



From Father Sheridan

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The more astute observers among you would have noticed that, since June, upon the death of Bishop Murry, we have not prayed for a bishop in the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass. That changed this week, Bishop David Bonnar became the sixth bishop of the Diocese of Youngstown on Tuesday. Not only in our Eucharistic Prayers at Mass, but also in our other individual and liturgical prayers, we lift up our new bishop, asking for God to grant him wisdom, strength, and the heart of a pastor as he begins his service among us.

We return once more to Ordinary Time, which is the time throughout the year. During this time, as we find ourselves between the major seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter, we learn from the Lord's teachings, miraculous healings, and the example of his life. These lessons bring us hope that we are not alone, even in the "ordinary times" of life. This hope is symbolized by the green we wear during Ordinary Time.

This Monday we will pause to remember the legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Since a year ago when we last celebrated his day, we have seen in clearer ways how much work is left to do to bring about his dream, a dream all good people share.

Then, on Wednesday, we will pause again to watch the inauguration of President-elect Biden. Regardless of how you voted in the last election, it is time for us to come together again as one nation, to work together for the good of all, and to begin once more to assume the best from "the other." I fear that the 24-hour news cycle and the proliferation of social media have irreversibly changed discourse in our nation. I remember a time when people could disagree and still be friends. I remember a time when we could have a true debate about ideas and theories without accusations and name-calling. I yearn for a time when we can return to this, for the benefit of our democracy. We are all best, when we afford to

each other the best of intentions. Let us pray for our new president and vice-president. Let us pray for God to touch their hearts so that His work may be done through them.

Finally, we offer our sympathies and prayers to the families and friends of Jean Dawson from the Basilica of Saint John the Baptist and Nancy Pearson of Saint Peter Church. May God, in His love and mercy, welcome them to heaven, and may He provide comfort and consolation to those who mourn their passing.

Perpetual Adoration


