling winds, rattling walls, untamable fire, instant fluency in foreign languages. But when we look more closely at both comings, we see this: no matter the form, God's coming has one purpose. God commands Elijah to go back to the place he is running away from. On Pentecost, God throws the disciples out into the streets where, filled with God's spirit, they proclaim the Gospel. In short, God comes to us as well and tells us to go. God whispers to us: "Go give her a hand." God nags, "Go and say you're sorry." God shouts, "Go and do something about that!" God shakes up our normal life, all in an effort to get us to go and love . . . go and give . . . go and do that hard thing . . . go and listen . . . go and play . . . go and pray . . . go to a deeper level of trust in Me . . . go because I am with you. Always! Amen!*

**Divine Mercy, from which wells forth all life and happiness, I trust in You.** True and lasting happiness is found in God alone. His grace - His Divine Mercy - is the wellspring from which we receive all that is necessary to live a life of virtue and holiness. When we sin, we may experience a brief moment of what feels like happiness, but it does not come without an experience of the weight of guilt and shame that Satan wraps around us. When we come to Jesus in Confession, He unties those bonds that Satan has us held in and grants us new life and the experience of true happiness.

**Divine Mercy, better than the heavens, I trust in You.** For millennia, people have dreamt what "the heavens" are. The ancient Greeks filled the heavens with gods and mythical creatures. The Romans then had their own. Throughout Christian history, people have speculated what Heaven will truly be like. The truth is that Heaven is greater than we could ever imagine, and it is precisely because of Divine Mercy. God's mercy is so great and beyond our comprehension that it drove Lucifer to choose eternal damnation. We can trust in Him that His mercy is greater than our sins. This does not give us license to sin and do whatever we want, but rather it gives us license to love and believe that His Divine Mercy is better than our greatest imaginations.

**Divine Mercy, source of miracles and wonders, I trust in You.** The most hardened of sinners can experience healing and conversion through Divine Mercy. Hundreds and thousands of miracles and wonders throughout history have testified to the power of God's Divine Mercy. We can bring our prayers and petitions to Him. If our faith is great and our trust is great, He can truly work miracles and wonders in our lives. These graces may not be what we had originally hoped for, but we can trust that He will work exactly what we need in our lives for our salvation.



## The Bishops of Ohio Announce the Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation May 13, 2021

As we move beyond the worst of the coronavirus pandemic and access to the COVID-19 vaccine has become more widespread, the time has arrived for the good of all the faithful when the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is no longer necessary.

Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated (C.C. can. 1247). This will take effect in each of the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6, 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. Nevertheless, these persons should observe the Lord's Day (CIC, can. 1247) and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of the Sunday Mass. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, home-bound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person. Kindly consult your pastor with any specific questions regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

The book of Exodus reminds us to keep holy the Sabbath day (Exodus 20: 8-10). As Catholics, we are invited by God to gather together in community, and participate fully in the Sunday Eucharist, which is the "source and summit of the Christian life." "Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together they testify to God's holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2182).

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days is not something God asks of us out of his own necessity to be worshipped, but rather a gift to the faithful for their spiritual well-being, eternal salvation and formation in our relationship with God and one another. To that end, Saint John Vianney rightly asserts, "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." The Eucharist is the greatest gift Christ left to the Church—the gift of Himself. There is no substitute for Mass celebrated in person.

We are profoundly grateful to our pastors and all of the faithful for their flexibility, fidelity and great generosity in support of the mission of the Church throughout this unprecedented time. As we prepare for the reinstatement of the obligation to attend Mass, we are excited once again to gather together in person without restrictions in our parish churches, most fittingly on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As we reflect on our Lord's goodness and mercy in the midst of the sacrifices made during the coronavirus pandemic, we ask Saint Joseph to intercede for us, that through his fatherly protection and care, we may experience a renewal of faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

We welcome you back with great joy and eagerness!




