When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak. She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Immediately her flow of blood dried up. But his disciples said to Jesus, "You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble

the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha kum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat. This Mass will be held on the 73rd anniversary of Rhoda Wise's death. Our new bishop, Most Reverend David J. Bonnar, will be the celebrant with our own, Very Reverend John E. Sheridan, S.T.L. as concelebrant.

There will be an update on Rhoda's Cause for Beatification at this Mass and light refreshments will be served in Saint Peter Parish Hall afterward.

From Father Sheridan

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We welcome Fr. Brian Smith to celebrate the Masses this weekend at our parishes. Fr. Smith, who was with us for his pastoral internship year in 2018-19, was ordained last week by Bishop Bonnar. At his ordination, Fr. Smith learned that he will be assigned as the Parochial Vicar at Saint Paul in North Canton and will be the Diocesan Coordinator of Hispanic Ministry. His classmate, Fr. Chad Johnson, a son of Saint Peter Parish, has been assigned as the Parochial Vicar at Saint Patrick in Kent with additional responsibilities at the Newman Center Parish at Kent State University. We once again congratulate them as they begins his priestly ministry, and assure them of our prayers and support. After each of the Masses this weekend, Fr. Smith will greet people in the respective parish halls at our Friendship Sunday celebrations (Saturday, wine and cheese; Sunday, coffee and donuts). Please join us, and offer your own congratulations to Fr. Smith.

During the next few months, we will have a display of a statue and a relic of Saint Martin de Porres. St. Martin(1579-1639) was the illegitimate son of a Spanish nobleman and a freed slave woman in Peru. Throughout his life he experienced much discrimination. In fact, because he was from African descent, he was not permitted at the time to take vows in a religious congregation. He was granted special permission to live with the Dominicans as a lay brother without vows. He worked tirelessly on behalf of the poor and the suffering in Lima, Peru. He was canonized as a Saint by Pope John XXIII in 1962. The relic of Saint Martin is one of the relics in the possession of the Basilica of Saint John the Baptist. Many thanks to the Rhoda Wise Shrine, Inc. for temporarily loaning this statue to our parishes during these summer months. I have been considering what ways we, as Catholics, can acknowledge the racial disharmony that continues to exist in our society and find ways to begin to bring healing to our community. I hope that the prayers and intercession of Saint Martin will help us to begin on the journey toward harmony and peace. I invite you to stop at the small shrine set up for this devotion, and to offer the prayer placed there. For the next few weeks, this will be on display at St. Peter Church, followed by several weeks at the Basilica.

We are excited to welcome Bishop Bonnar to Saint Peter Church for the first time as he celebrates the Mass in

Honor of the Servant of God Rhoda Wise on Wednesday, July 7 at 6:00 PM. We hope that you will join us as we continue to pray for the progress of this important cause.

Finally, I ask for your prayers this weekend as I prepare for my final on Monday for what has been quite an intense and difficult semester. I am looking forward to a few days off before classes begin for the two new courses on July 1.


Adult Faith Formation
