





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As we enter into this New Year, we ask God to provide us with His great blessings. As we begin a new year, we have a chance to change our ways—to get rid of what is bad, to seek better to do good. An old Irish Tradition is that at Midnight as the New Year begins, the family opens the front door to let out the old year and bring in the new. I think this year, after all the craziness of the past year, we should have opened all the doors and windows to let out the old and welcome in the new!

As we celebrate the Feast of Epiphany today, we consider the lavish response of the Magi in traveling to visit the newborn King of the Jews. Their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh were among the finest materials in existence at the time. Their gifts recognize that God is deserving of the very best that we have to offer. Their gifts recognize that Jesus is King (gold), God (frankincense), and Messiah (myrrh). Not merely the left-overs, or some last minute idea, these gifts are well thought-out and extremely valuable. we think of at the last minute. The first and best gifts belong to God. What are the gifts we have to bring to the Lord?
