

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



The feast of our Patron Saint, Saint Barnabas, is normally celebrated on 11 June. However, this year we find that that date is the Solemnity of The Sacred Heart of Jesus. The designation for that Feast is not a calendar date, but is described as "Friday after the Second Sunday after Pentecost" which this year turns out to be 11 June, so St. Barnabas' feast day would normally be superseded for this year. But fear not! Because we are a parish community dedicated to St. Barnabas, we have the option of transferring his feast to the nearest Sunday as long as it is in the Ordinary Time of the Church year, i.e, a Sunday that does not have the rank of a Solemnity. Well, this Sunday would normally be the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. So, to make a long story short, we are able to transfer our patronal feast to this week-end. No other parish in the diocese can legitimately do that! I thought that you might enjoy a little explanation of this liturgical complexity! The bottom line of all of this is that on this week-end red vestments will be worn to honor St. Barnabas as an Apostle (although not one of the Twelve), and the second reading will be taken from the Acts of the Apostles as is designated for his feast.

All that being said, I think that we are really blessed to have a patron saint like St. Barnabas. Just about all we know of him is found in the Acts of the Apostles, so we could not ask for a better source of information. We are told that Barnabas was from the island of Cyprus and eventually did a great deal of preaching there. We are also informed that his given name was "Joseph" but he became better known by his nickname, "Barnabas" which translates to "Son of Encouragement." It seems we can surmise from other references in the Acts of the Apostles that he was a desired companion for Paul and the other Apostles on their missionary journeys. It is especially noteworthy to realize that many of the Apostles were more than a bit leery of Paul because his conversion was so sudden and so complete. It was Barnabas that sought him out and learned more about what he experienced, eventually bringing him to meet some of the other Apostles and vouching for the genuineness of his conversion.

Barnabas is described as "a good man, full of faith and the Holy Spirit." His association with encouragement is seen in his desirability as a companion of the journeys many of the Apostles undertook. He was present for the Council of Jerusalem that decided that non-Jewish converts would not be bound by all requirements of the Jewish Law. According to tradition he was martyred after preaching the Gospel in his own native land of Cyprus.

St. Barnabas is honored as the Patron Saint of Encouragement, and thus becomes a wonderful help to us as a parish community. Whenever we or anyone we know needs encouragement, you and I can offer it ourselves and also pray to our parish patron for some heavenly encouragement as well.

50+ COMMUNITY Are you planting a garden this year? Have you already started? During the last few weeks, our newspapers have advertised trees, plants, seeds and potted flowers for sale. For many of us, we are able to take off our masks and enjoy the freedom of picking out just the right flower or vegetable for our garden. Even Crankshaft, the comic character in the newspaper, has planted his garden. Overkill at its best but nonetheless the task of planting is completed. As the pandemic seems to be coming to an end, we are encouraged to celebrate some normalcy: getting back to Mass, seeing some old friends and resuming many of our previous activities. Parables are an invitation to take time to consider how the plan of God unfolds around us in ways that are always surprising. In today's Gospel, we are called by our God to "sow" God's word to all the world. It's amazing to think that a tiny seed has so much potential that it can become the largest of plants, the most beautiful display of flowers, a source of food, and a dwelling place for the birds of the air. The truth is that each one of us is also packaged with unbelievable potential. God wants to bring us to a new rebirth. He wants to bring forth from our lives glorious blessings for the world. All we must do is allow Him to work through us. Like a seed, we must allow ourselves to be planted in the fertile soil of His mercy and surrender to His divine will. We must be watered by daily prayer and allow the rays of the Son of God to shine on us so that He can bring forth from us all that He desires and has planned from the foundation of the world. So, let us reflect upon the incredible potential that God has placed within our souls. Just as we take the time to scatter the seeds and nourish them, let us scatter the seeds of love for God and one another. Simply, let God do what He does best. He invites us to come to him and live forever.

Notes from the Blue Army: *Melanie Williams explains line by line the poem written by St. Faustina, "God's Love is the flower - Mercy the fruit." The Blue Army cell meets on Thursdays at 7 p.m. in the Adoration Chapel. Everyone is welcome.*

Divine Mercy, in our justification through Jesus Christ, I trust in You. Saint Faustina wrote in her Diary, "You do not reject sinners; but in Your boundless mercy You have opened for them also Your treasures, treasures from which they can draw abundantly, not only justification, but also all the sanctity that a soul can attain".

In Christ's Divine Mercy, we sinners are not only forgiven; we are justified by His merits upon the Cross. This is a great act of mercy! We in ourselves cannot merit justification, for we have sinned and turned from the Heart of the Father; but Jesus, by His Divine Mercy, covers us and washes us clean in the font of Baptism and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and we are not only justified, but sanctified.

Divine Mercy, accompanying us through our whole life, I trust in You. "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age". Jesus said this to His disciples before He ascended to the Father. He gave the "Great Commission" to go forth and make disciples of all nations, "baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit", and He promised to be with them always. This promise is also made to us by virtue of our Baptism. We are disciples of Jesus Christ, and the Trinity dwells within us. As Jesus said to St. Faustina, the only thing that drives Him out of a soul is mortal sin. So you are never alone! God dwells within you, and, in addition to that, He comes to us each and every day in the Eucharist and stays with us in the Most Blessed Sacrament that is reserved in our tabernacles. In moments when you might feel abandoned, rejected, or alone, remember that the Lord dwells within you. Call upon Him. He is very near.

Divine Mercy, embracing us especially at the hour of death, I trust in You. Throughout the Diary, Jesus says time and again how He will be near those souls at the hour of death who honor His mercy (see 1075); spread His mercy (see 1224); proclaim His mercy (see 378); venerate the Image of Divine Mercy (see 48); pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy (see 687); place their trust in His mercy (see 1520); and encourage others to trust in His mercy (see 1540). Many people are afraid of dying. But those who trust in His mercy have no need to fear it, for they know that it is the moment when they will meet our Merciful Savior. Allow Jesus to comfort you and your loved ones at the hour of death. Trust in Him that you will all meet again in Heaven, if you abide in His grace.

JEREMIAH 1:5 – *"Now the word of the Lord came to me saying: Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born, I consecrated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you."*

Reflect on the above passage. God knew you and was present at your creation with a plan that only you can fulfill! He loves you at every stage of your life –

+ **1st Day:** Conception took place and at that very moment, a new and unique individual was formed - you. All of your inherited features were already determined.

+ **18-20 Days:** The foundations of your brain, spinal cord, and nervous system were laid.

+ **21 Days:** Your heart began to beat.

+ **22 Days:** Your eyes began to develop. The earliest stages of your ears were now present.

+ **28-32 Days:** Two tiny arms made their appearance and budding legs followed two days later. The beginnings of your mouth took shape. Your nose started to develop.

+ **42 Days:** Your brain divided into three parts – one to experience emotion and understand language, one for hearing, and one for seeing.

+ **44 Days:** Facial muscles developed. 99% of your muscles were present.

+ **7 Weeks:** Spontaneous movement began, and over the next four weeks, it included hiccupping, frowning, squinting, furrowing the brow, and sucking.

+ **8 Weeks:** Every organ was present. Your liver was making blood, your kidneys functioned, and your heart beat steadily (you were about the size of a thumb).

+ **10 Weeks:** The numbers of connections between your nerves and muscles had tripled since last week.

+ **12 Weeks:** You could swallow and respond to skin stimulation.

+ **4 Months:** You could grip with your hands, make a fist, swim, and turn somersaults.

+ **7 Months:** Your eyelids began to reopen, preparing you to see the outside world.

+ **9 ½ Months:** Labor began and you were born, an average of 264-270 days after conception.
