





O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (Latin: *Veni, Veni, Emmanuel*) is a hymn that we will use all throughout Advent, and is probably the most familiar (and certainly a favorite) of all Advent Hymns. The text was originally in Latin, and is a paraphrase of the **O Antiphons**.

The **O Antiphons** are a series of plainchant antiphons attached to the Magnificat at Vespers over the final days before Christmas (December 17 to December 23).

The text and music of *Veni Emmanuel* were developed separately: Text in 1710 and the tune around the 15th-century in France.

The first version of this hymn included five verses, which corresponded to five of the seven **O Antiphons**:

Veni, Veni, Emmanuel

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Veni, O Jesse Virgula

O Come, Thou Rod of Jesse

Veni, Veni, O Oriens

O Come, Thou Dayspring, from on High

Veni, Clavis Davidica

O Come, Thou Key of David, Come

Veni, Veni, Adonai

O Come, Adonai, Lord of Might

The text was expanded to include the remaining **O Antiphons**, and was first published around 1878:

Veni, O Sapientia

O Come, O Wisdom

Veni, Rex Gentium

O Come, King of the Nations



Communion Antiphons

The Communion Antiphon (or chant) was historically sung by a soloist, the choir, or the congregation during the Communion of the priest and the faithful in the Roman Mass. There is a refrain (Antiphon) repeated after each verse, ending with the Gloria Patri and a final Antiphon. In the Roman liturgy, this chant is called the Communion antiphon or simply the Communion. The practice of chanting a Psalm during the distribution of Communion is common to both Eastern and Western Liturgies.

In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) it specifically indicates that the preference during the distribution of Holy Communion, is a Communion Antiphon. We will be using Communion Antiphons during the Advent Season.


