

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Last Sunday we had the very pleasant occasion to welcome back to St. Barnabas two people who are part of the history of this parish community. We welcomed Deacon Richard Vossler, the son of Kay and Dick Vossler who have been parishioners here since the very beginning of the parish. Deacon Vossler was one of the first people baptized here in 1956, even before the original church was built! He was baptized in a utility building that served as an "all purpose" facility until the first church (now the school cafeteria, library, youth ministry and faith formation offices) were built. In more recent years Deacon Richard has lived and worked in Virginia, in the Diocese of Arlington, where he was ordained as a permanent deacon on 20 February 2021. Since it was during the pandemic, his mom and dad were not able to travel to Virginia for the ordination ceremony, so this was the first opportunity his folks had to experience in person their son exercising his ordained ministry as Deacon. The celebrant at the 11:00 a.m. Mass was Father Gerald Keller who had been associate pastor here from 1970 to 1974 and with whom the Vosslers have maintained a warm relationship. Father Keller is now retired and living in Avon, providing assistance to several parishes. How nice it is to be able to celebrate our history, to thank a couple like Kay and Dick Vossler for doing such a fine job in raising their family, and being able to thank Deacon Vossler for responding to the Lord's call with the help and support of his wife and family. It was a great day to celebrate!

The Scriptures this week-end remind us that "God did not make death, nor does He rejoice in the destruction of the living." (Wisdom 1:13) This is spoken in a context that reminds us that the presence of the Lord is both uplifting and life-giving. Death and destruction come about because of humanity's invitation to the devil to enter our world by the disobedience of our first parents who made that choice for all those who would follow after them. The miracles of Jesus show the Savior's intent to re-establish the life-giving and life-enhancing gifts that were given to us in the first place. Today's Gospel tells us of a miracle within a miracle. On His way to cure the daughter of the synagogue official, the woman suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years and who had tried all kinds of treatments and cures, sought just to touch Jesus in desperation. And she was cured. Then Jesus continued His journey to the young girl who was suffering, only to find out enroute that she had already died. Not being stopped by this news, He continued on. The story concludes with the beautiful scene of Jesus taking the little girl's hand and raising her from the dead! Not only did God NOT make death, He also has power over death and can call us back to life. This is the God that we celebrate and adore! The Lord of Life, the Conqueror of sin and death who wants us to live with Him forever. We are not bound by the devil's introduction of death into our world; God has transformed the tragedy of death into the gateway to new life for us all.

50+ COMMUNITY In today's Gospel, we have two "touch" miracles where people are cured by Jesus with a simple touch. In one, the woman touched Jesus' garment. In the other, Jesus would touch the daughter of Jairus. How can we touch Jesus today? And how can He touch us? One of the most awesome ways that we touch Jesus and He touches us is by receiving Him in Holy Communion. Our communion prayer is, "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." Yes Lord, my soul needs healing as well as my body. Only say the word, Jesus! And then we reach out our hands. Jesus is placed in our palms. We reverently place Him in our mouth. We have touched Jesus and we have been touched and healed by Him. Jesus has now become a part of us, body and soul, never to be the same persons as we were before. But there is more. Jesus calls us to be to be a 'healing' towards one another. Our lives are continually touching those of other people. We might therefore ask ourselves: what goes out from us through our words, our deeds, our relationships - hurting or healing? We could all do a little healing if only we allowed ourselves to become instruments of Christ. With a little sympathy we could heal a wounded heart. With a little care we could ease a troubled mind. With a little of our time we could ease the pain of loneliness for someone. For the Gospel to come alive we must live it.

Notes from the Blue Army: *Melanie Williams explains line by line the poem written by St. Faustina, "God's Love is the flower - Mercy the fruit." The Blue Army cell meets on Thursdays at 7 p.m. in the Adoration Chapel. Everyone is welcome.*

Divine Mercy, embracing us especially at the hour of death, I trust in You. Throughout the Diary, Jesus says time and again how He will be near those souls at the hour of death who honor His mercy; spread His mercy; proclaim His mercy; venerate the Image of Divine Mercy; pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy; place their trust in His mercy; and encourage others to trust in His mercy. Many people are afraid of dying. But those who trust in His mercy have no need to fear it, for they know that it is the moment when they will meet our Merciful Savior. Allow Jesus to comfort you and your loved ones at the hour of death. Trust in Him that you will all meet again in Heaven, if you abide in His grace.

Divine Mercy, endowing us with immortal life, I trust in You. God created us with immortal souls. God so loved us that He wanted to create us with the ability to live with Him for all eternity! After the Fall, we lost that original grace, but by His mercy, Jesus opened up the gates to Heaven for us by His Passion, death, and Resurrection. Divine Mercy, accompanying us every moment of our life, I trust in You. Similar to St. Faustina's previous line that Divine Mercy accompanies us through our whole life - even through death - St. Faustina now specifies that Divine Mercy accompanies us every moment of our lives. There is never a moment that God abandons you. Even if you don't feel His presence, even if you're in the pits of despair, He is close to you. Jesus told St. Faustina, "My daughter, during the weeks when you neither saw Me nor felt My presence, I was more profoundly united to you than at times [when you experienced] ecstasy". How reassuring! When you cannot feel His presence, when you are suffering, if you are in a state of grace, He is more united with you than when you are in times of consolation! He never leaves you or abandons you. May this increase your trust.

The Peter's Pence Collection occurs yearly on the Sunday closest to June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, as a sign that Catholics around the world are joined together in support of the Holy Father.

A Concrete Sign of Mercy

The concrete participation in the needs of the universal ecclesial community has taken different forms throughout history. Collections and donations by the individual faithful or entire local churches raise awareness that all the baptized are called to materially sustain the work of evangelization and, at the same time, to help the poor in whatever way possible. By doing so, they build up the Church so that it will continue to minister to all for generations to come.

During his apostolic visit to Bangui in the Central African Republic in 2015, Pope Francis visited the city's pediatric hospital with a donation of medicines and a promise that he would not forget the country's children. With contributions raised to support Peter's Pence, the Holy Father kept that promise to the children of Bangui

by founding a new facility in 2017. The existing hospital was renovated, and a new facility specifically for malnourished children was constructed. In a March 2019 message, Pope Francis described the hospital as "a concrete sign of mercy" originating with his 2015 visit.

A Tradition of Support for the Holy Father

Support for such papal efforts has its roots in the scriptural message to take care of the poor and is an expression of unity with the Holy Father. Peter's Pence expresses this unity in two ways: through the ongoing activities of the Holy See and through the charitable works of the Holy Father on behalf of those most in need.
