

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



There is a wealth of material in the Scripture readings this week-end for us to consider and, hopefully, to learn from.

In the first reading from the Book of Joshua, we have the successor to Moses finding it necessary to confront the people of Israel because of their constant grumbling, and Joshua confronts them in no uncertain terms: "If it does not please you to serve the Lord, decide today whom you will serve... As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Perhaps, because the question was so blunt, it brings the Chosen People to their senses and they realize just how far afield they have wandered from the Lord. They then go on to renew their profession of faith in God and make a new start. A key factor in this was the people recalling the great acts of God on their behalf that they had so quickly forgotten.

The second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians is one of the passages that so many people can find difficulty with, but in reality should not provide any difficulty at all. We are asked to be subordinate to one another. It then goes on to say, "Wives should be subordinate to their husbands...Husbands love your wives..." The point of all this is we are called to be mutually submissive to one another and to love each other. It is all too easy to pick and choose from the Scriptures and find snippets of texts to suit our fancy. That is why it is so important to consider the whole message of the Bible and not just take bits and pieces to prove a point we are trying to make. When we consider all that the Scriptures provide for us, it is easy to see why we should not try to beat each other over the head with particular verses often taken out of context.

The Gospel of St. John calls us to realize that Jesus meant what He said when He gave us the Eucharist, His own Body and Blood, to be our food. This passage from St. John reminds us that many of Jesus' disciples found this a hard saying and could not accept it and "...returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him." Jesus made no attempt to call those disciples back and try to explain that He was speaking figuratively or symbolically. No. He meant what He said: "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood." This is very often the point at which many of those who have left the Catholic Church down through the centuries have also come to a point where they could no longer accept Jesus at His word. Jesus certainly "bent over backwards" to provide the Holy Eucharist for us under the very palatable signs of bread and wine while actually changing the reality of those elements to be His Body and Blood. There is nothing else in nature that compares to this, but we have the very Word of the Son of God Himself to say that this is so. How blessed we are!!

The key to this reading is all in the first line: "be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ." When love is mutually, freely, and generously shared between husband and wife, marriage goes to a whole new, wonderful level!

50+ COMMUNITY Today's first reading and the Gospel give us a lot to reflect upon. There is Joshua, the leader of the Twelve Tribes of Israel and Peter, the apostle, who later becomes the head of the Church. Each of them experienced God in different yet similar ways. Joshua calls on his community to affirm their commitment to God and challenges them to respond along with his family to the call of their God. "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." His awesome declaration inspires the Israelites to do the same. They renewed their covenant with their God and agreed to keep the promises they made to the Lord. In the Gospel we continue to hear about the reactions of his followers to Jesus calling himself the Bread of Life. They loved hearing his words. They loved experiencing the warmth of His Presence. They had just eaten the bread He multiplied. They had seen Him heal people. They had heard Him call them to be leaders in His Kingdom. But now Jesus had given them a teaching that demanded their absolute trust in Him. He told them He was the Bread of Life. He told them they needed to eat His Flesh and drink His Blood for them to have eternal life. "Many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer followed him." As we reflect, we might ask ourselves the same question that Jesus asked Peter, "Will you also go?" Joshua's response and ours coupled with that of Peter hopefully is: "Lord, where can we go, you alone have the words of eternal life."

After making a few adjustments and the response of one couple, we will be going on our trip on September 13. Yea! However, because of the glitches in this trip which we have never experienced (pandemic, numbers, venues), our itinerary will not be ready for a little while. I am ready and I'm sure you are too. Now we begin to pray for good weather and safe travel. More information to follow.

Notes from the Blue Army: This meditation on the fifth glorious mystery of the Rosary, the Coronation of the Blessed Virgin, is taken from *The Rosary – Chain of Hope* written by Fr. Benedict Groeschel, C.F.R.



The glorious Coronation of Mary, which in no way resembles the coronation of earthly kings and queens, is a mystical event. It is really Mary coming into the glory of the just. We all know, of course, that saints in immense multitudes have joined her already in the kingdom of heaven, awaiting the resurrection of their bodies. But the image of the Mother of Jesus, the humble virgin of Nazareth, Our Lady of Sorrows, the woman at the Cross, now embracing the presence of the most Holy Trinity, should fill all Christians with the greatest hope and reverence for the mystery of eternal life.

As we grow older, we may have a greater share in the sorrows of life and the pains of age. We may experience difficulty and failure and even the betrayal of friends. We may have to accept the reality of dashed hopes, unfulfilled plans, and dreams that can never come to be. As we struggle to accept this suffering, how beautiful and marvelous it is to lift up our eyes and know with your glorious and risen Savior there is one of His elect, one for who He is Redeemer, Son, and Lord.

The Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, depicted by so many great medieval artists, should encourage and draw each of us to a greater hope of eternal life. For this reason, in the *Divine Comedy*, Dante used the coronation of the Virgin as the introduction and the symbol of the salvation of the just and the mysterious love of the Christ Jesus Our Lord. He wisely took this event to be the end of the journey of the soul.
