



Gospel Reflection

Reflecting on the scriptures

Today, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, is the official end of the Christmas season in the church. So if you waited till today to take down your Christmas tree, you're not slow, you're "liturgically appropriate".

It does seem a bit strange, doesn't it, that we're already celebrating an event from the life of Jesus as a full grown man when we were singing "We Three Kings" just a week ago! But here we are today reflecting on the baptism of Jesus by John.

Two separate but deeply connected thoughts come to mind with this scripture.

Jesus clearly had no need of John's baptism of repentance. Yet, here he is, standing in line with the others, going into the water at John's direction. Just like a real person...because he was! It is the faith of the church that Jesus was not pretending to be fully human, he really was! He experienced all that we experience except sin. He was tired, sometimes, and uncertain and disappointed and abandoned. He was like us.

And...even more amazing...we are like him!

We don't realize it most of the time and frequently don't act like it, but we, too, are beloved sons and daughters of God! What a difference it would make in our lives if we could believe that. If we could believe that we cannot lose the love of God. That there is nothing we can do that will turn off God's love for us. We simply don't have that kind of power. We can accept it, grow from it and return it. Or, like a child with our fingers in our ears insisting "I can't hear you," ignore God's love. But we cannot lose it.

But...you say...I'm no Jesus! Right. When Jesus heard, "You are my beloved child," ... he believed it.




