

Genesis 9:8-15





Holy Hour for Divine Mercy

Every Sunday during Lent, a Holy Hour for Divine Mercy will take place AFTER the 10:30 AM Mass in the Basilica.

A Holy Hour is the Roman Catholic devotion of spending an hour in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The influence for a Holy Hour is taken from Matthew 26:40: The night before his crucifixion, Jesus told his disciples that his Soul was sorrowful even to death. He implored them to remain with him and keep watch. After returning from prayer, Jesus found his disciples asleep, he asked Peter: "So, could you not keep watch with me for an hour?"

The Exposition of the Eucharist takes place at the beginning, followed by hymns, the Divine Mercy Chaplet with prayers are offered, and periods of silence. The Liturgy concludes with Benediction.

From Father Sheridan

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

This weekend, at the conclusion of Mass, I will speak to you briefly about the Annual Bishop's Appeal for Catholic Charities and Church. At the end of each pew is a participation envelope that you can take home with you, if you have not already received one in your mail, and fill out. For the past two years, we have not had a financial goal, but the goal of 100% participation. It remains our hope that every parish family will participate in some way in the Bishop's Appeal, but we do have financial goals as well again this year, returning to our former practice. At the Basilica, our parish goal is \$41,700 and at St. Peter, our goal is \$44,400. These numbers are based on our Sunday Collections as they relate to the percentage of monies collected throughout the diocese. That same percentage was used to determine what our part of the entire \$4 Million goal for the appeal. I invite and encourage you to consider a gift to the Bishop's Appeal as part of your commitment this lent.

At the entrances of both churches, you will find Rice Bowls. This is another annual commitment we make to assist the work of the Catholic Relief Services. In addition to the Rice Bowl itself, which is used to collect coins and change we find throughout the season of Lent, there is a pamphlet attached which shares stories of hope and recipes for

Please place them directly into the basket without rubber bands and plastic bags. Thank you for your cooperation.

Finally, we offer our sympathies to the family and friends of Mildred Motta of the Basilica who passed away recently. May the Lord, in His love and mercy, welcome her swiftly home to heaven, and may He provide comfort and consolation to those who mourn her passing.
